

Per our conversation earlier, please consider the following request to have inmate transferred to either the Mound or Ryan Facility in the city of Detroit, regarding additional investigation/interviews into the case involving the Oakland County Child Killer case.

Several weeks ago, D/Sgt. Williams and I traveled to Camp Ojibway to interview regarding his knowledge of a key suspect in the Child Killer Case. Recently we've learned that has been less than honest and we would like to interview him further and confront him with our new information.

Unfortunately is coming up for parole on April 15, 2008, and he is requesting movement to the State of Montana. This causes us great concern because of the inability to further investigate or proceed in our investigation. Presently I have scheduled to take a polygraph test on May 7th at 1:00 PM. If is transferred to the Detroit area, I'll request that an earlier polygraph date possibly be set to expedite his getting paroled.

It is very important that we confront again to gain the much needed information we feel he may still possess.

Regarding prisoner [redacted] Last week Detective Williams and I made contact with [redacted] at the Ryan Facility and interviewed him, (or shall I say, attempted to interview him).. At the beginning of the interview, [redacted] was less than respectful and told us in no uncertain terms, that he wanted nothing further to do with us. After explaining to him that all he had to do was then listen, we told him that after our earlier interview up at camp Ojibway, we found that he was less than completely honest with us and we just needed to clear up a few details.

[redacted] advised that prior to cooperating with us any further, he must first seek the advice of an attorney. [redacted] was again advised of the seriousness of this investigation, (homicide of 4 children back in the mid '70's), and we wanted, (hopefully) to clear him of any possible involvement, and or knowledge. [redacted] advised that after he consults with an attorney, he will get back with us. So I guess we're sort of on his time-table now as to when he wants to get back with us.

Please advise if MDOC plans on paroling [redacted] prior to the completion of our investigation of him, so we can make further arrangements if need be.
