Sentencing of Theodore Lamborgine

Theodore Norman Lamborgine has been the focus of an ongoing investigation for the past 2 ½ years involving the Oakland County Child Murders dating back to the 1970's. During the course of this investigation, the investigative team based out of the Metro North post which includes Detectives Garry Gray, David Robertson and area agencies including the FBI, have uncovered a complex pedophile ring that operated in the Cass Corridor area of Detroit back in the 70's.

Many victims dating back to this time period, who are now adults, have been identified and interviewed. The team made contact with victims in Florida, Tennessee and Mississippi and have taken statements documenting their victimization when they were as young as 9 years of age.

Today, these victims were given some degree of closure when Judge Berry of the Wayne County Circuit Court Sentenced this monster to three consecutive life terms for Criminal Sexual Conduct in the first degree, and a number of many more years for varying other degrees of CSC. Ted Lamborgine will never see life as a free man again.

During Lamborgines previous court appearances concerning these acts, he was offered a very good deal if he would cooperate with the on going Oakland County Child Killer investigation, and agree to take another polygraph. (Regardless of the polygraph results) a minimum sentence deal would have been reduced from 25 to 40 years, down to 15 years.

He chose not to plea to two counts, but insisted on pleading to the original 15 counts as originally charged. He was even offered a federal prison stint anywhere in the U.S., given witness protection and he would basically disappear if he cooperated and the case was solved. He again chose not to cooperate.

At this time we cannot say he is the Oakland County Child Killer, or was involved in some way shape or form, (although we feel he has some information), but at least he will be in a place safe away from children.

Other avenues to solve the State's most notorious unsolved murders of 4 children are in the works, and the books are not closed on Lamborgine, YET!

Dear Dr. Isenberg,

Please present this Certificate of Appreciation to Dr. Constance Fisher, for her outstanding work, dedication and assistance to the Michigan Department of State Police, regarding the cold case investigation of the Oakland County Child Murders.

This case dates back to the mid 1970's, when four children, ages 10 to 12, were independently abducted, held for a number of days, murdered and then discarded along the sides of roadways in Oakland County, Michigan. These crimes began in February of 1976, and abruptly ended in March of 1977. Shortly after the final victim, a task force consisting of approximately 300 investigators began the grizzly task of trying to solve this case. Unfortunately the case wasn't solved, and the task force was disbanded many years ago. There are however, still a handful of investigators pursuing leads. As of this writing, the case still remains unsolved.

For years, all we've had for evidence was a hair taken from one of our victims. This hair was analyzed by your unit and is currently our only piece of DNA, (Mitochondrial) that we have on record to check current and past suspects against.

In February of 2005, when this case was reactivated, there were only two suspects who had been checked against this evidence. When I learned that Dr. Fisher was the lead analyst from the FBI crime lab, I called her to inquire what I would need to do if we develop a suspect, and would she be willing to do the analysis. Dr. Fisher immediately responded by saying, "Absolutely". Since this first conversation, Dr. Fisher has now analyzed the DNA of nine additional suspects on our case. Not only has Dr. Fisher gone to great lengths to assist us, her turn around time in getting answers back to us has been very rapid.

Please present Dr. Fisher with this small token of our sincere appreciation, for going above and beyond. She is truly an integral part of our "Team" investigating the "Oakland County Child Murders".

Detectives Gray and Robertson, with the approval of 2nd District Command, worked out a game plan to rejuvenate the case, and decided this would best be accomplished with the assistance of the news media. In January of 2005, a press conference was held, which included the original police agencies involved during the original Task Force days of the 1970's. New life was breathed back into the case, and the public became very much involved even after 30 years.

When a call was placed to Livonia Police Department to invite them to the press conference, Detective Williams of Livonia, advised that they had just arrested an individual, for the murder of a Livonia resident and the owner of a Cab Co located in the Cass Corridor in the City of Detroit. This individual led officers in many directions through numerous interviews. Many times claimed to know the identity of the Oakland County Child Killer. During subsequent interviews with other individuals who were eventually discovered in the original task force tip files, the officers were now faced with the monumental task of conducting this investigation. The officers soon learned that investigating a case of this magnitude and this old, proved to be more difficult than originally thought.

While looking into the life of ' (a known pedophile), and one time snitch for the Detroit Police Departments sex crimes unit, a very large ring of pedophiles was uncovered that operated in the Cass Corridor section of the city of Detroit. One individual in particular came to light by the name of Theodore Lamborgine. Lamborgine fled Michigan in the late 70's, and took up residence in Parma Hgts. Ohio. During the early investigation into Lamborgine, officers decided to at lease clear him via a polygraph. On September 6, 2006, Lamborgine was given a polygraph at 2nd District Headquarters.

The following information will be contained in bullet format due to the complexity of this investigation: The below information is not all inclusive, but are some of the highlights of the almost 3 year investigation into Lamborgine, and the Oakland County Child Killer Investigation:

- There have been 8 trips to Parma Hgts Ohio by Detectives investigating Lamborgine
- There have been 6 separate Surveillances conducted by the MSP, FBI and the Livonia Police Department in Ohio, regarding Lamborgine.
- Detectives Steve Scharschmidt and Mockler from Parma Hgts. Assisted numerous times to gain much needed intelligence on Lambrogine.
- When Lamborgine failed to provide information the Task Force felt he was withholding, numerous additional out of state interviews regarding past victims of

Criminal Sexual Conducts at the hands of Lamborgine and Lawson were conducted. Officers traveled to:

- 1. Tennessee
- 2. Mississippi
- 3. Florida
- 4. Arizona
- 5. Michigan
- 6. Amsterdam (Netherlands) FBI

This investigation required thousands of man hours, with many of those hours of investigation being conducted on personal time. However, while in pursuit of the Oakland County Child Killer, officers uncovered the underbelly world of Pedophilia and child sexual assaults being committed by Lamborgine and Lawson that dated back to the mid 1970's.

Prosecutor Robert Moran of the Wayne County Prosecutors office was instrumental in the investigation, providing officers with legal advice, search warrants, proffer statements and much needed support for the officers in the field. Without his patient support, the dozens of sex crimes that both Lawson and Lamborgine were charged with would not have been made possible. We on the task force, are forever indebted to Rob for his assistance.

The Michigan State Police Crime Lab assigned a full time analyst: Dr. Julie Howenstine to go over all of the evidence involved with this case. This process literally took months to accomplish and much needed additional new evidence was discovered that may one day, hopefully solve this case.

Dr. Constance Fisher of the FBI Crime Lab in Quantico has also been an integral part of this investigation in the field of Mitochondrial DNA testing.

CLOSING:

This massive investigation which literally paralyzed the State of Michigan over thirty years ago, and to some extent to this day, is still being pursued by the below listed team of investigators. However, as a result of this investigation, dozens, maybe hundreds of boys ages 9 to 14 back in the 1970's have been given closure with the prosecutions and life sentences of these two MONSTERS, Theodore Lamborgine and Richard Lawson, who preyed on these young boys many, many years ago.

Darryl, I could conceivably do a ten page report if I were to put down all that we've done on the Lamborgine and Lawson case alone, not to mention the many other follow-ups that have been completed. I believe to date I have over 100 supps regarding the Lamborgine/Lawson case as well at the OCCK investigation.

Although we're closing the case on Lawson, Lamborgine is still active. We just haven't been able to find anything yet that can conclusively link him to the Child Killer case

During a thirteen month period in 1976 and 1977, a string of children homicides occurred in southeast lower Michigan which literally paralyzed the region for many years. Four of the children homicides appeared to be connected and was labeled "The Oakland County Child Killer" investigation. This set off a state-wide manhunt for the killer(s) and a task force consisting of over 250 State, Local and Federal investigators, directed by the Michigan State Police was established. The task force operated for several years before disbanding, however, during this time period more than 26,000 documented investigations were conducted, involving tens of thousands of suspects. Although the investigation fell into a cold case status, officers still, periodically received tips regarding suspects. To this very date, the case still remains, "Unsolved"

In December of 2004, a decision was made to reactivate the Oakland County Child Killer Investigation due to the cold case status it has held for many years. Detectives Garry Gray and David Robertson, with full support of the commanding officers of the Michigan State Police, worked out a game plan to rejuvenate the case. To accomplish this task, officers decided the best course of action would be to seek the assistance of the news media. In January of 2005, a press conference was held, which included the 10 original police agencies involved during the original Task Force days of the 1970's. New life was breathed back into the case, and the public became very much involved, even after 30 years.

When a call was placed to Livonia Police Department inviting them to the press conference, Detective Cory Williams of Livonia advised that they had just arrested an individual, (Richard Lawson), for a 1986 murder of a Livonia resident who owned a Cab Co located in the Cass Corridor in the City of Detroit. When Lawson was arrested in California, he made statements to Detective Williams that he knew the identity of the "Oakland County Child Killer". During subsequent task force interviews with Richard Lawson, numerous individuals associated with a pedophile ring which operated out of the infamous "Cass Corridor" area of Detroit was uncovered. These individuals came to the attention of the newly formed task force, (which now only consisted of 4 officers). Officers soon learned that investigating a case of this magnitude and this old, proved to be more difficult than originally thought.

While looking into the life of Richard Lawson, (a known pedophile), and one time snitch for the Detroit Police Departments sex crimes unit in the 1970's, officers first learned of this pedophile ring. One individual in particular came to light by the name of Theodore Lamborgine. During the early investigation of Lamborgine, officers discovered that in the late 1970's, he abruptly left Michigan, leaving his family and friends and took up residence in Parma Hgts. Ohio. Detectives traveled to Parma Hgts. Ohio and interviewed Ted Lamborgine.

During Lamborgine's first interview, he openly admitted that he was involved with children and preferred children sexually over adult relationships however he completely denied any involvement in the Child Killer investigation.

As a standard course of investigation, (which was utilized hundreds of times over the thirty years of this case), officers offered Lamborgine a polygraph examination to clear himself. On September 6, 2006, Lamborgine voluntarily came to Michigan and was given a polygraph by the State Police.

Detectives Garry Gray and David Robertson, (Michigan State Police), Detective Cory Williams, (Livonia Police Dept.) and Special Agent John Ouellet, (F.B.I), were involved in the investigation of Theodore Lamborgine and Richard Lawson.

a surveillance team was placed on him while officers drew up a search warrant for his residence in Ohio. 14 hours after the polygraph, officers conducted a search of Lamborgine's apartment which proved futile. Nothing was found, however after the search, officers spoke with Lamborgine. When told him that "We" Knew

he was involved in the killing of the children from Oakland County. Ted's only response was, "I've been forgiven".

The following information will be contained in bullet format due to the complexity of this investigation: The below information is not all inclusive, but are some of the highlights of the almost 3 year investigation into Lamborgine, Lawson and the Oakland County Child Killer Investigation:

- There have been 8 trips to Parma Hgts Ohio by Detectives investigating Lamborgine
- There have been 6 separate Surveillances conducted by the MSP, FBI and the Livonia Police Department in Ohio, regarding Lamborgine.
- Detectives Steve Scharschmidt and Mockler from Parma Hgts. Assisted numerous times to gain much needed intelligence on Lambrogine. Lamborgine was befriended by Mockler and Scharschmidt and a close relationship was established regarding past children victims of Criminal Sexual Conduct, (C.S.C.) with Ted dating back to the 1970's
- When Lamborgine provided information to the Ohio Detectives about past victims, the Task Force traveled out of state to interview these children, who are now men in their 40's.

Officers traveled to:

- 1. Tennessee
- 2. Mississippi
- 3. Florida
- 4. Arizona
- Amsterdam (Netherlands) FBI

This investigation involved thousands of man hours, with many of those hours of investigation being conducted on personal time. However, while in pursuit of the Oakland County Child Killer, officers did happen to uncover the underbelly world of Pedophilia and child sexual assaults being committed by Lamborgine and Lawson dating back to the mid 1970's in Detroit's Cass Corridor.

Prosecutor Robert Moran of the Wayne County Prosecutors office has been instrumental in this investigation by providing officers with legal advice, search warrants, proffer statements and much needed advice/support for the officers in the field. Without his patient support, the dozens of sex crimes that both Lawson and Lamborgine were charged with would not have been possible. The task force is forever indebted to Prosecutor Moran for his assistance.

Although Theodore Lamborgine and Richard Lawson were never directly linked to the Oakland County Child Killer investigation, many plausible theories as to Lamborgine's involvement have been looked into. (Lawson passed a polygraph regarding his non-involvement). Officers requested Prosecutor Moran research the feasibility of charging the two for the many sex crimes they committed on these boys as young as 9 years old, who are now men. As a result, dozens of various counts of Criminal Sexual Conduct warrants were issued to both Lamborgine and Lawson as a result of the investigation.

As an investigatory tool to solve the homicides, officers procured a proffer statement issued by the U.S.A.G's. office, to the Wayne County Prosecutor's. This proffer agreement would secure a federal prison for Lamborgine, under the witness protection plan, where he would be given a new identity and sentence charge, only, if he voluntarily gave up the information officers felt he still possessed about the Child Killing Investigation. In addition to the proffer statement, a greatly reduced sentence was also worked out between attorneys to hopefully persuade Lamborgine to cooperate.

Theodore Lamborgine flatly refused to cooperate whatsoever and insisted that he plead guilty to all 15 counts and not the two that were offered as a part of the agreement. In April of 2007, Theodore Lamborgine was sentenced to three consecutive life terms for Criminal Sexual Conduct in the first degree, and numerous additional years for various other counts of CSC. He is currently serving his life sentence at the Macomb Corrections Facility.

Richard Lawson insisted on a Jury trail for the one count of (C.S.C.) first degree he was charged with and demanded that he be allowed to represent himself. He too was found guilty and sentenced to life in prison.

Although officers were unable to Link Theodore Lamborgine to the Oakland County Child Killing investigation, closure has been given to dozens if not hundreds of victims that have been molested during the course of Lawson and Lamborgine's pathetic lives.

Many of these victims some of whom have given statements at Lamborgine's and Lawson's sentencing, have told officers of how grateful they are that they now have peace of mind knowing these two monsters didn't get away with what they did to them many years ago and won't do it again.

AS A SIDE NOTE: When officers re-activated the case, the Michigan State Police Crime Lab assigned a full time analyst: Dr. Julie Howenstine to go over all of the evidence associated with this case that has been kept in "Long term storage" for 30 years. This process literally took months to accomplish and much needed additional new evidence was discovered which may one day, hopefully solve this case.

Dr. Constance Fisher of the FBI Crime Lab in Quantico has also been an integral part of this investigation in the field of Mitochondrial DNA testing.

CLOSING:

This massive investigation which literally paralyzed the State of Michigan over thirty years ago, and to some extent to this day, is still being pursued by the listed team of investigators. However, as a result of this investigation, dozens, maybe hundreds of boys ages 9 to 14 back in the 1970's have been given closure with the prosecutions and life sentences of Theodore Lamborgine and Richard Lawson, who preyed on these young boys many, many years ago.

Although we're closing the case on Lawson, Lamborgine is still active. We just haven't been able to find anything yet that can conclusively link him to the Child Killer case. But, if by chance he is the "ONE", justice has been served and he's paying the price.
