That old, old fashioned stereotyping.

James Gunnels:

Exactly, exactly. Umm...but, as far as Chris Bush hurtin' other kids, I

could definitely see him doin' that. Not then I couldn't, if you

understand what I'm sayin'.

Cory Williams:

Sure, but lookin' back and knowin' what you know now.

James Gunnels:

He, he never said nothin' to me that I can recall, of, you know, if you ever say anything to anybody, you know, I'm gonna "f" you up, I'm gonna get you whatever, I've got money to do it, nothin' like that, you

know.

Cory Williams:

Okay, did you ever see any pictures of kids tied up I know the kids in

the movie you said were tied up.

James Gunnels:

No I've never seen none but I think I was told by the police that they had, matter of fact I thought that they showed me some...back then. You know, do you remember this kid? And Kenny Bowman, to me, was a shock that Chris even knew him, because I wasn't cool with Kenny Bowman. At one time we hung out, I think years before that like at eight, nine, and ten years old, or somethin'. 'Cause we both

went to the same school.

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

Right, but then we kinda didn't hang around, now Jeff Plumley, I was real close with. He was a real close friend, a close friend of mine. Umm...

Cory Williams:

Well, I asked Bowman, I said who was the closest guy out of the group

there, with Chris and with Greg, and right away he said Vince.

James Gunnels:

Really?

Cory Williams:

First thing he said was Vince.

James Gunnels:

Right

Cory Williams:

Uh, here's a here's a report here from an interview of Bowman back in seventy-seven and it talks about one night Kenneth, Greg, Jeff, Brent and Vince Gunnels went to the drive-in and Greg bought beer. Kenneth stated he didn't drink, but Brent and Vince got drunk and

that's when it all started with Greg; Greg Greene.

James Gunnels:

Um-hmm.

Cory Williams: Kenneth said that Greg had, s...sexual acts with him four or five times.

He said that Greg lives on Baldwin street, Baldwin Boulevard.

James Gunnels: W...woo...

Garry Gray: UNCLEAR

James Gunnels: (Giggle) That's rare around here.

Cory Williams: Kenneth stated he saw Greg commit sexual acts on Brent and Vince in

the back seat while at the drive-in. And you're saying you don't

remember this guy?

James Gunnels: I don't remember goin' to a drive-in with these guys period.

Garry Gray: Yea, that was his verbage of it, what happened, I mean it's...

Cory Williams: Yea.

Garry Gray: ...a little different than yours.

James Gunnels: Umm, it...

Cory Williams: You know, this Greg Greene molested a lot of kids in the Flint area.

Around town there.

James Gunnels: Right.

Cory Williams: A lot of kids.

James Gunnels: Right.

Cory Williams: UNCLEAR and you were saying you don't remember him?

James Gunnels: Not at all, not at all.

Garry Gray: Did uh, did Chris hang with an, any other adults? Maybe it, maybe not

by name, maybe the guys name, I mean, doesn't even look familiar, but

do you remember him hanging with an, any other adults, that he chummed with? That were of his, uh, uh, sexual liking? You know

what I mean?

James Gunnels: Right, no I don't remember that.

Anybody, who, around his age? You know, probably, in their mid-

twenties, I mean.

James Gunnels:

Right, right, no I don't. I don't remember seeing him, seeing him with any other adults; ever. It was always just, you know, us kids, Paul, my brother, and Brent or Scottie, or, and him. You know what I'm sayin'?

Garry Gray:

Um-hmm.

James Gunnels:

It was always that. There was never no other adults around.

Cory Williams:

Well let me, let me ask you this. That time when you were up in

Alpena, at the house...

James Connels:

Right.

Cory Williams:

Had you been at the cottage and then went to the house? Or was it...

James Gunnels:

No.

Cory Williams:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

It was separate trips.

Garry Gray:

Do you, were you there? Alone?

James Gunnels:

Yes, that, that, that, to his house was just me. When we went to

the cottages it was with my brother.

Garry Gray:

Okay, UNCLEAR.

James Gunnels:

And, again, the other two; and the other two.

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR

Cory Williams:

To this house was it right in town in Alpena?

James Gunnels:

It was off of a, I, we rode dirt bikes out of the garage, so it was a gr...dirt street; and it was woods across the street, but it was like at the edge of town. You know what I'm sayin'? That type of thing there.

Cory Williams:

This wasn't the cottage?

James Gunnels:

No, sep...no, it was a separate house. It had aluminum siding, or I think aluminum siding on it or, you know what I'm saying, that type

of...

Cory Williams:

Was the houses close by, or...

James Gunnels:

Yea, there was, you know, av...not s...right next door, you know, like

a city, that close, but a little bit, you know.

Cory Williams:

And you said you were kinda screamin' that time?

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Cory Williams:

Was he doing something to try to quiet you down?

James Gunnels:

Just puttin' his hand over my mouth at first and tellin' me shhh, shhh, you know. It's gonna be okay. And you know he had grease smeared

on me, you know. He started out...

Cory Williams:

On your backside?

James Gunnels:

... yea. He started givin' me a blowjob and tried to do anal with his finger or whatever and I get up off of the bed and screamed away and

ran out to the living room.

Cory Williams:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

Matter of fact, and no here we go, you're triggerin' somethin' here.

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

I think when I ran out there, 'cause, 'cause there was somebody else in the house 'cause I remember him runnin' out there. Now I don't remember who this person was. Don't remember even being introduced to this person, you know what I'm sayin'.

Cory Williams:

An adult?

James Gunnels:

That type of thing. Yea. I don't know because we ran out, when I ran out into the living room makin' a scene...he said somethin' to somebody else that I got it taken care of, basically. And walked me back into the living, er, bedroom and said I won't do that no more. That, that's how that happened. He didn't do that, but I mean he was

attempting to.

Cory Williams:

Were you running, at that time?

James Gunnels:

Yea. Yea.

Cory Williams:

In the other room?

James Gunnels:

Yea, yea.

Garry Gray:

But you don't, you don't recall...

James Gunnels:

I don't remember the person talkin' to him or even visioning what, who that person was. I can't even think. You know what I'm saying?

Garry Gray:

Now, let's talk about the movie a little bit. I mean you made mention that you couldn't recog...think back, I mean, like you said, you've sparked your memories and that, you don't know if he was, in the, in the movie? I mean he was a big guy; a big fat guy; and the beard...

James Gunnels:

I don't think, I, I, tryin' to remember, but no, I can't.

Garry Gray:

You, did you, you can't mentally say well, yea, it doesn't sound like...

James Gunnels:

No, I couldn't tell...

Garry Gray:

Okay.

James Gunnels:

... you if it was or wasn't; you know.

Garry Gray:

Alright.

Cory Williams:

Did you ever see Chris, uh, with any other kids that you didn't recognize or did he ever have, had you perform oral sex on any other boys that you didn't...

James Gunnels:

No.

Cory Williams:

...know who they were.

James Gunnels:

No.

Cory Williams:

No?

James Gunnels:

No. No.

Garry Gray:

No strange kids being there maybe, uh, terrified or anything of that sort.

That you, ch, just a question?

Garry Gray:

Right, right. Right. Umm, sitting in a chair over in a corner scared

shitless or something?

James Gunnels: No, no.

Cory Williams: What, do you think, if I showed you a picture or something that you

might recognize the guy in the other room, or no? It was too long ago?

I mean, I'm trying to take you back...

James Gunnels: I'm tryin' to, I'm, oh...

Cory Williams: Jim, I'm tryin' to take you back to that day.

James Gunnels: I understand that.

Cory Williams: If there's another guy in the house and you guys were staying up there,

you actually drove probably to Flint up to stay at that place. You

know, if you had another adult riding with you...

James Gunnels: No, oh no.

Cory Williams: Alright.

James Gunnels: Umm...

Cory Williams: ...possible it was his roommate and if he shared...

James Gunnels: That's what I was thinkin', that that's what it was.

Cory Williams: Yea.

James Gunnels: UNCLEAR

Cory Williams: I don't wanna put words in your mouth.

James Gunnels: Well, I, I understand that, but I mean, I don't know if it was that

person's...

Cory Williams: It could've been that person's house.

James Gunnels: Exactly, and he's allowing the person to use it for his purpose or

whatever. I don't know, you know. Umm...there was con...I thought there was contact made with a neighbor at the Ess Lake cottage. A neighbor, by my brother, I don't know or, maybe Brent or somebody were out riding snowmobiles out on the Lake right there, and like there's, I think, there was "A" frame or something next door, a nice cottage anyways, you know, and uh...I wanna say one of the neighbors

was talkin' to us over the space of the quiet, you know what I'm

saying, there's woods in-between...

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

...but you can see house to house or yell across through the snow or

whatever UNCLEAR

Garry Gray:

Cory, show him the, uh, photos, or the photographs of the, the house, of the cottage in Ess Lake. Yea. UNCLEAR Yea, we got a lot of stuff. Hey, we got some pictures UNCLEAR to find out if it's the same place

that you recall.

Cory Williams:

Yea, I got 'em right here. You ever, uh, go with, Chris out to his brother's place in Whitehall, Michigan; John, his brother John?

James Ginnels:

No, but I went and visited them, I stayed, yea, I stayed over, (sigh) a weekend or two? Er, I s...I stayed, I went and hung out with Brent and Scott at Whitehall; at about the beer and wine store. His dad owned the beer and wine store. I was just talking to somebody about this the other day; he's from Whitehall.

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

This person didn't hear about it and that's what brought it, brought that

up. Umm...

Cory Williams:

So you remember Whitehall?

James Gunnels:

Yea! Yea.

Cory Williams:

So you were out there?

James Gunnels:

Yea! One time, I think, it was one time he had...

Cory Williams:

With Chris?

James Gunnels:

Huh?

Cory Williams:

With Chris?

James Gunnels:

No, with, no. This was, no. Uh...I know I took a bus back to Flint,

from Muskegon. John drove me into Muskegon and dropped, you

know, dropped me off at the bus stop.

Cory Williams:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

It was...and I, I can't remember. I really, really, really can't. I, I'm

thinkin' they did it before this whole thing happened, or after.

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

You know, but I would think it would have to be after because John, I think John moved to, uh, t...t... Whitehall after this whole thing...

Garry Gray:

Um-hmm.

James Gunnels:

...took place, with his son.

Garry Gray:

Yea.

James Gunnels:

You know what I'm sayin'?

Cory Williams:

Alright, I'm gonna show you a few pictures. Keep in mind...

James Gunnels:

Sure.

Cory Williams:

...these are recent ones. And he was thirty years ago. So, the paint

might, it might be a different color and...

James Gunnels:

Okay.

Cory Williams:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

I know I had that picture window lookin' out towards the...remember

UNCLEAR and the fireplace.

Cory Williams:

Remember that?

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Cory Williams:

That's the place?

James Gunnels:

Yea. And this is the garage right here, too.

Cory Williams:

They just pull right in, together, kind of?

James Gunnels:

Yea, yea. Well, that's where he had the snowmobiles and just ride it

right out of the garage into, you know, onto the lake or whatever.

Cory Williams:

But you're pretty sure that's the place? There's another little angle of it

you might know.

James Gunnels: Oh yea exactly like it, but, yea, that's what I, I kind of remember it like

that.

Cory Williams: A little angle, that's around the front on the other side of it. Four

walls...and the fireplace is pretty distinct on there.

James Gunnels: I remember the fire going, he kept the fire going.

Garry Gray: So you remember the deck and the garage where he was UNCLEAR.

James Gunnels: I don't know about the deck; uh, uh, we ... all we did was go in through

the garage...

Garry Gray: Sure.

James Gunnels: ...everytime time; we...in and out.

Garry Gray: Well that...

James Gunnels: You couldn't...the snow at that time was a lot even in this UNCLEAR.

Cory Williams: The guy took these, the guy that took these pictures for me...

James Gunnels: Uh-huh...

Cory Williams: Recently...

James Gunnels: Right.

Cory Williams: Said he thought that, that would look quite a bit newer...

James Gunnels: Right.

Cory Williams: ...than the house.

James Gunnels: I don't remember that deck being like that...

Cory Williams: Right.

James Gunnels: But I do remember having the, I, the main thing that I remember is

them picture windows UNCLEAR...

Garry Gray: Yea.

James Gunnels: ...the lake.

Cory Williams:

Okay. UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

You know it seems like a, the roof was real wide.

Cory Williams:

Well, it's interesting, 'cause you know mentioned that Bowman, you didn't think that Bowman was up there, up North at anytime?

James Gunnels:

Uh-huh.

Cory Williams:

But he mentions to me, when I kept talkin' about the cottage up there at

ES Lake...

James Gunnels:

Uh-huh.

Cory Williams:

...he kept sayin', no, I wasn't at the cottage, but, I thought, he kept

saying I thought he owned a house and lives in Alpena; had a bunch of

toys up there. Talkin' about snowmobiles...

James Gunnels:

Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

Cory Williams:

...and stuff like that. But now you're mentioning independently on

your own, that you were there and it was a house...

James Gunnels:

Yea, there was a...

Cory Williams:

...different from the, than the cottage.

James Gunnels:

Yea. There was, there was two places definitely. There was two

different places.

Cory Williams:

Did he, uh, so, you were never in Birmingham with him...

James Gunnels:

No.

Cory Williams:

...with Chris. Never at the house.

James Gunnels:

Nope.

Cory Williams:

Did you ever go to, I can't remember, I probably asked you this, down

in the Detroit area with him? With Chris?

James Gunnels:

No.

Garry Gray:

You ever go in the city, you ever go in the city of Detroit, I mean, not,

to stay, or for, just for anything? Go down Woodward Avenue, or, uh.

you know, I-75, Woodward?

James Gunnels:

The only time I've been to Detroit, is, is Ryan Road Prison. (Giggle)

Garry Gray:

(Giggle)

James Gunnels:

And uh, seriously, and, maybe to pick up people at airports.

Garry Gray:

Okay.

James Gunnels:

Well, you know, ridin' with them or whatever now and there. And to take the train to New York City. UNCLEAR other than that, don't go

down there.

Cory Williams:

That's what, uh, Bowman was pretty, pretty positive that, that you

knew Greg Greene, too.

James Gunnels:

The name sounds familiar.

James Gunnels:

I, I, I you're talkin' about a, a man who had sex with me, no I don't

remember that.

Garry Gray:

Yea.

James Gunnels:

You know what I mean. There's a big difference.

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR

James Gunnels:

You know what I mean. I mean you're talkin' about blockin' things

out. I understand how it applies to this UNCLEAR but.

Garry Gray:

Well, I...l...let me ask you this, just, just between the three of us in

here.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

How many men have mole...have molested you?

James Gunnels:

Three.

Garry Gray:

Do you remember their names?

James Gunnels:

Yea, uh, Chris Bush, uh...when I say this name, alright, uh, Ron Engelhart, and he really wasn't a man, but he was older than me. He was in his late, early teens, like, I mean eighteen, nineteen years old,

but I was...

Ron, Ron Engelhart?

James Gunnels:

Engelhart. Yea. He had a crush on me. This girlfriend I had, and kind

of worked his way into me.

Garry Gray:

Yea.

James Gunnels:

You know whether he was...

Cory Williams:

Was he kin to Brent Bush?

James Gunnels:

Huh?

Garry Gray:

Was he kin to Brent Bush?

James Gunnels:

No

Cory Williams:

Okay.

James Gunnels:

None of these people were.

Cory Williams:

Okay.

James Gunnels:

And, the third person is Bruce Crane, and that's a guy I've thought about calling whoever to this day and say, you people need to watch this guy 'cause he's a monster. He's a real monster and he lives on Lincoln Avenue a couple doors down from where I was at; lived at.

Garry Gray:

L...l...let me ask you this. And like this, this is, the...these are like the deep, deep hidden secrets that people hate to say. I mean, like I said, there's three of us here. When, when Chris Bush wanted to have anal sex with you, did he ever at any time accomplish his mission of getting'...

James Gunnels:

No.

Garry Gray:

Of having anal sex with you.

James Gunnels:

No. No.

Garry Gray:

Every time he tried, you pushed him off?

James Gunnels:

It was only that one time?

Garry Gray:

Just once.

James Gunnels: That one time, and like I said, I made a big enough scene, ran out of the

room, and then, I'm almost sure he said to somebody out, I got this under control, or whatever. You know, I'm takin' care of this and coaxed me back into the room and said, that won't happen, calm down.

Garry Gray: ... another person was there but you can't remember who it was?

James Gunnels: Right, right. Whether he was talkin' to the a, a person in the, in a

closed room, you know what I'm sayin', outside of the room. I, I wanna say it was his roommate, you know I don't want you to think, think you puttin'... He made trips to the kitchen, you know what I'm

sayin'.

Cory Williams: And kept you in the bedroom.

James Gunnels: Exactly.

Cory Williams: Okay. I want you to take a look and see if you see, ever seen these kids

before, or you maybe saw 'em in the movies and it, or if you ever seen

Chris with them.

James Gunnels: That's...no. That's sad though man, that's sad.

Garry Gray: Have you ever heard of the Oakland County Child Killer investigation?

James Gunnels: No.

Garry Gray: What is it that you...well what can you to tell us, okay, about, what

we're lookin' at. UNCLEAR what we're lookin' at.

James Gunnels: I know, umm...oh, did you know that he was supposed to be a Big

Brother in the Big Brother's Association? That was a link to get to me.

Cory Williams: Okay.

James Gunnels: He used that whole spiel on my mom.

Cory Williams: Right.

James Gunnels: No, and my dad, too. See, I told you my dad was a little more

protective about the whole thing.

Garry Gray: That's a common UNCLEAR of a pedophile.

James Gunnels: Exactly.

I mean, it's what UNCLEAR.

James Gunnels:

Exactly. This was before they screen these people before they get into these programs, you know, have you got any, umm...he, he used, I think he used Scott, uh Brent, not Scottie, so much, I wasn't, you know, he wasn't who, you know who Scottie was, but I think he kind of used

Brent...

Garry Gray:

Yea.

James Gunnels:

...to, uh, persuade me, that everything's okay.

Cory Williams:

Was Chris molesting Brent?

James Gunnels:

Huh?

Cory Williams:

Was Chris molesting Brent?

James Gunnels:

I never seen him do it. Never, never have.

Cory Williams:

Alright. Now Brent Bush, from what we know...

James Gunnels:

Right.

Cory Williams:

... is the one that introduced Bowman to Greg Greene. Chris and Brent,

intr...introduced Bowman to Greg Greene.

James Gunnels:

Uh-huh.

Cory Williams:

And Brent Bush, supposedly, uh, what I'm sayin' is, Brent knew 'em,

knew Greene...

James Gunnels:

Uh-huh.

Cory Williams:

Chris Bush knew Greene, Bowman knew Greene, Plumley knew

Greene. Everybody's sayin' they knew Greene but you.

James Gunnels:

I just, I don't remember...

Cory Williams:

From the neighborhood, he lived the next street over on Semco.

James Gunnels:

See, I lived farther away from Semco, but not that much farther.

Cory Williams:

Oh, I know where at.

James Gunnels:

I know, I know, I know. Umm...(sigh)

There won't be a reason for us to have further questions for ya, we, we're, let me ask you this, I mean, the int...the interview's been real nice and, been listenin' to you, but what if we find out that you're not being honest with us, what would happen? I mean, you know what I'm saying, we don't know you from Adam, do we?

James Gunnels:

No.

Garry Gray:

Okay, you don't know us. We just have some questions, all we want is the truth. You know, there's a lot of reasons why people don't mention something.

James Gunnels:

Okay.

Cory Williams:

I know, I can tell right now, your, your, your eyes are turned up.

James Gunnels:

Oh, I've seen...

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR them pictures?

James Gunnels:

Yea, but, but...

Garry Gray:

I know, but let me, let me, let me tell you. A lot of times something so bad could've happened to you and you say, I'm not going to talk about this, I don't care what anybody says. We're here, we flew, you know, three hours...

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

...to come up here to talk to you. We're not coming back. We just wanna get as much out of you as, but, I mean, here's the, here's the thing though if we're gonna talk to other kids, you're one of our first ones.

James Gunnels:

Okay.

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR there's no bull-shittin'. He's full of shit if he doesn't know Greene. He's a lying sack of shit if he says that.

James Gunnels:

Right, right.

Garry Gray:

You know, well you, well you know. Now, what is that going to do for us? I mean that's just it, we're just lookin' for UNCLEAR. It doesn't matter.

James Gunnels:

Okay.

Garry Gray:

Well, he could've been a, a monster a hideous son of a bitch...

James Gunnels:

I know.

Garry Gray:

I mean we know that.

James Gunnels:

I know. Well, obviously.

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR it happened and he's no longer with us. This Greg Greene

guy he, he died in prison. You know what he was in prison for?

James Gunnels:

Molestin' kids.

Garry Gray:

Yea!

James Gunnels:

Obviously.

Garry Gray:

Yea! Shit, he's done hundreds of 'em; you know? You understand, he

g...I'm sure he wouldn't remember you.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

You know?

James Gunnels:

Right, too many in a UNCLEAR.

Garry Gray:

Yea! I don't know if you remember...

Cory Williams:

Hey, J...J...Jim...

Garry Gray:

...do you, do you remember...

Cory Williams:

Is there a reason, is there a reason you're not saying anything? You

didn't, you don't remember?

James Gunnels:

No! No, I honestly don't remember.

Garry Gray:

The, the, but you know what...

James Gunnels:

The name rings a bell...

Garry Gray:

Okay.

James Gunnels: ...but whether that was part of an investigation going on back with

Chris Bush or not; I don't' remember.

Garry Gray: You know, here, here's what happens, Jim, a lot of guys, and I've

interviewed kids...

James Gunnels: Uh-huh.

Garry Gray: ...that, I've interviewed guys in their forties, even in this case, that,

guy, one guy, one guy that we interviewed he eh, um, was at uh, a

prison in uh St. Louis fa. facility. You ever been there?

James Gunnels: Yea.

Garry Gray: Yea, he was a victim of one of our, well the guy that we dogged in

Ohio we arrested some guys, molested a bunch of kids back in the

seventies; got prosecuted, got three life terms.

James Gunnels: Um-hmm.

Garry Gray: Three. What I wanna do is close the books, although the, although god

closed the books on Jam...on uh, uh, Greg Greene and Christopher

Bush. He closed those books.

James Gunnels: Um-hmm.

Garry Gray: You know he never, they're not gonna do that anymore. They're not

gonna hurt another kid.

James Gunnels: Right. Right.

Garry Gray: As long as they live. But, what I wanna do is this, we know he's been,

he's molested a lot of kids and that. I wanted to give these other

victims a little bit of closure, too.

James Gunnels: I understand, I understand.

Garry Gray: UNCLEAR And what I need from, from you is just be honest.

UNCLEAR And I've talked to kids 'til I was blue in the face.

James Gunnels: Right.

Garry Gray: And then a lot of times, you know what, the hardest, you know the

hardest...person to interview is a fourteen year old boy.

James Gunnels: Right.

Because they're right at that age where it's, they know it's wrong and

it's, you know it's, it's bad touch feels good you know that take when

you know it's wrong...

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

...but it feels; that kind of crazy stuff.

James Gunnels:

Right, right.

Garry Gray:

But, that's why you're a kid, but, you're a, you're an adult now.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

You're an adult and you've got that behind you. We're just lookin' at,

we're just lookin' for some help. You know, d...do you play cards in

here?

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Garry Gray:

You know, you know some of the hidden cards?

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

You know, y...I don't want you to know what my cards are?

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

I'm not gonna come up here and tell you absolutely every single thing

that...

James Gunnels:

I understand that.

Garry Gray:

It's just, it's just part of being a cop.

James Gunnels:

I'm not, I'm not, I'm not being, I'm not tryin', I, I want you to

UNCLEAR.

Garry Gray:

I'm just trying to jog something UNCLEAR a lot of times UNCLEAR.

James Gunnels:

I'm UNCLEAR. The only thing I can say you triggered in my mind is, is the thing about walkin' out there, just runnin' out the livin' room and him sayin' something to somebody else. That, I that, that was, I kn...a,

a, a...you know.

Let's, alright, let's go on.

James Gunnels:

But back to Greene? I don... I honestly really don't remember this guy.

I mean, I do remember a name.

Cory Williams:

This is really hittin' you hard lookin' at those.

James Gunnels:

It, just because they're innocent kids. I'm lookin' at kids and, and I don't know. I, you know, are they, were they, are they alive? Were they molested? What? I don't know, you see what I'm sayin'? I can only imagine what had happened to 'em. You see what I'm saying? I mean, sure, it, it c...it makes me think about my own experience. You know, I'm reflectin' on me, too. I looked like one of these little poofy,

short-haired kids.

Garry Gray:

Yea, no doubt, I mean...

James Gunnels:

UNCLEAR

Garry Gray:

UNCLEAR parents...

James Gunnels:

Huh?

Garry Gray:

...and their parents, too, you know.

James Gunnels:

Oh, I know it.

Garry Gray:

We're tryin' to give them a little satisfaction...

James Gunnels:

I understand.

Garry Gray:

...as far as knowin' UNCLEAR.

James Gunnels:

Hell, yea.

Garry Gray:

That's all. We're just lookin' at you to help us.

Cory Williams:

Did you ever, uh, Christopher ever give you a ride in a car to meet

anybody? To meet any of his buddies?

James Gunnels:

Not his buddies. I don't know if he took me through rides through our neighborhood, per say. Uh, take, it, to, just...smoke pot with me, or something like that, cop a feel on my leg, to let me know he wanted to take me somewhere that weekend. Like, like, I would say before we went up to the cabin; or not to the cabin, but to the house thing, whenever, that, he had, uh, he stopped by...you know whether I was

out in front of the house or whatever, and said, hey, jump in, whatever, drive around the street couple times...

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

...me and him was, holler at your mom, whatever, about taking you up...are you down for that? Are you ready for that? Whatever, you

know what I mean?

Cory Williams:

Right.

James Gunnels:

That type of thing, but other than that, no.

Cory Williams:

Okay.

Garry Gray:

You know, you know, Jim, let me, let me just give you a little...like I said, we don't know you; you, you, you seem like a very nice man.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

Okay, you're, you're payin' your, your, your dues, you're gonna be out

here, shortly...

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

...uh, Montana; state of Montana?

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Garry Gray:

Boy...

James Gunnels:

Yeal

Garry Gray:

...that's great.

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Garry Gray:

We're not gonna come back up and talk to you.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

Here's, here's one of the things I wanna leave you with before this

ends; we're lookin' for some help. Okay?

James Gunnels:

Right.

I, we, have interviewed dozens of kids on this, men.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

Also, we've done many investigations and asked where, sometimes people they, they just want to hold back. They don't wanna spit it out. They, they're just too, it's too, horrible in their past. I've had that happen before. Here, d...here's one thing I want you to understand.

You know, you could be lying to me through your teeth.

James Gunnels:

Yea.

Garry Gray:

That's it, you know, and, and if you are, that's great; that's okay. But, if you were to say, hey listen, I, I, I've been blowin' smoke, by you.

I'm gonna be honest with you.

James Gunnels:

Um-hmm.

Garry Gray:

No idea UNCLEAR okay, cool. That's, that's part of our job. I've had

kids lie to me; just hours, lie.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

Knowin' nothin' happened. Noth...nothin' had to happen, I said, hey, okay, you know. You can stop this from happening ever again by

being straight up with me, or...

James Gunnels:

Right:

Garry Gray:

...if you don't, then you're the one responsible for this son of a bitch to

continue goin' on.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

That type thing.

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

But then you know they think about it and go, ohh, shit, you know and, sure you walk, we walk outta here and get the thing, we fly back, we're

all done...

James Gunnels:

Right.

Garry Gray:

...you've got the baggage, not me.

James Gunnels:

I understand.

Garry Gray:

Okay.

James Gunnels:

Lunderstand

Garry Gray:

It's all we're lookin' at.

James Gunnels:

Okay.

Garry Gray:

If you were to say to me right now, hey detectives, yea, yea, shit, I remember him you know and this is what happened. I'm not gonna be

mad at you, shit!

James Gunnels:

I understand.

Garry Gray:

Why would I? Why would I?

James Gunnels:

I, I don't think that you are, long as you know that.

Garry Gray:

I know, I know that, but what, there's no reason why we would be.

James Gunnels:

Yea

Garry Gray:

What about that don't you understand?

Cory Williams:

UNCLEAR

Garry Gray:

Don't, don't, I mean...

James Gunnels:

I'm not holdin' nothin' back, that I can think of, you know I, I, I want to help you guys, I mean, if there's somethin' that you guys...

Cory Williams:

Do you think Chris Bush was capable of killing a kid? Molestin' 'em

and killin' 'em?

Garry Gray:

Okay, you can stop right here. Everybody's capable of it.

James Gunnels:

UNCLEAR

Garry Gray:

You're capable of it; I'm capable, he's capable of it. Now, think in your past, did he choke you out to, you know, huh, I'm gonna do this to

you whether you like it or not; chokin' you out...

James Gunnels:

No.
