WASHINGTON — (UPI) — The federal government paroled Watergate burglar E. Howard Hunt Wednesday but refused to release convicted windler Billie Sol Estes from parole status.

The Hunt decision means that former White House Aide John Ehrlichman and G. Gordon Liddy, who helped Hunt plan the Watergate burglary, will be the only Watergate figures behind bars.

Ferndale Boy Found Safe; Spent Two Nights in Mall

Robert Wayno was so certain that his 12-year-old runaway son, Mark, was dead Wednesday morning that he was already talking about seeking vengeance.

But Wayno's 36-hour vigil came to a happy end a short time later when Mark was found by Royal Oak police, hungry but unharmed, riding a bicycle along the I-75 freeway.

"I'm breathing again after two days," Wayno said after he and his ex-wife, Dolores, were reunited with their son at Ferndale police headquarters. "I'd given up hope of seeing him alive again."

Wayno had just finished voicing his despair around 12:30 p.m. Wednesday when his 16-

year-old daughter, Donna, came bounding down the stairs of their wood frame house.

"It says on television they found Mark," Donna said breathlessly.

"Is he dead?" Wayno asked.

"No, he's alive," his daughter shouted.

Wayno raced upstairs to telephone Ferndale police, then leaned back in wordless relief as they confirmed the good news.

"I'm so relieved . . . I can breathe again," he said at length.

Mark, who ran away Monday night after spending the evening with some friends, had been the object of an intensive two-day search by worried Ferndale police.

They feared that his disappearance might
