NORTHVILLE -- The same technology scientists used to confirm the identity of about 150 soldiers killed in Vietnam could help close the books on one of the most frightening murder cases of a generation.

About two weeks ago, Michigan law enforcement officials pulled bone, hair and tissue samples from the Wyoming grave of David Norberg. Norberg, a former Warren auto worker who died in a car crash in 1981, is considered by some the main suspect in the Oakland County child killings of the late 1970s.

It could be as long as three months before the tests are completed.

From February 1976 to March 1977, four children were found dead -- killed, police believed by the same person. The victims: Mark Stebbins, 12, of Ferndale; Jill Robinson, 12, of Royal Oak; Kristine Mihelich, 10, of Berkley and Timothy King, 11 of Birmingham.

Investigators now turn to a tiny portion of cells to help tell the secrets to one of the biggest investigations in county history.

They'll depend upon mitochondrial DNA testing, the same test that unlocked the identity of Lt. Michael Blassie, who for 14 years lay as the unnamed hero buried in the Tomb of the Unknowns until mitochondria DNA tests confirmed his identity last year.

Mitochondrial DNA testing has only been used by forensic labs since 1991, said Mitchell Holland, the laboratory director of the Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory in Washington, D.C., and an expert on the testing. By comparison, traditional or nuclear DNA testing, in which DNA is extracted from the nucleus of cells, has been around for about 15 years.

One of its main advantages over nuclear DNA testing is it is more forgiving toward investigators, Holland said. All DNA, the molecular basis for heredity, degrades over time. Sometimes a sample will decay to the point where investigators can't discern the DNA.

But mitochondrial DNA tests pull the genetic blueprint from outside the nucleus, and yield a much greater amount of usable material per cell than nuclear DNA tests.

"Eventually you'll reach a threshold where you're unable to get a nuclear DNA sample but you're able to get mitochondria DNA because the quantity is higher," Holland said.

Mitochondrial DNA can be pulled from a bloodstain or a hair.

And a hair could be the telling factor in the Oakland County case. At issue is a hair found on one of the four murdered children. Investigators will try to match the DNA taken from that hair with that of Norberg's.

But a disadvantage of mitochondrial DNA is it isn't as specific. Genetic markers found in mitochondria are passed on through the mother's side. So generations of families share the same mitochondrial DNA makeup.

Still, it's valuable a, said Lynne Helton, supervisor of the Michigan State Police biology/DNA lab in Northville.

"Some DNA information is better than nothing," Helton said.

Cases closed

DNA and the courts have a long history. Some key cases:

1986: Investigators in Leicester, England were faced with a pair of baffling rape/murders. Dr. Alec J. Jeffries of Leicester University compared DNA samples from several thousand men before identifying Robert Melias as the assailant in both crimes. Melias was the first man convicted on the basis of DNA. Less than a year later, Tommy Lee Andrews was convicted of a rape in Orange County, Calif., by DNA tests.

1994: Gilbert Alejandro, who spent four years in jail for aggravated sexual assault in Texas, was freed after DNA tests excluded him as the assailant.

1998: The remains of Air Force Lt. Michael Blassie, killed in the line of duty in Vietnam, were identified by DNA tests. Blassie's remains had been buried in the Tomb of the Unknowns in Washington, D.C.

After 24 years of looking for the killer of four Detroit area children and hopes the case was nearly solved, police must resume searching for suspects.

The FBI found Monday that DNA from suspect and Wyoming resident David Norberg's exhumed body did not match pubic hair on 11-year-old Timothy King - the fourth victim in a wave of child murders that terrified the Detroit area community between February 1976 and March 1977.

During that time, two boys and two girls were found suffocated after they were missing for several days. Two had been raped and one was also shot in the face with a shotgun.

The victims' families, as well as Berkley Police Detective Sgt. Ray Anger, have waited for the DNA test results from Norberg for more than a year. If the results matched, linking Norberg to the crimes, the case could have closed.

But now county and police officials must begin their search anew.

"Now we keep on hunting," Anger told the Detroit Free Press. "And the question is, whose hair was on that boy?"

Anger added that Norberg is still one of many possible suspects police will reconsider.

"That hair was our best chance to tie him into the deceased," Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson, who helped fund the trip out to Wyoming to exhume Norberg's body, told The Oakland Press. "We don't have a whole lot left to point to Norberg. We're now looking back 25 years and the trail gets colder every year."

Along with King, 12-year-old Mark Stebbins, 12-year-old Jill Robinson and 10-year-old Kristine Mihelich were killed.

Norberg, a former Warren autoworker, moved to Recluse, Wyo., in 1980 with his wife and daughter after being questioned by police in the killings. He died in a car crash there a year later.

During the investigation, three tipsters pinpointed Norberg as a possible suspect, but detectives cleared him based on alibis from his wife. Anger has said Norberg's wife has since recanted and believes her dead husband committed the slayings.

Other physical evidence also pointed to Norberg, Anger said. For instance, he had a silver cross with the name "Kristine" etched in it, the name of one of the children killed.

And Norberg allegedly had a history of making improper sexual advances toward young children, Anger said.

All of this led Anger and Oakland County Medical Examiner L.J. Dragovic to a Wyoming cemetery in September 1999 to take DNA samples from Norberg's body.

Anger said he plans to make good on a promise he made to Stebbins' mother the day before she died in her hospital bed.

"I told her I can't promise I'll ever solve it, but I can promise I won't ever stop trying," he said.

If an officer is interested enough to check the new info, I say blessings to my fellow officer for having the dedication to be a non conformist and the gutts to challange the system. I was approved for a arrest warrant related to a 1996 murder in my county last week. The information has not changed, just the approach I used with my prosecutor. When I started readng the file, it was going no where. Just a new ideal, a new approach, a dedication to find closure made the difference.

I understand that many of my fellow officers often go beyond what is expected of them in time, personal resources, late night calls, personal travel for find the missing piece of the puzzle. For those, I dedicate this as my praise for the unsung HERO. The ones who are not afraid to use old nose to nose get in your face interviews with the support of modern technology. Do not be afraid to mix the ways of the past with the toys of the future.
