

Vince: Huh, no

Karen: You're calling the cell phone and

Vince: I'm, I've called both numbers Karen, but both times it gave me about a split second with you and that was it.

Karen: Right, I, yeah. Anyway so I've cleared the account and then, tell me what's going on honey from your end

Vince: Well I mean, I tell you what, I meant, I did not get back in time at Homeward Bound, what was it Thursday, I think it was Thursday night, okay, this is last week, the following, so, so I ended up staying over at the girls house that I helped them move down from the Rescue Mission down into the flats.

Karen: Right

Vince: Okay. The next morning I sh, I was there at seven o'clock in the morning. The lady that works there at Homeward Bound told me I could not be on the property and that I would have to call Steve and set up an appointment

Karen: Yeah

Vince: For a grievance hearing, so I did all that. My parole agent was not working Friday at all, so I left a voice mail with him to explain what happened and told him I would try to stay at the Rescue Mission.

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Okay

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Rescue Mission would not let me stay there because I'd already stayed there three weeks straight and they said no

Karen: Yeah

Vince: So, the guy, the Viet Nam vet friend of mine who has the camper trailer that he's buying on the 31st of this month, but he's staying in it still right over off the Utah said he was there eating lunch, said you can stay with me Jimmy. So I stayed there. I made every single one of my drop appointments. I made the appointment to the, ah, substance abuse counseling class, but I did, I did get a case of walking pneumonia, I can tell you that right now, girl. My lungs are filled with that crap right now. Other than that, I didn't do anything wrong, Karen. I haven't, you know, used. I haven't been in trouble. I haven't done anything. Night before last I believe

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it is I went up to the Rescue Mission to eat with this Viet Nam vet of mine, friend of mine. We walked in there, I sat down, a cop walked in, walked up to the guy that runs the place, walked over to me and asked me if my name was James. I said yeah and he arrested me. Said there was a warrant out of Michigan and out of Montana, you know.

Karen: Yeah

Vince: He didn't say what the warrants were. He just said that there was two warrants out.

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: And so here I am. I haven't seen Pat Berry. He hasn't been up here. These people, I refuse to talk to them, Karen. I'm not about to sit down and talk to these people, you know

Karen: Okay

Vince: I told them I wanted a lawyer and they continued to, the prosecutor left, but the lawyer, or the two cops sat there and tried to drill me anyways, cause you know the guy, that's the one, that's Cory Williams' old partner

Karen: Okay

Vince: The guy, the guy that was there, so he might

Karen: It was just a woman, it was just a woman that came here with the prosecuting

Vince: Oh really

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Well the other guy that was with Cory Williams

Karen: He was probably in the car

Vince: Sure, sure. I have that woman's card in my hand right now, Shelly Holloway

Karen: Yeah

Vince: But anyways, ah, you know, they, you know, they tried to talk to me and I said I have no, nothing to say to you people, you know, you, technically Karen they weren't supposed to even stay in there, the minute I asked for a lawyer, they read me my rights again and I said I want a lawyer, there it is. That should've been end of discussion.

Karen: Okay

Vince: So that's where I'm at, Karen. I just wanted to let you know where I'm at and is Ellen okay.

Karen: Ellen's okay. She's home

Vince: Is she home

Karen: Yeah, she's been home for a few days

Vince: That's a big part of the reason why I didn't have my phone on Karen was because what I didn't know about the legal part, about, I'm talking about my parole officer.

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Alright, so I had it shut off. I just want you to know that.

Karen: Okay

Vince: It wasn't you guys. It wasn't, it wasn't Ellen, believe me. Again, I was in jail and I haven't been able to contact you till now, so, you know

Karen: Okay. Well you understand what they're saying, right.

Vince: I don't understand it. I didn't lis, I didn't wanna hear it Karen, why would I listen to it.

Karen: Did you lis, did you hear it?

Vince: About the, the only thing I heard, one, one, they said was that they had DNA on one of the victims and I said whatever, you know. There it is there.

Karen: Well I know you're going back to Michigan then.

Vince: Well I'm sure I am

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I don't care about that.

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I'm ready to go girl. I told them that. I says round one, round two, whatever, but the bottom line is I don't, you know, I had nothing to do with anything Karen. That I know. And I don't care

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I don't care what they told you. I don't care how, how

Karen: No they didn't tell me anything

Vince: How much, well you know, they tried to make it sound like I was, that, like they were out to charge me with something. They keep bring up my age like I wouldn't be accountable for something anyways. That's BS Karen, that's the same, that's the same crap

Karen: It is, and, and we heard

Vince: Hmm

Karen: There's no statute of limitations on this

Vince: Oh I already know that, but I'm not involved in it

Karen: Yeah you know that

Vince: I'm not involved

Karen: They, they told me that. Well

Vince: That's fine. I'm not involved in it Karen, you know, and I know this, so you know, it's just, you know, anyways I just wanted to say I, I do want

Karen: I don't get it. How

Vince: What's that Karen

Karen: I just don't get it, how could they come up with your DNA on this girl's clothing if you weren't there

Vince: I don't know either Karen

Karen: What

Vince: I don't know either

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: How could

Karen: Okay

Vince: I don't know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: So, you know, that's for them to figure out, not me. I mean if I, if I, if I stand on the word of God Karen and tell, told them men to their face and I'd do the same thing for you right this minute, that I know nothing about it, you know, and I don't, I don't know. That's all I can do.

Karen: Well it's my, it's my understanding, Vince, that they just wanna, um, talk with you more, have your cooperation

Vince: In what

Karen: Answer ques, answer questions

Vince: I can't answer questions, okay. How can I answer questions that I know nothing about, literally. I told them, the lady that you spoke to last, yesterday, with tears in my eyes, look the only dealings I had with that, that man, Chris Bush

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Was when he tried to do what he did to me, period

Karen: Yeah

Vince: There was no other time. They keep trying to put that in there, Karen, and which doesn't exist, at all. Okay, Karen, would you do me a favor. When you get done talking to me, talk to Paul about it. Get into his head and tell him to try to think of one single time, you know, I'd like, I tell you what, I don't wanna put him in this, I don't, but if it comes down to it, he's gonna have to show is face up in court one day to me. He's gonna have to. But, I can tell you what, he would know. You know what I'm saying. He was with me, he was my shadow, you know that.

Karen: Well he wasn't there at the time you were

Vince: No, he wasn't

Karen: Molested

Vince: Right. But that was in another town, you know, it wasn't, I'm talking about just, I don't know, I don't know what they're, what to, where they're coming from, Karen.

Karen: I don't either Vince

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Vince: My big thing is when I get there, I don't know how I'm gonna get araised with a good court appointed attorney, but I need one, I need one, that's for sure.

Karen: And I did bring that up and they said to me that they have nothing to do with that, that that would be the correctional department's area

Vince: What

Karen: Is what they told us.

Vince: What for the attorney

Karen: Yeah

Vince: That they would set me up with one, Department of Corrections don't have any

Karen: No, no they didn't say that they would set you up with one, they said, isn't that right Craig

Craig: Yeah

Karen: That they weren't, um, that wasn't their area of setting you up with a lawyer

Vince: Right, well

Karen: At this point. And that that would be up to the correctional facility, whatever, whatever. All I know is that, what I do know is that you did not get back there in time.

Vince: No I didn't

Karen: And you blew it

Vince: Yes I

Karen: You blew it by not getting there in time

Vince: Exactly. We're talking ten minutes, but that doesn't matter to them people.

Craig: But that, that's not a big thing any way.

Vince: Oh I know it's not Craig, believe me. If this wasn't going on, I'm sure that, that Ted Berry would not send me back to Michigan over this Karen. Do you understand that?

Karen: I hear that, yeah, I do.

Vince: Oh, believe that.

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Karen: But this was

Vince: Believe it or not I have a place to move to right now, if this wasn't going on here in Butte.

Karen: Then, regardless of, regardless of the parole violation, this would've been coming.

Vince: Oh, I realize that. They called Monday, they said. And, and the PO said they didn't know where I was at, that's bull crap. I went in, I went in and dropped Monday, Karen.

Karen: Listen, I told them that too. I don't get it. How on earth could you not locate him.

Vince: Exactly

Kim: He's got a PO

Vince: I'm going in to, I'm going in to drop urines every single day, seven days a week. Did not miss a single day Karen, right up till the day, matter of fact, I was leaving the Rescue Mission to go drop that day, that night when they arrested me at six o'clock, I was leaving there. And I did it the night before the same way

Karen: Yeah

Vince: So they can't tell me they didn't know where I was at. There's a lot of getting, their not being truthful, Karen. There's some things that they've already said to me, man, and I just got pissed at them, you know I did. I said look

Karen: Yeah

Vince: You should, you know, you done drug me through the coals, my family through the coals, I am done with you people man, you know. So, you know, hey, they wanna go round two with me, they can go round two, but I did make it very clear to them, Karen, that I am suing these people after this is over with and I'm proven innocent, I will sue them and ain't nobody gonna stop me doing that, period. Mentally I don't know if I can handle this, that's, that's brother, his sister, you hear me

Karen: I hear you and it's like I can't handle it either

Vince: I know

Karen: I can't either

Vince: I know Karen

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Karen: I've had it

Vince: I'm sorry, Karen. I'm not asking you to stand up with me in this. I'm just telling you I didn't do it, okay.

Karen: I don't believe that you did. I don't believe that you did it.

Vince: I wasn't there when it happened Karen. I know nothing about it.

Karen: And I believe that too, but there it is, Vince, DNA.

Vince: Well there it is Karen. God allowed all this to happen for a reason. We'll find out what it is down the road, won't we.

Karen: Yes, yes

Vince: Okay

Karen: Yes we will. At this point it's up to you to call them, if you, if you want to and if not, then they'll just be on their way and who knows what's up next, other than you'll be back in Michigan facing it.

Vince: Looks like I'm gonna end up going to Michigan anyways Karen

Karen: Right I know that. I know that.

Vince: Regardless of whether I talk to them or not, why not have a lawyer present when I do talk to them.

Karen: Right, right

Vince: That's only common sense to me.

Karen: Yeah, yeah

Vince: You know, Karen, they're not, anyways, let's just forget about all that, okay, alright. Let's just, I'm not even worried about that, okay. I, I'm not saying I'm not worried about that, my God, but I mean I'll deal with it, okay

Karen: Yeah, you will have to. You will have to deal with it.

Vince: Yes I will

Karen: And they, they've asked me to call them back and let them know if you plan to call them or not.

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Vince: Well I don't think so Karen, not unless they wanna bring a lawyer along

Karen: Okay

Vince: Okay

Karen: Okay

Vince: I don't wanna be in front of them again without a lawyer next to me, period.

Karen: Did you see Williams?

Vince: Who, what's that

Karen: Did Williams come in to see you?

Vince: He wasn't even here Karen

Karen: Okay

Vince: As far as I know

Karen: Okay

Vince: It's the other one and this woman and the special prosecutor that they're talking about.

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: And as far as when they're gonna extradite me back, I have no idea, you know

Karen: They didn't know either. They didn't know either, other than arrangements were gonna be made to send you back.

Vince: Right, Alright, well I love you kiddo. I won't be calling you. I won't be kicking your bills up and all that crap, there ain't no reason in it, and I don't have pen and paper to write you with. I don't know if they'll give me any here. I'll ask them, but, ah, I love you and keep you safe

Karen: Vince you know we love you

Vince: I know that

Karen: We know we love you and, um

Vince: I know that. Both of you Craig I love you. I love both you guys.

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Craig: Yeah, we, we love you too Vince.

Vince: You know

Karen: I just had to say Vince that I'm done.

You have one minute left

Vince: I understand

Karen: My health has just started to go down again

Vince: Don't, don't let it happen girl, okay

Karen: I'm not, I can't

Vince: Okay, I love you girl

Karen: And I've got money on here, you know, for a few more calls

Vince: Well I don't, I won't call unless something really major comes up, okay. I don't know if I can call

Karen: Okay

Vince: Michigan or not when I get there. I might be able to. I don't even know where they're gonna send me to so

Karen: Yeah

Vince: If I'll go to Corrections if I'll go to the county jail, I don't know where I'll be, but

Karen: Okay

Vince: I love you guys

Karen: Well we all know God's with you Vince

Vince: Hey, yeah, tell my brothers to pray for me too, Steve and Craig

Karen: I will do that

Vince: Alright

Karen: And they are

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Vince: And give Naomi a big hug

Karen: I'll do that Vince

Vince: Love you

Karen: I'll do that honey, alright

Vince: Love you

Karen: God Bless You, bye, bye

Craig: Bye Vince

The caller has hung up.

CALL #2

Hello this is a collect call from

Vince: Vince

An inmate at the Butte Silver Bow County Jail. This call is subject to recording and monitoring. To accept charges press 1, to refuse charge, thank you for using Evercom. You may start the conversation now.

Karen: Hi honey

Vince: Hi. How are you?

Karen: Hi, I'm okay.

Vince: Are you

Karen: Yeah

Vince: (Unclear) last time

Karen: Yeah, I've been, yeah, thinking of you a lot of course and missing you actually

Vince: Me too. I'm missing you Karen, you know that

Karen: Yeah

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Vince: I'm writing Steve a letter right now, just sat down to do that

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: (Unclear)

Karen: How you feeling, it's where

Vince: Better physically, better physically

Karen: Uh huh, go ahead

Vince: Mentally I'm stressed out of course

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Had a lot of battles going on with that and don't know what to do about certain things, but I guess I'll just find out when I get to Michigan, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: So much hanging (unclear)

Karen: Anything new that you're hearing

Vince: No, em em. Haven't spoke to anybody

Karen: It's the waiting

Vince: Yeah, yeah. As far as that goes there's no time limit they have where they have to come get me, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I signed a waiver for extradition before I allowed out of prison in Michigan, so that gives them the right to keep me here for indefinitely, huh, you know, just

Karen: Which is so crazy, they seemed so urgent, huh

Vince: Some, yeah, it gives, it lets my mind run wild too and I'm thinking well they're there, ah, knowing what they're going to do, having all this time to do what they want to do with evidence or whatever they're doing, you know

Karen: Yeah, prepare

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Vince: Prepare and here I am, don't have even a clue of what the charge is gonna be, if there is a charge, you know, or what I need to do to prepare for myself, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: And that's kind of a mental game that I'm playing with myself. I just don't know, so I, actually I have taken it upon myself to write a bunch of stuff down that I think may, may be, you know who knows, I don't know. I don't know if I'll need it, but you know, just different things, you know. What, do you know what Stephanie's date of birth is. This is something

Karen: Stephanie Marie

Vince: Stephanie, yeah

Karen: It's past, it was in March

Vince: Well how

Karen: Huh

Vince: I'm talking about how old is she, her actually, when was she born

Karen: Oh, oh, I think she's 35

Vince: So

Karen: 73 she was born

Vince: 73 and that was in April, right, or, or

Karen: March, March of 73

Vince: Okay. Just wondering

Karen: That would make her 36

Vince: Cause that's something that, that, when she was, she was less than a year old and that's when I talked to Bonnie about Chris Bush

Karen: Oh, uh huh

Vince: Yeah

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: She was living in that garage over there on Addison(?) Road. And it's just something I just wanted to get in my mind straight of what year that I brought this to the, you know, to the police

Karen: To the courts whatever

Vince: Yeah, exactly, exactly. And I wanted to get

Karen: Well all those papers are burned, we had them.

Vince: Oh no Karen, don't, you, yeah I wondered about that and I, I got to have faith that there's nothing in there we need for what I'm coming up against, you know

Karen: Yeah, well it's court record, so

Vince: Well, a lot of stuff wasn't in court record in there, but that's okay, I have a memory too, don't I, (laugh) a good one, alright

Karen: Yeah, yeah you do

Vince: So

Karen: You do

Vince: I don't remember dates, but I can remember things that happened, so anyway

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I love your letter and love to hear that everybody's kinda getting back into the swing of things and there, as far as school and

Karen: Yeah

Vince: And Rose playing basketball, that excites me to hear that

Karen: Yeah, a little bit she has been, yeah

Vince: Yeah

Karen: She's home sick today, but

Vince: Is she, give her my love will you

Karen: I will honey

Vince: Thanks

Karen: I will

Vince: Has everything been okay with the family as far, as far as Ellen goes

Karen: Yeah, she's, um, still going forward with the surgery on the 7th

Vince: Doctor (unclear)

Karen: She's been working just about, you know, as far as I know every day

Vince: Wow

Karen: For several weeks now and, um

Vince: She's going go through with it the 7th, is that, where's that gonna be at

Karen: In Ann Arbor

Vince: Yeah, okay

Karen: Yeah

Vince: And this is to remove the pancreas

Karen: As far as I know that's what they'll be doing

Vince: Uh huh

Karen: I don't know if anything else will be, um, worked on at all at this, you know I don't know

Vince: Right

Karen: She just had another, you know, long visit with the doctor, so

Vince: Okay

Karen: I haven't talked with her or learned anything

Vince: Uh huh

Karen: But, anyway, yeah

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Vince: Alright, well I, I wrote, I wrote a little letter. I don't know if she's let, let you know that, but it wasn't real descriptive or anything, just let her know that I am on my way back there and got a battle ahead of me and, you know

Karen: Yeah I have talked with her. She knew, a couple weeks back, yeah

Vince: Yeah

Karen: And, um, yeah

Vince: So you

Karen: I've been wondering. I haven't received a letter from you for a few days and just wondering if you were still there and

Vince: Yeah, alright. You know something Karen, if, if you write me again any time soon here, can you send me some blank envelopes with stamps on them, postage

Karen: If they'll let you receive it

Vince: They do, they do. My bunkee got ten of them yesterday in the mail

Karen: Okay

Vince: His wife just sent them, oh I got a real good bunkee too, I told you, well I didn't tell you, but yeah, real good, so

Karen: You mentioned it, yeah

Vince: Yeah

Karen: And I was wondering if you still had him and

Vince: Oh yeah, yeah, he's here for 30 days and he just

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: He's been here a week and so, he's got four kids, wow

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I mean for 24, 25 years old, but he's a smart kid and real respectful

Karen: So you haven't heard a work back from any of these lawyers, this lawyer you wrote

Vince: No I haven't

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: And, ah, I kinda don't think, I wonder if he even would, you know. Ah, I wrote Paul a letter and asked him if he would, um, call him and, ah, just give him that same number you gave me

Karen: Yeah

Vince: For Jeff Feiger

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: And just ask him if he'd call him and see if he received the letter and if he's even considering it and, ah, you know, I gave Paul permission to go ahead and, and talk to him, actually about what, if there's information he needs to even consider it that Paul knows about

Karen: Yeah

Vince: And I think he does, Paul knows pretty much what, what's going on back there, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: And then I also, I mean in that letter Karen, I also asked him if he flat out can't do it could he give me any kind of referrals to other good lawyers, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: That may be, that may be interested in taking it, but ah

Karen: Yeah. Well God knows

Vince: Yeah, exactly

Karen: Yeah

Vince: But being that it's a high profile case, I would think that some of these (unclear) that's something that they look for, you know, to keep their name in the media or whatever

Karen: Exactly, exactly

Vince: Get free advertisement out of it

Karen: Yeah

Vince: So, not knowing what's going on back there, you know, that, that they haven't charged me for that I have obli, you know, and that's a big concern of mine Karen, that they don't even charge me when I get back, that they play the same game they played with me last time, you know

Karen: Well I don't understand, if they don't charge you

Vince: Right and I don't either, but I mean they wanted me so badly to sit here and talk to them here and I'm like I'm not talking to you people. They couldn't get over, Karen, the fact that I wouldn't speak to them. Callahan, the lady and the other guy and the special prosecutor. when they read me my rights, this prosecutor was standing in the door, just walked into the off, into this room and as soon as they said, you know, you have a right to a lawyer, I, you know, I said that is what I want is a lawyer and he had to leave, the prosecutor, he had to leave that room.

Karen: And did he

Vince: Yes

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: He made it sound like oh I need to go get something, but he never came back in the room, but I know, I know that's the reason why he didn't come in is because I requested a lawyer

Karen: Uh huh, uh huh

Vince: And the cops stayed there and they tried to continue on and continue on and continue on and got stupid in there, I mean, you know

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: Put my foot down about that

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: Didn't want to hear anything they had to say. Say it

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Say it to me when you get a lawyer beside me, that's what I was telling them

Karen: Yeah

Vince: You know, whatever

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Karen: Yeah

Vince: Whatever you have

Karen: And the, the word from them is I suppose that, you know, they can't provide a lawyer until you're charged with something

Vince: Exactly, exactly and I'm, I'm that's the same thing we went through last time

Karen: Yes it is

Vince: So you know, if they think I'm gonna change my mind about a lawyer, they're nuts.

Karen: It, it's really odd that they came all the way out here

Vince: Oh, I know that, Karen

Karen: Yes

Vince: You think I don't realize that

Karen: Yes, just to talk with you

Vince: Exactly

Karen: And on the, on the thought that you might talk with them

Vince: Exactly, exactly. Oh he told me that he had been watching me every since I'd been released, that he'd been keeping

Karen: In what way

Vince: Real close tables on me, ah, the

Karen: Oh

Vince: You know the officer

Karen: With, with, in what way

Vince: In Dillon, back in Dillon. I mean he, he rattled off, you know, that, ah, you know, he, he is aware of me getting arrested down there and, and you know that I had a job, he knew everything, okay

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: Whether it was through Clarice(?) or whoever I don't know

Karen: I would suppose

Vince: Sure. So anyway that's, ah, you know, that's what that was all about, you know, just like, big deal, you know. Um, but I don't think that, you know, Michigan would extradite me back over being a ten minute late curfew without them pressuring them about it.

Karen: Yeah, right

Vince: So, you know, this is, this is obvious to me that, you know, it's pretty much going back into the same thing I just left, as far as the DOC side and what they want

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: Being uncooperative or whatever

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: So, hopefully (unclear) the lawyer

Karen: Yeah, the waiting game

Vince: Yeah, yeah, but, you know, I, I asked Puma, ah, I wrote him a letter last week

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Asked him to check with some legal guys there and

Karen: Yeah

Vince: In the legal system up there where he's at, just finding out different things, you know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Questions about different avenues I have and rights I have, um, whether the ALCU could get involved in this even, if, if, you know it's, if it's the same thing I was up against when I left about me being uncooperative. Can I get a lawyer involved in it because, you know, I don't know

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Just a lot of what ifs

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Karen: Yeah

Vince: You know and, ah

Karen: Well one, one thought that's come to my mind, I don't know if I told you is that, um, the potential, those guys you ran into in prison that you overheard them talking about

Vince: Uh huh

Karen: Chris Bush I guess

Vince: Yeah, yeah

Karen: That one of them

Vince: Thinking maybe, maybe

Karen: Maybe one of them has, didn't one of them have some kind of connection with it.

Vince: Yes, yes

Karen: Not talking or something and

Vince: Uh huh

Karen: And, um, therefore he was being held

Vince: Yeah, yeah

Karen: Just, just wondering, you know

Vince: Yeah, sure, there's a lot of things out there. A lot of them what ifs like you're talking about, you know, yeah

Karen: Yeah

Vince: I just, I just wanna let you know I wrote down a long list of things and I'm asking Paul, I don't know if he'll do it or not, but I'm I, you know, I asked him to get on the computer, if he will, and look up some people, possible witnesses and just have that ready in case, I mean, I know if I got a lawyer Karen down there in Michigan they're gonna do this anyway, they would do it, you know what I'm saying. I'm not asking

Karen: Yeah

Vince: Paul to contact these people. I'm just saying in case I need these people or, or whatever, as witnesses, and I'm talking Brent and Scott Bush definitely, huh, definitely

Karen: Uh huh

Vince: I want them on my side. I need them on my side and their parents if they're alive.

Karen: Right

Vince: And I have no idea

Karen: You know, honey, to be honest with you I wouldn't count on Paul for anything

Vince: Really
