Figure in North Fox child-sex ring dies

■ Francis D. Sheldon was charged, but never extradited after fleeing the country

LELAND — Francis D. Sheldon, who fled the country 20 years ago after he was charged with running a child-sex ring on North Fox Island, died last month in the Netherlands.

Sheldon, 68, reportedly was found dead in his apartment on July 1 of natural causes.

Sheldon's attorney, L. Bennett Young of Bloomfield Hills, confirmed that Sheldon died but declined further comment.

Sheldon disappeared in late 1976, shortly after police charged him with criminal sexual conduct for allegedly having sex with a 14-year-old boy in Port Huron and a 10-year-old boy on North Fox Island.

Sheldon was a member of a prominent family in Bloomfield Hills. He was a geologist, part-time university professor, land developer and oil consultant who owned properties in Charlevoix County, oil wells in Kansas and a lodge in Aspen, Colo.

He was also a member of the board of directors of the Cranbrook Institute, an exclusive school in Bloomfield Hills that he attended before earning an undergraduate degree at Yale.

His link to child pornography surfaced in July 1976 after police arrested Gerald Richards for child sexual abuse. Richards was director of Brother Paul's Nature Camp on North Fox Island, and president of Brother Paul's Children's Mission. Both organizations claimed to benefit troubled youths, but authorities said they were part of a child-pornography ring that preyed on such youngsters.

Sheldon disappeared within days of Richards' arrest. Five months later Sheldon was charged with two counts of child sexual abuse, once in Port Huron, and once on the island, involving different victims.

After a nationwide search, authorities discovered he was living in the Netherlands. He was never extradited.

Richards' arrest led to a national investigation that uncovered a child-porn network including a boys' camp in Alto, Tenn., run by an Episcopal priest, and a Boy Scout troop leader in New Orleans.

Social Services clears itself

 TRAVERSE CITY — The state Department of Social Services has cleared itself of any wrongdoing in placing Marilyn Kimball into the home of an ex-convict who was later charged with her murder.

In addition, Edwin Connine, a spokesman for the department, who headed the investigation from his Traverse City office, said, "We found for the most part, they were doing a very good job. Even with what has happened, it is not a bad home."

Connine said Friday that the probe of the placement of Miss Kimball into the Antrim County home disclosed no violations of state foster care regulations. County social workers, he said, "did follow all the regulations."

Police testified Miss Kimball was brutally beaten Dec. 29. She was struck at least 24 times with a lead pipe, police testified last month at a hearing for Wayne M. Stubbs, 31, of 213 E. State St. Mancelona, the girl's former foster father.

State Police detectives testified at a court hearing for Stubbs that he confessed to the Kimball killing five days

For placing child in home where she was murdered

after his wife found the dead girl's body in an upstairs bedroom of their home. Miss Kimball's skull was crushed by the beating. A pathologist said she choked to death on her own vomit and was hit at least 24 times with a blunt object. Police testified that Stubbs admitted the slaying after taking a polygraph test.

The Antrim County Social Services Department placed Miss Kimball in the Stubbs' home in late 1975. A probate judge gave the department jurisdiction after Miss Kimball ran away from home. Social workers were aware before the Stubbs home was licensed that Wayne Stubbs was convicted in 1962 of assaulting a Benzie County woman with a knife.

Connine said the county workers followed proper procedure by contacting Stubbs' probation officer.

Stubbs had been committed to the Ionia State Hospital by the Benzie County Circuit Court. After spending

a doctor responsible for 14 county foster care service departments in Michigan. Connine said this incident was one of nine children placed in foster homes since it was learned that the state's foster care system was "falling apart."

The license expired and other foster care regulations were being reviewed by the state's Department of Social Services.

Connine said, "I don't know how anybody could have been so stupid as to put a child in a home like this."

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Laws dictate care criteria

TRAVERSE CITY — Under a 1973 state law, members of a foster family shall be of good character, habits, and reputation, and foster parents shall be of suitable temperament to care for children.

Probate judges give jurisdiction of children to the State Department of Social Services which is charged with finding and licensing foster homes. Department officials admit having trouble finding homes for teenagers.

For teenagers, we have a half of a year finding good homes," said Edwin Connine, state director for 24 counties in Michigan.

Police said Wayne M. Stubbs, 31, a janitor and Miss Kimball's former foster father, has confessed to the slaying. He is in the Antrim County jail awaiting trial on murder charges.

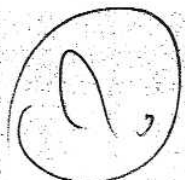
In his Traverse City office, Connine said Friday that an investigation of the Antrim County Welfare Department under director Beverly Smith shows social workers violated no departmental rules in the Kimball case.

In a five-page booklet, "Rules for Licensing Foster Homes," the state department states, "A home shall not be licensed in which any member of the household is mentally ill or on state hospital release, or has a criminal record."

Another department regulation authorized under Public Act 115 of 1973 states: "A home shall not be licensed in which any member of the household is an inmate of a penal or correctional institution or on parole or probation, without consultation with State Department of Corrections."

Foster home license regulations, however, do not require contact with psychiatrists who had treated former mental patients.

Stubbs spent five years in the Ionia State Hospital after being committed in 1962 to a mental hospital. County officials said they were unaware of
