- 4) Autopsy reports detailing the condition of the children's bodies. Please note that we are not seeking photos, as they are exempt, and that we will not be publishing details, except to confirm that only one child seemed to have been bathed.

If the copying fees exceed \$200, please let us know in advance. The FOIA law requires that your office respond within 5 business days. Thanking you in advance for your assistance.

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request sent via email on October 10, 2012, and received October 11, 2012. Your request for information is granted. Your FOIA requested Documents provided to the King family. Enclosed please find a copy of the file in the criminal case charging Christopher Busch with two counts of third degree criminal sexual conduct; a copy of the preliminary exam transcript from that matter, an affidavit from retired MSP scientist David Metzger, and a one page tip sheet from 1977, a total of 122 pages of records. Your second request was for Birmingham police reports on the investigation. Enclosed are 20 pages of documents currently in the possession of the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office. Your third request was for documents related to the vehicles investigated by the police. Enclosed find 10 pages including a media report that is included within the records of this office. Your fourth request was for the autopsy reports. Enclosed please find three autopsy reports and supporting documents. The reports are for Jill Robinson 15 pages, Mark Stebbins six pages, and Timothy King 23 pages. These are the only autopsy reports in the possession of the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

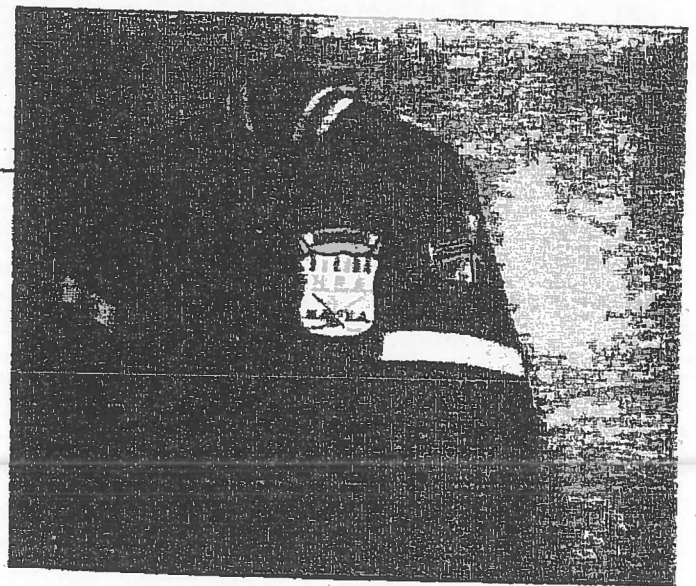

The following statements were taken at the BARRY KING residence located at 1509 Yorkshire, Birmingham, Michigan.

Officers conducting interview: Lt. JACK KALBFLEISCH, Birmingham Police Dept.
D/Sgt. ROGER RIVARD, Michigan State Police, Pontiac.
D/Sgt: WAYNE WALDRON, Michigan State Police, Detroit.

Time: 11:22 A.M.

Present at this time - Mr. & Mrs. KING.

Q. Mrs. KING, what is your first name?

A. MARION. (middle initial K)

Q. Your first name sir?

A. BARRY LAWRENCE KING.

Start out by telling us the events of last evening as it pertains to your family and what you did during the course of the evening?

(Mr. KING) I got home from work about 5 to 7. In fact I pulled in the driveway and TIM was skate boarding down the sidewalk. He made me watch him make a couple of turns so he showed me he could make a right angle turn at the bottom of the sidewalk before I came in the house. I had made arrangements to see a client of mine on Pembroke Road, MARGARET RUSSELL, at 7 o'clock, to sign a new will and I had to take MARION with me. I asked MARGARET if she wanted to come down here or have us go up there and she said she preferred at that hour we go up there. I told MARION that if she wanted to go out for dinner I would take her out for something to eat. When I got home MARK was not here because hes in a French play up here and they had a surprise dress rehearsal which caused us some problems because MARK was supposed to babysit for our friends the ROYERS and when I got in the house the youngest ROYER boy was over here because we didn't have a babysitter to go over there. But we made arrangements for my son CRIS to substitute, and CHRIS was at home. Some time between 5 after 7 and 10 after 7 MARION and I and CHRIS and KEVIN ROYER left my driveway, we dropped CHRIS and KEVIN ROYER off at the ROYER house and MARION and I went on to MARGARET RUSSELLS house, signed the Wills. And when we left there I said, "do you want to go home or do you want to go to Peabodys?". She said well lets go to Peabodys. We went to Peabodys and I think MARION had two beers and a hamburger and I had three and a hamburger. I know we got back home before 9 o'clock, there was two or three minutes left in the half when we pulled in the driveway after we got back here, about 10 minutes to nine. TIMMY was not here, nobody was here. When we left CATHY and TIM were here. The door was slightly ajar, the front door, I would say perhaps a foot or 18 inches. We called for TIM and then we didn't get any response. MARION started phoning around and I said hes just around the neighborhood someplace.

Q. Which door was ajar sir?

A. Front door. MARION started making some phone calls and I just said "well he'll be home in a couple of minutes". But, I guess maybe at 9, maybe quarter to ten, we started touring the neighborhood to look for him, and I made two or three tours. We finally called the police department about 10:15 to report him missing and we were

told to call back a little later because the newness of the report. She asked me to call back at shift change and I finally called back about 10 to 12 and the lady who answered the phone both times asked me to call back after the shift change. And I said, "what can they do for me that you can't?". So she did refer me to an officer and an officer did come to the house shortly after midnight and interviewed us. That's the extent of my participation of the evening and my whereabouts.

Q. How many members in the family are there?

A. My daughter CATHERINE whos 17 and a senior in high school and my son CHRISTOPHER who is 16 and a sophomore and my son MARK who is a 9th grader at Derby Jr. High and my son TIMOTHY.

Q. A total of four children?

A. Right.

Q. Did any of these other children happen to see TIM that night?

A. As far as we know CATHY was the last one to see him. She had a chance to see her first real live floor show last night. Somebody had given her some tickets to go see Jerry Lewis and she was on the phone and running around here, her first big night out to see a floor show and when we left she and TIM were here. As far as we know she was the last person to see TIM.

Q. And is CATHY home at the present time?

A. Yes, all the children are.

Q. Any problems in the family between the children or between TIM and a parent?

A. Not to my knowledge, we do get on the kids sometimes for picking on TIM because, their all close together, and TIMs three years apart there, but I can't think of anything in that nature. (Mrs. KING) Nothing, you know theres rivalry and a few punches now and then but they are really all quite very close.

Q. No big family arguments yesterday or last night?

A. No, TIMMY was extremely happy when I got home. He had his skate board out there and was showing me. (Mrs. KING) He had today all planned. (Mr. KING): In fact he was talking about getting a jogging suit for a week and MARION was going to take him for the suit today and he was really looking forward to it.

Q. Has he ever run away before, left home unannounced like this?

A. No, I would consider him as well adjusted a child as you could have. I would find that to be beyond my belief that he would purposely do those things. He is the kind of kid if he came home here and his mother wasn't here, she works from 11 to 3 a couple days a week, if he was leaving to go shoot basketballs or see somebody, he would leave her a note on the table, thats how conscientious he was about it, because MARION has been a very conscientious mother.

Q. Mrs. KING, your husband remarked that you work part time?

A. Yes.

Q. Where are you employed?

A. At the Marilyn Shop at Sommerset Mall.

Q. And when do you work there?

A. One or two days a week from 11 till 3 and 10 till 2, sometimes less.

Interview at KING residence (continued)

Q. Any particular days?

A. Tuesday usually and Wednesday, rarely another day but not if I can help it.

Q. What do you do there?

A. Not much of anything, sales.

Q. Do you happen to know the telephone number there?

A. 643-7740.

Q. Where is your place of business sir?

A. One Woodward Avenue, Suite #1500, Detroit, Michigan.

Q. Any particular name?

A. Law firm of Dyer, Meek, Ruegsegger and Bullard I've been associated or a partner with that law firm since 1960.

Q. Whats the telephone number there sir?

A. 961-5470.

Q. Any possibility of anybody being upset with any of your services?

A. I assume the possibility exists and I've been racking my brains since this happened to determine that and I've won some and lost some and had some people mad at me and not mad at me.

Q. Your not involved in criminal law?.

A. No I did appear before a Grand Jury in Cleveland on a matter earlier this year for a former client and I got indited on some matters that I didn't represent him on but the questions I was asked and the answers I gave I don't think were relevant to any criminal charge.

Q. What type of legal work do you do?

A. Civil, commercial law generally, all sorts, corporations, partnernerships, taxes, securities. --- divorce and civil trials. And I haven't had many divorce cases lately, the kind of business I have I thought it could have some dissatisfaction. Years ago I represented a lady whos name was KUCHENILLA, whos husband called me at my old address, we moved over here about six years ago, we lived on Pembroke Road for six years previous to that. He had no reason to know me, he just called me at my office and said "your the BARRY KING that lives on Pembroke Road aren't you?" and I said yes, I had no reason to lie about it. I got kind of upset that the defendant in a divorce case would call my residence and say that. I had nothing to do with the gentleman since that divorce was entered, which I assume was six to twelve years ago. Thats the only time I've ever had anybody say anything to me on legal business that would have caused me concern.

Q. What did he say to you besides?

A. That was about all I remember, I just got concerned that he would go to the trouble to find out where I lived, that bothered me.

Q. How long ago was this.

A. At least six years ago, because we moved here when CATHY entered seventh grade and shes graduating from the 12th grade this year.

Q. This is something that happened prior to six years ago?

A. Oh yes. Thats the only time I've ever had anything like that happen to me.000175 P6

Q. What was his name?

A. The last name as I remember was CUCCINELLA first name escapes me. My clients name was also CUCCINELLA and she had her maiden name restored which was HARGIS I believe. It was a Wayne County Circuit case.

Q. You wouldn't have records pertaining to this in your office?

A. When there sold I might have thrown them out but the court file should be available.

Q. In what county was this?

A. Wayne County Circuit court. I say I've won some and lost some. I had a matter a couple years ago where I got a judgement against some fellows who were very, very upset and it turns out that the main problem that they were upset about was that they paid their attorney to take an appeal and subsequently was disbarred. I didn't have any knowledge of this and got out some garnishments against them and they came down and made their peace with me. There were three brothers, one of them was the guy who generally ran the business that was involved and he became disabled. There were two other brothers, WEIDNER was the name. That was a case in the Oakland County Circuit Court and although there was great bitterness when they came down to see me I did arrive at what I thought was amicable settlement with them. And they paid me some money and I gave them satisfaction with the judgement. The one brother was a gentleman about it, he was very angry, but was composed and told me that his brother was very, very angry. But I've heard.. nothing from either one of those people since then.

Q. Can you give us the description of what your boy was wearing?

A. MARION can tell you that from the stitches on the jacket.

Q. Before we get into that, you said you were called to a Grand Jury, do you know what type of Grand Jury that was, was that a criminal matter?

A. Yes, it was a case in Cleveland Ohio involving the Northern Ohio Bank. I represented a company that borrowed some money from the bank and went over and gave testimony in that case before the Grand Jury. The government attorney was a criminal attorney out of Washington D.C. an italian name, I talked to him a couple of times, and flew over to Cleveland and went on the stand and spoke for maybe 10 minutes and identified some documents and left. Several members of that bank were indited and the fellow that I represented in borrowing the money was ALEX DANDY and it was a loan to a company which he owned, called Marine City Manufacturing. I supervised and reviewed those documents and passed judgement on as to the borrower. I no longer represent him, matter of fact I resigned that before the Northern Ohio Bank went under.

Q. How long ago was that?

A. Last fall, it was cold out but no snow, I remember. The loan itself was two or three years before that.

Q. We'll have a go at the clothing if we might?

A. Dark green corderoy levis, which were a little bit too long for him because somebody swapped pants with him at a basketball game a couple of weeks ago. A blue denim shirt, button down the front with a collar and cuffs and it was stitched in the same color in squares so that it could look patched together, but there was no color design or anything. He had on white knee length socks, called jock socks, like they wear for basketball. He had on basketball shoes, just a couple of weeks old, white leather with red and blue trim and I think they had stamped on them that they were basketball association. They had different fabric over the toe but it was white also. 000176 P7

- Q. You say the shirt had square stitching so that it would appear it had squares in it?
- A. It was stitched in squares but not pieced together, a design made on the surface of the material. It was all over the whole shirt.
- Q. Did he have a hat?
- A. No.
- Q. Did he wear glasses?
- A. No.
- Q. Contact lenses?
- A. No.
- Q. Does he take any medication?
- A. No.
- Q. Is he ill?
- A. He has a cold, and cough.
He was also wearing a red hockey jacket too, a Birmingham Hockey Association jacket, not in the best condition. The standard emblem that comes on every jacket and then two different years team patches and he had me sew on the Presidential Physical Fitness award that he got at school last year.
- Q. Are these all on the front, is there anything on the back?
- A. No there all on the front
- Q. Did he have a belt on his pants?
- A. Probably not, he doesn't usually bother; I can look upstairs, but I don't think he had one on.
- Q. The underwear?
- A. He would have had on only jockey shorts, now I don't know if that's the brand that he had on yesterday; but they were the same type.
- Q. T-shirt?
- A. No.
- Q. Are these the clothes he wore to school yesterday or had he changed after school?
- A. No he didn't change.
- Q. Did he have any rings or a watch any type of jewelry?
- A. No.
- Q. Could you describe that skate board?
- A. The kids could probably do a better job. (Mrs. KING): It's bright orange with a thing up the back, its turned up at the back part. Its fiberglass and it has two letters raised, its the brand, but I don't know what the letters are.
- Q. Do you remember where you purchased it?
- A. Hudsons.
- Q. Does he play socker ball or anything similar to that?
- A. Hes playing basketball now, he plays on Saturdays, he just signed up for baseball and socker, neither of those have started yet.

Interview at KING residence (continued)

- Q. Does he have a basketball or other similar balls, the reason I'm asking is we have a report, approximately 8:30 in the area of the pharmacy, a young boy with a similar jacket, was kicking a ball around, and I'm wondering if you are missing a ball, you can't find the skate board, but is there a ball missing?
- A. One of our neighbors, the ROGERS up here at the corner, called back after MARION called him last night and said they remember seeing TIM coming back down Yorkshire from the west dribbling a basketball going through the intersection at Rugby, she thought about 8:00. That ties in with my daughters story that he went out after we left to shoot some baskets but it got too dark and then he came back with the basketball. The basketballs that we own are both here, we do not have a soccer ball.

(Mr. KING): I would like to mention a couple of other things about when my other kids got home. MARK got home, I think about 9:30, he was the one that was at play practice up here at Derby. He was dropped off from an automobile and told me that his teacher, Mrs. LOMASTER, he had been at her house. He said Mrs. LOMASTER dropped him off at the house. CHRIS was at the ROYERS, that the one we took over for the babysitting job and CHRIS got home right about midnight didn't he? (Mrs. KING): No, it was around 11 because he turned on the TV news. He went jogging at quarter to twelve, so it was before that. Now CHRIS did tell me, after he got home from jogging, he said I know it probably isn't important dad, but an old blue klunker turned up Cambridge from Maple Road and went up to Dorchester. He could not describe the make of the car, he said there were two young men that, when they parked and turned off their lights and when he started coming up behind them they took off, that's what he told me. He did want to mention it but it was an unusual occurrence to him. But I doubt if he ever jogged that late anyway. CATHY got home very late, as a matter of fact, later than we permit her. She had been to that floor show we talked about, she didn't get home till after three. And one of the fathers of one of the girls she went with called us about two, two thirty wondering where the girls were. I understand the floor show got started late and they were excited and that was the cause of it. But CATHY got home very late, she advised us that she and three of her friends were going to have dinner some place and go to the floor show. We got a call from one of the fathers and then he called back and said they just dropped his daughter off and CATHY would be home shortly.

- Q. Now TIM knew that the one brother was babysitting here in the neighborhood?
- A. Yes, he knew they were at the ROYERS.
- Q. He knew that when he came home and your daughter was not here he knew that your other son was in the immediate neighborhood?
- A. Yes. And he also knew where we were going to be. He might have forgotten about CHRIS babysitting, but he did know because the little boy was here for a while, while TIM and CHRIS were having dinner he sat at the table. He had his first babysitting job in the neighborhood yesterday, the lady had him over for a little in the afternoon and hes under strict instructions that if he has any concern at all to go to one of the neighbors.
- Q. Is TIM basically friendly, would he approach a stranger?
- A. Hes very gregarious and outgoing, but, within the last month we were talking about this problem of picking up kids and he said, "Gez I know, boy anybody gets out of a car I'm supposed to take off and run", so he learned that. But, yes he drags home every new kid in school and everything else, hes very outgoing.

- Q. What about assistance, in other words if I drove up in a car and said "son I can't find an address, could you show me, or could you help me", do you feel he would approach a car?
- A. I would hope not, but basically your growing up and its to help in that situation and I wouldn't want to pass judgement. (Mrs. KING): He might. Its never happened.
- Q. How do you think his attitude would be as far as police officer, is he friendly towards one, frightened of them?
- A. I have tried to tell all my children that police officers are good and they call you all "pigs" thats a common street name. But I've never heard TIM refer to a police officer, we've never had any reason to have one around and he is a 95 percentile student, hes a very sharp kid for his age, and I think right now he would have since enough to do something if he knew somebody was a police officer.
- Q. How is his schooling, any problems?
- A. No I talked to his teacher on Monday afternoon and she said he was very responsible, very good, his homework was always in on time and his marks were A's and B+'s. She considered him a good student, he behaved well.
- Q. Mrs. KING I'd like to obtain your date of birth?
- A. January 13, 1931.
- Q. And Mr. KING?
- A. [REDACTED]
- Q. And your home telephone number?
- A. 644-1539.
- Q. Business?
- A. 961-5470
- Q. I'm concerned about him going to a car and under the circumstances if someone presented a badge indicating he was a police officer would he go with him?
- A. I couldn't pass judgement on that. TIMMY is a gragarious soul and I would not be surprised if he would do this.
- Q. If I may at this time I'd like to converge to one of the younger members of the family?
- A. (Mrs. KING): Do you want me to tell you about the telephone call? (Yes). It sounded as if it could have been one of TIMs friend. He said, "Is TIM home?" and I said, "No, may I take a message?", "may I ask who's calling?". He said, "When will he be home?" and I said, "I don't know" and I asked him again, "who's calling?" and he said, "Thank you", and he hung up.
- Q. When did you get this call?
- A. Just now.

Discussion about half days of school this week because of conferences and the possibility of the school, or an officer checking at the school placing the call.

Time: 11:58 A.M. Conclusion of interview with parents of TIM, Mr. & Mrs. KING.

Q. First of all I would like your name MARK?
A. MARK BARRY KING.

Q. What is your date of birth?
A. [REDACTED]

Q. How old are you now?
A. 14.

Q. Do you go to school?
A. Derby Junior High School.

Q. Thats in Birmingham?
A. Yes.

Q. What grade are you in?
A. Ninth grade.

Q. Ok MARK you want to tell me what you know about the events of last evening, why don't you start with about dinner time, about 6:00 some where in there?
A. It was around 6 o'clock when I got home and he came over and asked me if he could clean my tapes in the basement.

Q. Who is he?
A. TIM. and I said yes and he went down and played them and then I went over to my teachers house to eat dinner, for a school project and I came home at about nine o'clock and he was gone.

Q. Who is the teachers home that you went over to?
A. Mrs. LOWMASTER.

Q. And this is reference a school play?
A. Yes.

Q. Whats her first name?
A. I have no idea.

Q. MARK what time did you leave for dinner over there?
A. Around 6 o'clock.

Q. Where was TIM at that time?
A. As far as I know in the house, I guess.

Q. You say you guess?
A. Yes, I wasn't sure, he might have gone outside or something.

Q. So what time would it have been when you last saw him?
A. Quarter to six or ten to six.

Q. And that was right here in the house?
A. Yes, sitting right over there.

- Q. And you arrived home at nine o'clock?
A. Nine thirty or nine o'clock.
- Q. What did you see when you came in the house at that time?
A. I walked in the kitchen and my mom was there and then I went to bed.
- Q. Was there any discussion about TIM?
A. Yes, my mom was worried and she was calling up people to see if they knew where he was.
- Q. Did she talk to you about TIM?
A. She just asked me if I knew where he was and I said I have no idea.
- Q. How did you get home?
A. Mrs. LOWMASTER gave me a ride.
- Q. You have any arguments or fights with your brother?
A. Not the day, no.
- Q. How do you and he get along?
A. Pretty well, just brotherly love, you know.
- Q. You have some differences of opinion but nothing out of the ordinary?
A. No not at all.
- Q. Did you see anything strange in the neighborhood when you got out of the car and came up to the door?
A. No, it was all the same.
- Q. See anybody on the street at all?
A. No.
- Q. Where did she let you off, out at the curb or did she pull in?
A. Right up front and I just walked up.
- Q. I wasn't clear on how you got over to Mrs. LOWMASTERS house?
A. I got a ride with my friend who was also going.
- Q. Whats his name?
A. JOHN MCMELIS.
- Q. How old is he?
A. 14 or 15.
- Q. He drove?
A. No his sister did.
- Q. Where does he live?
A. On Buckingham.
- Q. Is it on the other side of the tracks?
A. Its right over there behind Derby.
- Q. Had this dinner been arranged before hand?
A. Yes.

Q. Were you over there about 6 o'clock?
A. Yes.

Q. Who else was at the dinner?
A. A few girls from the school.

Q. Whats JOHNS sisters name?
A. JILL.

Q. How old is she?
A. 16 or 17.

It should be noted that the address for the MCMELIS' is [REDACTED], Birmingham. Parents names are JACK and JOYCE MCMELIS telephone of [REDACTED].

Q. When you left you say TIM was sitting right there?
A. No, when I left he was out of the room. He came in and asked me if he could play the tapes and thats the last I saw him.

Q. He went downstairs and you left?
A. Yes.

Q. MARK sometimes a brother sees a brother different then maybe the folks. Do you know anyplace where TIM might go or do you know of any problems that he may have had with anyone else?

A. We all get along pretty good. The place he usually plays are at Adams School or just around the neighborhood along this street.

Q. If he were to go over to Hunter Maple Pharmacy do you think he would take a direct route back, or is he the kind of guy who might stroll off by himself?

A. If he was by himself he would come right back and if he was with a friend he might go over to his house or something.

Q. If he were ticked off at somebody or something where do you think he would go?
A. Upstairs.

Q. No particular friends he might go to stay with?
A. I don't think so.

Q. Any particular place he might hide out at?

A. No, he might just go over to a friends house, if it was really bad, but usually he just goes upstairs.

Q. Would you please tell me your first name?
A. CHRISTOPHER KERR KING.

Q. Your date of birth?
A. [REDACTED]

Q. Do you go to school?

A. Yes, 10th grader at Seaholm.

Q. Can you tell me the events to last evening as they pertain to you and when you last saw your brother TIM?

A. Alright I came home from baseball practice from over at Seaholm at around, between 6 and 6:30 and I ate dinner with TIM and there was a neighbor kid over, KEVIN ROYER who my brother was supposed to babysit for, but since he had play practice he was going to stay here till I ate and then I was going to drive over there. So we ate dinner and around 7 o'clock my mother and father were going to a clients house and they dropped me and KEVIN off at the ROYERs house and TIM was out in the front yard at that time dribbling the basketball.

Q. Where did your parents drop you off at?

A. The ROYERs house, thats the kid I was babysitting for, I don't know the address, its on Pembroke Road.

Q. TIM was out in the front yard dribbling a basketball, was anyone with him?

A. No.

Q. When your parents left and you left was there anyone else at home besides TIM?

A. No.

Q. Was TIM home alone?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you see anybody strange in the neighborhood, any cars, any people?

A. After I got home, alright I got home at eleven, he still wasn't home and my mother and I went driving to the neighbors I guess to see if he was there, he wasn't there so it had to be twelve. And I was just walking around to see if he was around the neighborhood and I saw this car pull up Maple onto Cambridge, it was probably nothi but it just pulled up at Cambridge and Dorchester and cut the lights and kept the engine running and stayed there for three or four minutes so I figured I'd just walk by and see if they had seen him. So as I walked by they just took off.

Q. This was just about midnight when you saw this car?

A. Yes.

Q. What street were they on?

A. They were on Cambridge.

Q. Which way were they headed?

A. Toward Buckingham, north. Cambridge ends and turns into Buckingham. So they turned up Buckingham toward Adams and I went up Dorchester and cut across to Buckingham at by that time they were gone.

Q. Two people in the car?

A. Yes.

Q. Male or female?

A. I didn't get a good look at them, didn't even get a good look at the car, it was an old blue car, sorta beat up, it was sorta dark but when they opened the door for a second and shut it again and the light went on and there were two people in the car I thought they were both male. One had long brown hair and thats the only P14 I got a look at, that was the driver.

- Q. Do you know cars at all CHRIS?
A. Not really.
- Q. Was it a standard size car, intermediate, compact or sports?
A. I guess intermediate.
- Q. Do you have any idea whether it was a General Motors or Ford?
A. No.
- Q. How about the tail lights?
A. I didn't get a look at them. It was a blue hard top I know that.
- Q. You say intermediate?
A. The Chief who was here who had a green car, it was a hardtop, it was sort of similar to that size.
- Q. Did it have a vinyl top?
A. No.
- Q. Both headlights working?
A. Yes.
- Q. Loud, a bad muffler?
A. Not really.
- Q. Dark blue, light blue?
A. The light was bad, I could tell it was blue, I guess dark.
- Q. Real dark like navy blue?
A. No, sort of like that memorars book there.
- Q. Did you notice any pther color from the back other then red like a tail light broke out?
A. No.
- Q. Did you notice the license plate light?
A. I could not see it. The car went north on Cambridge.
- Q. Why did you run after them?
A. I don't know, I just figured if I could get a look at them it might help.
- Q. Was there a little consternation in your mind as to your brother being out later then he should?
A. Sure this was 12 o'clock.
- Q. Now if your brother were to take off if he were mad at somebody where do you think he would go?
A. Not really, maybe for the soul fact that I don't think he would do something like that. Hes just a normal kid, hes never mad at anybody long and he sure wasn't mad the other night.
- Q. How do you and your brother get along?
A. Fine, no real squabbles.

Q. Last night you were babysitting. At any other time have you noticed any other cars around, that would call your attention?

A. No I really haven't.

Q. Where do the ROYERS live?

A. 2000 block on Pembroke, across the railroad track.

Q. What is their first name?

A. DAVID and KATHELINE ROYER.

Interview with CATHY KING, sister to TIM. Time: 12:35 P.M.

Q. Would you give me your name?

A. CATHERINE ANN KING.

Q. And your date of birth?

A. [REDACTED]

Q. You go to school?

A. Seaholm.

Q. How old are you now?

A. 17.

Q. And what can you tell me about the events as they pertain to last night and your brother?

A. Alright I came home from a meeting around quarter to seven and when I got back around 7 o'clock everyone was getting ready to leave. My parents were going out to dinner and I guess they were taking CHRIS and KEVIN over to the ROYERS house and TIM went out at the same time and said he was going to go shoot some baskets. Then I walked from the kitchen to my bedroom and he was standing between the two doors, so I let him in and he told me again "I'm going to shoot some baskets at Adams", and I said, OK. And he left and I started to get ready because I was going out. He came back around 20 after at the latest, he said it was too dark to shoot baskets. (20 after 7) Then I was still getting ready to go out and then he asked me if he could have some money to go to the store and I gave him 30¢. He stuck around for a while, I was sitting in here waiting to go and he was sitting over there and we were talking. And then he got up to leave, he said he was going to Hunter Maple and he must have left probably between 25 and 20 to eight for Hunter Maple, and then I got picked up at quarter to eight to go out.

Q. He left at what time?

A. Between 25 and 20 to eight.

Q. What was he going there for?

A. Candy I assume.

Q. He didn't tell you?

A. NO he didn't, but he said he didn't want to spend any of his money, so it was nothing more expensive than 30¢, so it was obviously candy or gum or something like that.

Interview at KING residence (continued)

Q. Any other conversation between you and he?

A. No, he was just asking me what I was going to do and I was telling him about where I was going.

Q. What time did you leave the house?

A. Quarter to eight.

Q. When TIM left did you see him go?

A. Yes, I was standing right there and he said, he leaned his head in, and he said leave the door open this much for me when you go out and I did.

Q. Did he have the skate board with him?

A. No and I know he didn't have his basketball with him because he had put it some where because it was too dark and I couldn't see his whole body, I could only see his head cause he just leaned in to tell me to leave the door open.

Q. The skate board thats missing, could you describe it?

A. Its orange and its got clear, like lucite around the wheels and it comes up at the back its got a little wing on the back of it. Its got a course texture on it, its plastic.

Q. Wheres it normally kept?

A. In the garage most of the time, Ive seen it in the basement a few times but mostly in the garage.

Q. When was the last time you saw it?

A. I have no idea, I probably haven't seen it for a month and a half.

Q. As far as your concerned you didn't see him leave with the skate board under his arm or on him?

A. No, it might have been at the end of the walk and as he walked out he could have started kicking along.

Q. Do you visit alot?

A. No, but when we were talking he was telling me about one of his friends was a really good skate boarder and how he could do all these twists and everything and this boy said that he wasn't very good and TIM said "Wow, I wish I was that good", so maybe that might have started him going and practicing. But I really haven't seen him use it that much.

Q. Do you know who his friend was?

A. No, it was someone in his class.

Q. You don't think he was that good that he would have taken it to the store?

A. See thats the only reason why I don't think he would have taken it to the store cause it would have been more of a hindrance, he would have had to carry it, hes not that good, he can't go very far on it from what I've seen him do. I really don't think he would take it with him, but then again if he was practicing.

Q. Which way would he normally go, go right down Yorkshire or would he cut over to Maple?

A. No he would go down Yorkshire for sure, the only part I'm not sure about is whether or not he would go down Knox or then take a left on Maple.

Interview at KING residence (continued)

- Q. Due to the fact that it was dark he would be more inclined to take the lighted street, Yorkshire from what I remember, you have a light at the corner and that's it right?
- A. Right, and Knox is even darker, I don't think that that would have that much to do with it like every time we've had to do errands back there he and I jogg together and we have to mail letters and stuff we always go back by Knox. Whenever I drive I go that way but I've never seen him go in the back door of Hunter Maple, I've always seen him go in the front. I really think that whether or not Knox was dark really probably wouldn't have made any difference to him he would have gone down it anyway. Its some place that hes used to going without even thinking twice.
- Q. How did you leave here last night CATRY?
- A. CAROL ROSS pickèd me up and I went with her.
- Q. What time did you come home?
- A. It was after three, I don't know the exact time.
- Q. So when you left here you left the door ajar and nobody was at home?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Any lights on?
- A. I turned this light off and I turned this one on, I turned on the kitchen and the hall light and I turned off my bedroom light when I left. The two, no all the outside lights were on.
- A. Do you normally leave the door ajar when somebody is gone?
- A. Well that was kinda strange, usually I slam the door real hard behind me and he usually doesn't say anything like that when he leaves cause normally if Im home and TIMs home we just come in the back door, cause thats what we usually leave open. And that was kind of strange that he asked me to leave the door open, he was kind of worried about not being able to get in I think when he got back cause weve all been locked out before.
- Q. You don't have your own key?
- A. I do, he doesn't. He asked me to leave the door open and he was the only one home so thats what I did.
- Q. When you left at 7:45 did you see any strangers in the neighborhood, strange cars other people?
- A. No.
- Q. Anybody strange in the area when you came home at 3 o'clock?
- A. Nobody, there were a lot of cars parked around but none of them looked, they are all cars that I've seen before only they were parked in the street instead of the neighbors driveways.
- Q. Now if your brother were to leave home, being upset about something, do you have any idea, can you think of any place he might go, friends relations, hideouts?
- A. He doesn't really have a hideout or anything, I was thinking of Derby field, like that area behind Derby, but he doesn't know it real well, he doesn't go to Derby and I thought of DOROSOS, because they moved, but then they called and he wasn't there. And another place, hes not the type of person who gets moody and takes off for someplace, he'll just go upstairs usually. But he might go to the ice 000187 P18 around Forest Hills back there cause he knows that area pretty well. But he

doesn't get up and take off when hes upset. He would just go up in his room or pout or something, he doesn't have to get out of the house and get away.

- Q. If he was not upset, but had some time on his hands, do you think he would go down near the ice arena or Forest Hills?
- A. I don't think he would walk that far at that time of night. I think if he was going there he would take a bike, its a long walk. I don't think he would waste his time there, at night, without a friend too, he usually does stuff with people. And he usually doesn't do stuff alone and I don't think that he was side tracked to go look at stuff or do anything like that cause he does stuff with his friends. Im sure if he was alone he would have come right back home.
- Q. He knew that he was going to be at home by himself for a period of time by himself, is there any special program that would really draw him back to the house?
- A. I don't know what he watches on TV, he watches just about anything. He could have, with the play and everything, he could have stopped by one of his friends, but Im sure that some police officers have already talked to his friends and so I don't think that he went over to discuss the play with anyone.
- Q. Does he have anybody that drives a car that he rides around with?
- A. No. The only friend who has an older sister who would be driving is CHRIS DOROSE, and he wouldn't have been with CHRIS in the car.

June 1, 1977

KALBFLEISCH transported Douglas Wilson, of [REDACTED] Troy D.O.B. [REDACTED] to the offices of Dr. Rossi for the purposes of being interviewed under hypnosis. Doug Wilson had related to friends that he believed he was there the night Tim King was taken to Chatham market. That he remembered seeing a young boy on a skate board. That he remembered an individual sitting in the car watching the children and at the time he observed the young boy and his skate board another individual somewhat resembling the composite was standing by Chatham market watching the boy. Under hypnosis Doug Wilson indicated that he parked his vehicle, a red Alfa Romeo, at the rear of Chatham market. That he observed a young boy going down the parking lot grade riding a skate board. The boy appeared to be around 7 or 8 years of age. He was very small. That he observed the boy jump off the skate board as he approached the back wall of Chatham market and the skate board had run into the wall. He related he was quite a distance from the young man but he believed he was wearing gym shoes, possibly blue pants. Further indicated he remembered a jacket and something about stripes. Due to the size of Tim, the fact he was wearing dark green pants, which could be confused at a distance with blue and that the red jacket he was wearing did have stripes on the sleeves, there is a possibility he did observe go down and run into the back of the building. He stated at this point he saw another white male, approximately 30 years of age, 5' 10" to 6' 0" with dark hair going to the nap of the neck and partially covering the ears with dark eyebrows, wearing casual clothes, but could only remember the jacket which he described as a brown jacket, light weight with smooth finish, possibly a wind breaker watching the boy. He stated at that time he felt it might be the boys father watching his son on the skate board and paid no further attention to this individual. He further stated during the interview and reiterated under hypnosis that after locking his own personal car he observed a man in another car who appeared to be watching the children. Under hypnosis he stated the car was not a Chrysler product, it was American made, that he got the impression it was a [REDACTED] less, that being the intermediate Oldsmobile, that it was one color and he could not

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was watching. Douglas stated that he had observed the license number and made up a little jingle to remember it, but once leaving the supermarket seeing no damage to his car he dismissed the number. Under hypnosis he gave two possible licenses. One being GBR-222, which he indicated would be GERBER 222 would be the jingle to remember that number. Under further interrogation he came up with the license number GJR-222. After the interview, both numbers were checked by LEIN. License GBR-222 registers on a '69 Ford 2 dr. to [REDACTED] License # GJR-222 registers on a '70 Plymouth 2 dr. to [REDACTED] OK, [REDACTED]. Due to time limitations the attempt for further description of the man in the car and the man near the wall that the young lad was seen with were not completed. Arrangements have been made for another interview on June 9th at 9:00 AM with Dr. Rossi and Trooper Powell will be present to attempt to get an artist's conception of the two subjects. Sgt. Krease is running alterations of the license numbers through the Secretary of State to determine if any meet the description given by witness Douglas Wilson.

June 9, 1977

Douglas Wilson was again put under hypnosis by Dr. Rossi and drawings were made of the two men he saw in the Chatham parking lot on the night in question. The drawings were made by Sgt. Powell of the MSP. Wilson also stated that he had no reason to believe that the two men were together except his own feeling that two persons were involved in the child abductions. Copies of drawings T.O.T. Lt. Robertson.
