05 that Helen had been a reliable informant of his for approximately  
06 the last three years. She provided him with numerous drug case  
07 information, B & E's and an arson. He indicated that she was very  
08 interested in police work and police officers. She had a habit of  
09 meeting him nearly every morning. More recently they met during  
10 the day at a restaurant. He said he knew her infatuation with him  
11 and for that reason never met her at night or after business hours.  
12 He always met her in a public place. He said he made a decision to  
13 continue meeting with her because she provided him with good  
1 information on a frequent basis.

15  
16 About a month or six weeks ago, he had a conversation with the  
17 police chief that she was too visible and too vocal, and in his  
18 words, he didn't think it was worth paying the price of dealing  
19 with her anymore. So, based on those discussions with the chief,  
20 he told her that he would not meet her anymore and that he didn't  
21 want anything to do with her or her information.

22  
23 Lt. Skiba indicated that a note was passed from Helen to the police  
24 chief addressed to him in which she identified \_\_\_\_\_ as the  
25 Oakland County child killer. He said he took that information and  
26 passed that along to Det. Harvey of the Oakland County Sheriff's  
2 Department. He provided me with an entire copy of the file, as it

05 the information and his review of Helen's reports, he has no  
06 further plans to follow up on this tip, and does not plan to talk  
07 with at all.

09 I spoke with U.S. Customs Investigator Bouchard at the Detroit  
10 office. He will check his records to ascertain if he has any  
11 records of in or out of the country during the late '70's.  
12 However, he believes that he will not have any luck finding  
13 anything. He explained that Customs has a check that they run, but  
14 only on some random individuals and suspect individuals.

15  
16 I contacted the Investigative Office of the United States  
17 Department of State in Chicago. Richard Beckman is the  
18 investigator I spoke with at 312-886-0305. I asked him for  
19 information regarding the passport of He said his  
20 data base is computerized back to 1978. His files between 1962 and  
21 1977 are, what he calls, miscellaneous files and he said frankly he  
22 never had any luck finding anything out of those files. He will  
23 get back with me if he can locate any information.

24  
25 A teletype was also sent with a request for a query investigation  
26 from Interpol in Washington, D.C. The request was to ask they  
27 check with the French authorities to determine if that country had  
28 a system whereby they kept track of foreign national's exit and  
29 entry into the country.

money from that person. The shoe prints at one of the burglaries matched shoes. There was dog repellent used on one of the B&E's on Villa Street that night that was found in Florida with things. The confession was very detailed, although he lied at first about the gun shot. When pressed by the investigators, he provided details about the shots, including the number of shots, how many were fire through a pillow, and how many were not. The investigators in that case recovered a ski mask. There were some items stolen from the B&E's that were recovered in Virginia. had committed similar burglaries in Virginia and had a history of having sex with young girls. Further, was made on a rape in Clawson and about the time the case happened here. was in prison in Virginia, sentenced to 104 years. He was eligible for parole in 12, but Kalbfleisch indicated that there were 2 young women killed in a sex murder case in that area. Kalbfleisch believed was responsible in that case. The State of Virginia provides for the death penalty in those types of cases. He believes that's one of the reasons why admitted to this incident and wanted to be brought back to Michigan so he would serve his sentence in Michigan instead of Virginia.
