Good Morning,

Knowing that this is our best witness to date I took another good look at this memo and wanted to share some thoughts.

- Assuming the OCP has seen this witness statement why isn't she and investigators focusing on this vehicle a 1972 Pontiac Lemans (do we know the color?) instead of or in addition to the recently reported 1973 red Pontiac Bonneville which may or may not be involved because the margin of error in MtDNA? We know that the 1972 Pontiac Lemans was definitely involved due to the snow bank impression of the bumper left at the previous crime scene. The 1973 Bonneville's involvement is possible but not for sure.
- I have a hard time believing that Agents and or the police were unable to track down the license plate even in the pre computers days. That had to be a pretty rare plate with three twos in it. I am assuming that it was a Michigan plate as the sequence is typically three letters and three numbers. Other states have different patterns.
- If the OCP has gone public with the hairs and Bonneville info why not go public with the sketches that were put together from Wilson's description? **Does the media know about Wilson's memo???? A media release would box them in and they would have to follow this lead.**
- I would certainly request a FOIA on the FBI case file that would include the interviews with Wilson as well as the sketches. I don't know the criteria for the release? Cathy please advise.
- The younger of the two suspects the 25 to 30 years old male with shoulder length hair had to be familiar with area otherwise people and retail workers would have been suspicious of his presence. **The older male suspect stayed in the car because he would have stood out.** Was the younger suspect a smoker? Remember [redacted] said that the creep who approached him had Pall Malls pack in the vehicle.
- My guess is Timmy may have seen this guy before. Maybe the guy skateboarded also so Timmy may not have been totally uncomfortable? How did this guy get Timmy close enough to the Lemans? Timmy must have recognized or known him to move close enough to the car so they could grab him. I still find it very odd that Timmy's skateboard was left at the recovery crime scene. A profiler's input may help. Was a profiler ever involved? This would be a good question for Law enforcement/the FBI. I can't think of a better situation to use a profiler.
- I have suggested this before and remain convinced that the abductors were already at the HM Pharmacy/Kroger complex. Wilson's memo seems to support this theory. If the 25 to 30 year old was already there someone had to know him or recognize him.
- This memo from Wilson is superior to the recent info released by the OCP. Why hasn't this hit the paper. Maybe it should?
