Details of Disappearance

Griener left his home on the north side of Pekin, Illinois at approximately 4:00 p.m. He was intending to go to the snow sledding hill at the local park, four blocks away. Griener's friends last saw him at the hill at 5:30 p.m. He was carrying a blue plastic roll-up toboggan-style sled at the time of his disappearance. He has never been heard from again.

An extensive search of the local area turned up no sign of Griener. A skull found in Michigan was originally thought to be his, but it turned out not to be. Authorities believe Griener is deceased. One suspect in his case is William "Freight Train" Guatney, a mentally ill homeless man, who confessed to the murders of several children, including a nine-year-old boy who was abducted only 200 yards from where Griener was last seen. However, Griener disappeared during the winter, and Guatney's other suspected victims were all attacked during the warmer months. Guatney was committed to a mental institution after being found incompetent to stand trial for murder. He died in 1997. He was never charged in Griener's case. The child remains missing and his case is unsolved.

William "Freight Train" Guatney loved to ride the rails. For almost forty years he traveled the United States in box cars, living off the land and picking up odd jobs in towns where he was known as a "likeable hobo," described by his many friends as "the happy-go-lucky type." But Guatney also had a darker side.

At fifty-seven, he had seen America the hard way, and he hated being called a bum. "I'm two people," he once told a female acquaintance. "I can also be mean." In retrospect, friends noted that "He was a strong man when he got mad."

The special target of his anger -- and his lust -- appeared to be young boys. In August 1979, Guatney was arrested in Illinois, charged with three counts of murder on warrants issued from Kansas and Nebraska.

Homicide Investigators viewed the charges merely as a starting point, suggesting Guatney might have murdered fifteen children in the past five years alone. Nebraska charged him in the deaths of 13-yearold Jon Simpson and 12-year-old Jacob Surber, abducted from the state fair at Lincoln, in 1975.

Both were discovered days later, and Guatney was arraigned on August 22, 1979, refusing to enter a plea. The Kansas charge involved Jack Hanrahan, a 12-year-old who disappeared from his Topeka neighborhood on May 20, 1979.

Molested and murdered, his corpse was found in a creek bed ten days later; on August 20, Guatney was charged with first-degree murder, kidnapping and sodomy. At least two victims were suspected by police in Illinois, where 9-year-old Mark Helmig was murdered at Pekin, in 1976, and Marty Lancaster, 14, was killed at Normal two years later.

The authorities considered Guatney a suspect in the deaths of at least ten other boys, scattered throughout the Southwest.





Cold Case Questions

It took a decade for a break in the JonBenet Ramsey case before an arrest was made. Law officers in the heartland know what it's like waiting for those kinds of breaks in a case gone cold.

One former Douglas County deputy has been waiting for three

Tim Dempsey can't help but gaze out onto the Elkhorn River and think back nearly 30 years. At the time, as a county deputy, Dempsey was assigned to find missing 11-year-old Jay Dumil who was last seen playing by the Elkhorn.

Durnil's body turned up 10 days later in the Missouri River. His hands were tied and his skull was fractured. His murder remains unsolved.

Dempsey says, "You'll think back on those cases and wonder if I could have done something different or could we have done something different."

Dempsey, now the police chief in Elkhorn, says he believes William "Freight Train" Guatney was responsible. Guatney was suspected in a string of killings throughout the Midwest.

Dempsey says, "We were under the impression and had a pretty good idea of who killed the young Jay Durnil but 30 years have past and since, that person has passed away.

Demosey says there was never enough evidence to charge Guatney but up until his death Demosey hoped for a confession much like what investigators received this week in the JonBenet Ramsey case.

Dempsey knows now he'll never get that but he refuses to give-up.

"The bottom line is I will never forget that case because it was a child case and those cases you just don't forget," he says.

Investigators in the Ramsey case say their suspect, John Karr, appears to know details about the murder of JonBenet that were never made public. That's one of the reasons he's been arrested.

Tim Dempsey says withholding details from the public is a common tactic. He says he's still holding back details about Durnil's murder just in case.



Feds bust Devil's Disciples biker club, indict 41

BY ROBERT SNELL / THE DETROIT NEWS

Detroit—Federal prosecutors on Friday indicted the national president of the Devil's Diciples Motorcycle Club and 40 associates in a major crackdown on organized crime.

Those charged include National President Jeff Garvin Smith and National Vice President Paul Anthony Darrah for allegedly being involved in violent crime, racketeering, drug trafficking, firearms crimes, obstruction of justice and illegal gambling.

Investigators arrested 31 people Friday in Michigan and Alabama. Five others already were in custody.

Investigators also seized more than 60 weapons and more than 6,000 rounds of ammunition and toppled eight methamphetamine labs.

Eighteen people are charged with violating the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) Act by conducting an illegal enterprise. The enterprise included murder, robbery, extortion, drug trafficking, obstruction of justice and other crimes, prosecutors said.

"For years, according to the indictment, the Devil's Diciples have spread fear in cities throughout Michigan and around the country," said Assistant Attorney General Lanny Breuer. "This violent criminal enterprise allegedly profits from drug trafficking and illegal gambling, and uses intimidation and violence to silence its adversaries and maintain control over its members. Today's arrests of the Devil's Diciples' top leaders and 39 of the gang's members and associates are an important step in our efforts to dismantle violent criminal enterprises across the country."2:

The motorcycle club — which intentionally misspells its name — was based in Clinton Township and operated regional chapters in Michigan, Alabama, Arizona, California, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and beyond, prosecutors said.

Members distributed drugs, stole and sold motorcycles, ran illegal gambling dens, robbed and extorted people and committed violent acts, prosecutors said.

It is the second major crackdown on motorcycle clubs in recent years.

In 2009, a 74-defendant racketeering indictment was unsealed against members of the Highwaymen Motorcycle Club. The case — one of the largest ever conducted in the eastern district of Michigan eventually included indictments against more than 90 alleged members on charges including racketeering, conspiracy to commit murder, drug dealing and assault.

Several people have been convicted so far in the Highwaymen case.

The Devil's Diciples indictment comes more than three years after Smith was originally charged with drug trafficking and other crimes alongside 17 other members and associates.





Sources told Rescue 4 reporter Karen Drew that Michigan detectives will head Indiana in the next few weeks.



I have spent most of the afternoon/early evening researching the name "Ed Ross" (Lexis research and ran CCH inquiries on a wide range of ages using the name of "Edward Ross", specifically searching for someone by that name who may have been charged for a CSC in Oakland County in/around 1982, since 1982 was the year mentioned by Brian Lucas that "Ed Ross" arrived in the OCJ purportedly on a CSC possibly involving a minor from the Pontiac area, a crime for which "Edward Ross" allegedly served a 30 year prison sentence). So far (still doing research) the "Edward Ross" that jumps out is EDWARD RAY ROSS, W/M, DOB of (would have been 51 years old in 1982), SID # MDOC #172965, FBI #

HOWEVER, what appears inconsistent with the

information provided by Mr. Lucas is that this particular "Edward Ross" appears to have DIED IN PRISON IN 2008. Mr. Lucas indicated that Ross "ended up doing 30 years in the joint" and has been out of prison for "at least a few years now so you won't find him in MDOC's OTIS website". Lucas indicated that we should attempt to locate/interview Ed Ross "if he's still alive". Obviously, if this particular "Edward Ross" died in prison in 2008, he is not the person communicating under the name of "Bob". I will continue research in an attempt to identify other possible "Ed Ross" names that generally match the criteria information provided by Brian Lucas. I will obtain a copy of the Oakland County Circuit Court File #1982-53518-FY as soon as possible. I will also contact Macomb County in an attempt to obtain a copy of their 1967 "Incest With Minor" Case (Macomb County Sheriff's Department OCA 22232). I will contact Gary tomorrow to determine if we can obtain OCJ booking arrest photo pertaining to Ross' 1982 CSC arrest in Pontiac. Since we have no OCCK "Tip File" on "Ed/Edward Ross", would you like for someone from the Task Force to contact Ray Anger (who it would appear is the "retired Berkley Detective" who Brian Lucas claims to have provided the info on "Ed Ross" to "about 10 years ago") to determine if he has any recollection.

Sheriff: I saw the story in the Freep about the lawyer suing your department. I sent him the following email. I felt you should know of this information as well:

Paul, you need to track down and talk to a man named Ed Ross. He's originally from the Pontiac area. I was in the Oakland County Jail with him back in 1982. When he came onto our rock, he told everyone his name was "Bob" because he was in there for sexually molesting his step daughter. He didn't want anyone to know his real name, because everyone who's in there for what he did is a target. Other inmates don't like "baby rapers". (He ended up doing about 30 years in the joint for his crime. He's been out for at least a few years now, so you won't find him on MDOC's OTIS web site. They purge anyone who's been discharged for at least three years.)

But I remember one night in OCJ (there were ten of us that locked in single man cells) a few of us, including "Bob" (Ross), were talking about famous heinous crimes, and who/what we knew associated with them, when he happened to say, "Would you believe I know who the Oakland County Child Killer is?" I believe he also asked, "Would you believe he's a preacher?" (I can't remember how we answered him.) It is noteworthy, though, that Ross knew a lot of Biblical scripture and often talked about God and the Bible.

Paul, I've been a good judge of character and a student of human nature my entire life. For thirty years, I've always felt that Ross was telling the truth. He did know. And he does know, I believe, if he's still alive.

Back in 1996, when I was working for WDIV-TV, I sent him a letter while he was in prison. I wanted to follow up on it (as well as possibly get a huge exclusive for our station if it came to anything). But he sent me a letter back, saying he didn't remember the conversation, and even if he did, he wouldn't say anything to me for fear of other inmates labeling him a "snitch".

I gave all this information to a Berkley detective about 10 years ago (he's now retired) but I always had the feeling the detective was too easy to dismiss the info (probably because of the letter from prison I received from Ross) and never followed up on it. The bottom line is:

Anyone who is serious about solving these cases needs to find Ross and have a chat with him and dig far into his background. Ross was an idiot when he was first locked up because he didn't know to keep his mouth shut. (And I believe he got his ass kicked, which prompted the Oakland County Jail to move him onto a more secure rock.) But I never got the impression he was a liar. And, in all humility, I'm pretty good at detecting lies...always have been. Hope this helps.

OAKLAND COUNTY CHILD KILLER CASE

INFORMATION:

During the ongoing investigation into the Oakland County Child Killer case, there have been literally thousands of investigative tips, names, tidbits of information, along with countless theories which have come to the attention of law-enforcement. One tip in particular was generated in 1991 by an individual by the name of Helen Dagner. Dagner at the time, resided in the Alpena Michigan area. Dagner claimed to know the actual identity of the Child Killer and even went further by claiming she had actually received a confession from Hastings during numerous meeting she had with him at a local Big Boy Restaurant in Alpena.

Birmingham assistance police Chief, Donald Studt, a detective back in 1991, conducted a thorough investigation of Mr. Hastings and eventually cleared him as a suspect in the child murders. (SEE INVESTIGATIVE FILE ON HASTINGS, IN THE OCCK CASE FILE ROOM.)

When the case was re-activated in 2005, detectives Gray and Robertson had numerous conversations with Helen Dagner regarding "HER" suspect, Hastings and her repeated claims that he had in fact confessed to her that he killed the children. Not only did Ms Dagner purport this information to Studt during his original investigation, she has also developed a web site, "helendagner.com, where she continues to profess John Hastings guilt in the child killer investigation. Ms. Dagner has also posted a slurry of inaccurate case information.

Approximately one year ago, Detective Sergeant David Robertson assisted the Georgia Department of Investigations, (GBI), with a case which involved the State of Michigan and required followup. Detectives Gray and Robertson, now aware that John Hastings is currently residing in the state of Georgia, Atlanta area, decided to send a request from the GBI, to contact Johns Hastings and request a DNA sample for comparison to the the OCCK case and evidence contained with this investigation. By obtaining Hasting's DNA, this would either clear him further if it comes back negative, or would give credence and merit to Dagner's claims that his DNA should have been checked years ago which would have closed the case.

SYNOPSIS OF INTERVIEW:

Tipster, Helen Dagner purported in supplemental report #41 of investigation 21-1854-08, when she had interviews with John Hastings back in 1991. During these interviews, John indicated he knew a subject who committed suicide on 11-20-1978, (AKA) Christopher Busch. John Hastings advised that he has never heard of this person. Mr. Hastings was thoroughly questioned regarding any knowledge of Christopher Busch, his residence location on Morningview Terrace in Birmingham, or any other individuals involved in the Busch/Greene investigation. Mr. Hastings steadfastly maintained he had never heard of anyone involved with anything to do with Busch nor Greene.

John Hastings did go into some details about his involvement years ago with Dagner and how she was completely fixated on him being involved in the Child Killing case.

After interviewing John Hastings in Atlanta Georgia, the next day, August 11th, the officer drove to Russellville Alabama to interview Douglas Bennett. Bennett came to the attention of the task force during an interview with retired Flint Police Detective Tom Waldron. During the interview with Waldron regarding his CSC cased he investigated and eventually prosecuted both Christopher Busch and Gregory Greene back in 1977, the name of Douglas Bennett came up. Waldron advised that Bennett was an associate of Greene and Busch and was prosecuted on the same cases as they were. Bennett advised that he had never met Christopher Busch and only met Gregory Greene while he was incarcerated. He first met Greene while in the Genesee County Jail and later in Jackson Prison. Bennett steadfastly denied ever knowing Greene on the outside of jail, and never met Christopher Busch.

Bennett did admit to knowing of Chris Busch, but it was only through conversations he had while in jail with Greg Greene. Bennett said that Greene was extremely upset that he got life in prison for the same offenses that Christopher Busch only got probation. In addition, Bennett stated at no time whatsoever during any of the conversations he had with Greene, did Greene ever implicate Chris Busch in anything other than molestations. He never knew of Busch to be a violent person, Busch never admitted to him that he ever hurt anyone, much less kill them, and has never heard of Busch being implicated or accused of being a child murderer.

The Bennett recording will not be transcribed due to no credible substantiative information being gleaned.

Approximately 1 year ago, my partner assisted the Georgia Bureau of Investigations, (GBI) with an investigation which led them to the State of Michigan. They requested we assist them and conduct some followup interviews in Michigan. After completing our assist to them, the GBI agent told us if there was ever anything they could do for us in return, they would be more than willing. Immediately I thought to myself of the person you've spoken of all these years who now resides in GA. A formal request, in writing, was then sent to the GBI, asking if they would be willing to contact him and ask for a voluntary sample of his DNA. "Buccal Swab".

GBI agreed to assist us, and on Feb 1, 2008, contact was made with this subject. He voluntarily signed a walver of Constitutional Rights to a Search Warrant and voluntarily provided two buccal swabs of his DNA. He was very gracious/cooperative and willing to assist Michigan authorities with our case. (The OCCK Investigation).

I am requesting your assistance in obtaining a Buccal Swab of a subject who was last known to reside in the Atlanta area. The subject is a "Person of Interest" in a cold case homicide dating back to the late 1970's. The case is known as "The Oakland County Child Killer" case.

The below listed subject was brought to our attention by a person who believes he is involved. Although he was investigated and cleared during the original investigation, we feel that obtaining his DNA would finally eliminate him in our eyes, and hopefully in the eyes of the tipster Helen Dagner. (www.Helendagner.com)

We would like your Department to contact Mr. Hastings and obtain a voluntary Buccal Swab from him. At present we do not have enough evidence to obtain any type of Search warrant, and do not expect to. If, however he refuses, perhaps another type of sample can be obtained and shipped to us for analysis.

A brief synopsis of the case is; During the winter months of 1976 and 1977, four young children were abducted and later found deceased along side roadways in Oakland and Wayne Counties. The case involved two females and two males. Signs of sexual abuse were found on the male victims, but due to other indicators, all the cases "appear" to be connected. Also, Dagner was a police officer with Roger City. A police report regarding his suicide would be great, if available. I'd also like to know why he committed suicide if possible. Also if there are any old timers still around who worked with or knew Dagner that you can interview as to the type of person he was. I have a lot of unanswered questions which may eventually lead us to the Alpena area in my current investigation.

Basically, I'd like to know as much as possible about Dagner. The death certificate indicated that he was divorced. His ex-wife's name is Helen Dagner. I know a lot of information about her.

Please call me for some additional info.

Thanks, Please keep this request on the Q.T. and don't share it with many. If anyone asks why you're looking into Dagner, just say it's an old case you're looking into for someone down-state and just leave it at that.

Section 4(1) and (3) of the FOIA, MCL 15.234(1) and (3), permits a public body to charge a fee to search for and retrieve records responsive to a request and for the examination and review of the records to determine applicable statutory exemptions from disclosure; and to charge for copying and mailing costs. Section 4(2) of the Act, MCL 15.243(2), permits a public body to require a good falth deposit of half the estimated total fee.

The Michigan Department of State Police's (MSP) fee notice (copy attached) Indicated that it contains an estimate of costs to process the FOIA request. This is a good faith estimate, and, depending on the final total amount of records and labor associated with your request, the final total fee may exceed the estimate.

MSP has determined that, based on the description of records in your FOIA request, the MSP. Freedom of information Unit must retrieve a voluminous number of records for review and examination.

MSP tentatively has determined that the following records may fall within the scope of your request:

• 243,760 pages contained in 25, 26" filing cabinet drawers.

104,000 pages contained in 26, 16" boxes.

51,562 pages contained in 76 large binders.

SYNOPSIS OF INTERVIEW:

Tipster, Helen Dagner purported in supplemental report #41 of investigation 21-1854-08, when she had interviews with John Hastings back in 1991. During these interviews, John indicated he knew a subject who committed suicide on 11-20-1978, (AKA) Christopher Busch. John Hastings advised that he has never heard of this person. Mr. Hastings was thoroughly questioned regarding any knowledge of Christopher Busch, his residence location on Morningview Terrace in Birmingham, or any other individuals involved in the Busch/Greene investigation. Mr. Hastings steadfastly maintained he had never heard of anyone involved with anything to do with Busch nor Greene.

John Hastings did go into some details about his involvement years ago with Dagner and how she was completely fixated on him being involved in the Child Killing case.

At the end of the interview, John Hastings was asked if he would be will to support his information that he not only had nothing to do with the Oakland County Child Killing investigation but also that he wasn't holding back any information that was discussed this date about the case and Christopher Busch. John stated that he would have no problems whatsoever in taking a polygraph test, to yet prove again that he had absolutely nothing to do with anything involved with this investigation.

Upon return to the MSP Metro North Post, the undersigned met with Lt. Robert Dykstra of the MSP polygraph unit to schedule Hastings with a poligrapher located in Atlanta Georgia.

After interviewing John Hastings in Atlanta Georgia, the next day, August 11th, the officer drove to Russellville Alabama to interview Douglas Bennett. Bennett came to the attention of the task force during an interview with retired Flint Police Detective Tom Waldron. During the interview with Waldron regarding his CSC cased he investigated and eventually prosecuted both Christopher Busch and Gregory Greene back in 1977, the name of Douglas Bennett came up. Waldron advised that Bennett was an associate of Greene and Busch and was prosecuted on the same cases as they were. Waldron advised that he firmly believed Bennett ran with Busch and Greene back in the day and may hold some pertinent information.

SYNOPSIS OF BENNETT INTERVIEW:

Bennett advised that he had never met Christopher Busch and only met Gregory Greene while he was incarcerated. He first met Greene while in the Genesee County Jail and later in Jackson Prison. Bennett steadfastly denied ever knowing Greene on the outside of jail, and never met Christopher Busch.

Bennett did admit to knowing of Chris Busch, but it was only through conversations he had while in jail with Greg Greene. Bennett said that Greene was extremely upset that he got life in prison for the same offenses that Christopher Busch only got probation. In addition, Bennett stated at no time whatsoever during any of the conversations he had with Greene, did Greene ever implicate Chris Busch in anything other than molestations. He never knew of Busch to be a violent person, Busch never admitted to him that he ever hurt anyone, much less kill them, and has never heard of Busch being implicated or accused of being a child murderer.

The Bennett recording will not be transcribed due to no credible substantiative information being gleaned.

LANDER was the landlord of the Indian Way address where HASTINGS lived until recently. LANDER was not able to provide the date HASTINGS moved from the Indian Way address. LANDER did state that a Ms. KING called to him as a reference. HASTINGS had recently applied to rent a room from her and LANDER was able give the phone number for Ms. KING, 770-263-0095.

On Tuesday, January 29, 2008, S/A STRICKLAND telephonically contacted Ms. KING. Due to the fact that Ms. KING was not willing to provide HASTINGS phone number, S/A STRICKLAND left a cell phone number with Ms. KING and advised her to have HASTINGS call as soon as possible. Subsequently, S/A STRICKLAND received a call from HASTINGS and he was provided with the details of the Michigan State Police request. INFORMATION:

During the ongoing investigation into the Oakland County Child Killer case, there have been literally thousands of investigative tips, names, tidbits of information, along with countless theories which have come to the attention of law- enforcement. One tip in particular was generated in 1991 by an individual by the name of Helen Dagner. Dagner at the time, resided in the Alpena Michigan area. Dagner claimed to know the actual identity of the Child Killer and even went further by claiming she had actually received a confession from Hastings during numerous meeting she had with him at a local Big Boy Restaurant in Alpena.

Birmingham assistance police Chief, Donald Studt, a detective back in 1991, conducted a thorough investigation of Mr. Hastings and eventually cleared him as a suspect in the child murders. (SEE INVESTIGATIVE FILE ON HASTINGS, IN THE OCCK CASE FILE ROOM.)

When the case was re-activated in 2005, detectives Gray and Robertson had numerous conversations with Helen Dagner regarding "HER" suspect, Hastings and her repeated claims that he had in fact confessed to her that he killed the children. Not only did Ms Dagner purport this information to Studt during his original investigation, she has also developed a web site, "helendagner.com, where she continues to profess John Hastings guilt in the child killer investigation. Ms. Dagner has also posted a slurry of inaccurate case information.

Approximately one year ago, Detective Sergeant David Robertson assisted the Georgia Department of Investigations, (GBI), with a case which involved the State of Michigan and required followup. Detectives Gray and Robertson, now aware that John Hastings is currently residing in the state of Georgia, Atlanta area, decided to send a request from the GBI, to contact Johns Hastings and request a DNA sample for comparison to the the OCCK case and evidence contained with this investigation. By obtaining Hasting's DNA, this would either clear him further if it comes back negative, or would give credence and merit to Dagner's claims that his DNA should have been checked years ago which would have closed the case.

Approximately 1 year ago, my partner assisted the Georgia Bureau of Investigations, (GBI) with an investigation which led them to the State of Michigan. They requested we assist them and conduct some followup interviews in Michigan. After completing our assist to them, the GBI agent told us if there was ever anything they could do for us in return, they would be more than willing. Immediately I thought to myself of the person you've spoken of all these years who now resides in GA. A format request, in writing, was then sent to the GBI, asking if they would be willing to contact him and ask for a voluntary sample of his DNA. "Buccal Swab".

GBI agreed to assist us, and on Feb 1, 2008, contact was made with this subject. He voluntarily signed a walver of Constitutional Rights to a Search Warrant and voluntarily provided two buccal swabs of his DNA. 

Known Victims

Mark Stebbins Ferndale, MI 12-years-old Held captive 4 days

Twelve-year-old Mark Stebbins was last seen at the Ferndale American Legion Hall just after noon on Sunday, February 15, 1976. He was homeward bound to watch a movie on television. The 4'8, 100 pound boy had reddish-blonde hair, blue eyes, and was wearing a blue hooded parka, blue jeans, red sweatshirt, and black rubber boots. His mother reported him missing when he hadn't come home by 11 p.m. Four days later, on February 19, Mark's lifeless body was found in Southfield, MI, by a businessman who was walking through the parking lot of a local shopping mall. One witness reported that when he walked his dog in the same area at 9:30 a.m., Mark's body was not present at the location. Cause of death was rule to be asphyxia due to smothering. Mark had sustained two lacerations on the back left side of his scalp, had discoloration on his wrists and ankles indicating he had been bound with rope (or similar type material), and had been sexually assaulted.

Jill Robinson

Royal Oak, MI 12-years-old Held captive 4 days

After having an argument with her mother, 12-year-old Jill Robinson of Royal Oak packed her denim backpack with some clothes and a blue and green plaid blanket and left home on her bicycle the evening of Wednesday, December 22, 1976. She was last seen wearing blue jeans, a shirt, a bright orange winter jacket, snow boots, and a blue knit cap with a yellow design on its border. Jill's body was found the day after Christmas placed along a snowy shoulder of Interstate 75 just north of 16 Mile Road, near Big Beaver, in Troy, MI. She had been placed on her back in plain sight of any possible passersby. Blood spatter evidence indicated that Jill had received a blast to the head from a 12-gauge shotgun as her body lay in the snow. She had not been sexually molested. Her bicycle was found the next day (December 27) by a neighborhood boy behind a Royal Oak business. It is uncertain if it was left there by Jill on the 22nd, or placed there by her killer sometime later.

Kristine Mihelich

Berkley, MI 10-years-old Held captive 19 days

Kristine Mihelich left home Sunday, January 02, 1977, at approximately 3 p.m. headed to the 7-11 Store on 12 Mile Road in Berkley. When the 10-year-old wasn't home by 6 p.m. her mother reported her missing. The clerk at the store remembered a girl matching Kristine's description buying a teen movie magazine. Though Detroit area television and radio stations broadcast details of Kristine's disappearance, and while investigators chased many tips from the public for two weeks, it appeared as though Kristine had vanished into thin air. However, on January 21, 1977, at approximately 11:45 a.m., a mail carrier found Kristine's discarded body near 13 Mile Road. It had been placed in plain sight in a snow-filled ditch alongside a dead-end road in Franklin Village, Mi. Upon examination, it was determined that Kristine's body had been at the site less than 24 hours. Just like Mark Stebbins, Kristine had been smothered. Authorities believe Kristine had been redressed by her killer, as her blouse had been tied in the front, and not in the back the way she normally did it. Likewise, her pants were tucked into her boots, which was also something that was out of character for Kristine. The autopsy physician did not find evidence of sexual molestation.

Timothy King

Birmingham, MI 11-years-old Held captive 6 days

Eleven-year-old Timothy King was last seen by his older sister the evening of Wednesday. March 16, 1977, as he left his Birmingham home. The sister was on her way out with friends, but gave Tim some money to spend on candy at a nearby store on Maple Road. When he left, he asked her to leave the door ajar so he could get back into the house. At approximately 9:00 his parents returned home, to find the door still ajar and the house empty. A saleswoman at the store he was headed towards reported seeing a boy matching his description the night Timothy disappeared. Another witness reportedly saw Tim at approximately 8:30 p.m. that same night while she was loading groceries into her car. She described a small boy talking to a man standing by a car a few parking spots away. The boy was wearing a red jacket with emblems on

it – which seemed to resemble Tim's Birmingham Hockey
Association jacket. The witness provided enough information to
create a composite sketch of the man, and describe the car -- a dark
blue Gremlin with a white "hockey stick" stripe on the side.

Timothy's body was discovered, fully dressed, six days after his disappearance on March 22, 1977, in a Livonia ditch off of Gill Road. He had been smothered to death 6 to 8 hours before his body was found; and had been placed in the ditch approximately 3 hours before discovery. He had been sexually assaulted and smothered. Autopsy results indicated that he had eaten a meal that included 'fowl' about an hour before he died. When found, Timothy's body was very clean, including his fingernails and toenails (which were usually dirty), and his wrists had marks as though he had been bound for a period of time.



The Suspects

Investigators have been trying for over 25 years to catch the Oakland County Child Killer, but the identity of this murderer remains a mystery. Some officials believe that the killer has either died, or is now in prison for other crimes.

A once primary suspect named David Norberg was thought by many to be the killer. He was first investigated in 1977 after an anonymous tip reached the Task Force saying he resembled the composit sketch of the killer. The tipster also indicated that Norberg owned a blue car similar to the Gremlin witnessed in the Timothy King case. However, in 1979 he was cleared as a suspect. In 1981 Norber passed away in a motor vehicle accident near Recluse, WY, he was 36. Eight years after his passing (1989), his wife (who originally provided an alibi for Norberg which was later recanted) contacted officials claiming to



Redophile allegedlyslinked to 77.0 aklands County slaying

For the last 33 years, Barry King and his family have sought to learn who killed his 11-year-old son in 1977, one of four children who were abducted and murdered in the mid-1970s in Oakland County.

For the past three years, King was convinced that he knew the answer.

And today, following the recent court-ordered release of 3,400 pages of investigative records compiled by the Michigan State Police, King says it is clear to him that Christopher Busch, a pedophile who was convicted four times of rape with a minor, was involved in the killing of Timothy King.

"I am now more convinced than ever," King said in an interview.

But the Michigan State Police, who head a task force investigation into the crimes, decline comment. They say the investigation is still active.

The documents were released as the result of a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit brought by the King family against the State Police. A judge ordered the agency to release the investigative files. The agency has billed the King family \$11,000 for the documents, though the court will ultimately decide what charges, if any, there will be.

The records reveal: Busch had been charged, and later convicted, four times in the first three months of 1977 with criminal sexual conduct with a minor in four counties: Oakland, Montmorency, Genesee and Midland. With each charge, Busch's father, H. Lee Busch (a prominent General Motors executive) posted cash bonds to free his son. One of his victims said Busch's mother drove to his Flint neighborhood in a limousine, offering him money if he agreed not to say anything to the police. Busch pleaded to a lesser charge and received probation in each of the four cases.

Other children molested by Busch and his companion Gregory Greene told the Oakland County Child Killings Task Force in 1977 that the two men would drive them around in their cars and would have them "lure kids closer to the car by talking to them." One victim said he had been choked unconscious while being molested.

This victim also said he recognized photos of Timothy as being the same boy seen with Busch. He said he saw a Polaroid photo of Timothy tied up in Busch's car.

In an Oakland County Child Killing Task Force interview about his pedophile activity, Busch is said to have listed the locations where he picked up and dropped off boys in the same chronological order that matched the abduction sites of the other three Oakland County children who were killed: Nine Mile and Woodward Avenue in Ferndale (the same location from which Mark Stebbins disappeared), 13 Mile and Woodward in Royal Oak (Jill Robinson was last seen near the Tiny Tim Hobby Center) and the 7-Eleven on 12 Mile in Berkley (where Kristine Mihelich went to purchase a teen magazine). Timothy had not yet been abducted.

On March 16, 1977, Timothy was kidnapped near a Birmingham drugstore and was found six days later alongside a road in Livonia. King said the records are proof that if Busch had been detained by police, his son might be alive today.

Busch questioned, released

Busch lived in Birmingham while the community was being terrorized by the rash of kidnappings and murders of the four children that began in February 1976 and ended with Timothy's death on March 22, 1977. Each child's body was clean, fully dressed and tossed by public roadsides. All were found in Oakland County except Timothy, who was found in Wayne County.

In late January 1977, Busch, then 27, was facing a rape charge in Flint and was questioned by Flint and task force investigators about the murder of Mark Stebbins, the first victim in the Oakland County child killings. According to the records, several investigators and then-Deputy Oakland County Prosecutor Dick Thompson thought Busch would be charged with the Stebbins murder, based on his criminal record and responses to

Community Policy Privacy Policy Terms of Service investigators. But after a lie detector test was administered by Michigan State Police examiner Ralph Cabot, Busch was released.

Six weeks later, Timothy was abducted and murdered.

Busch committed suicide in November 1978. The State Police records reveal evidence left at the suicide scene that might have linked Busch to the killings was never pursued by law enforcement. The evidence included ropes and ligatures found on the floor of his bedroom closet and a drawing closely resembling first victim Mark Stebbins that hung on his bedroom wall.

"I still think it is possible there was a cover-up," King said. "I also want to know why it took over 30 years for the Chris Busch lead to be uncovered."

Michigan State Police Capt. Harold Love said he has no comment on the release of the records, adding: "We continue to work the case and pursue all leads."

Reports reveal evidence

Part of the reason King and his children said they are suspicious of the investigation is because the family, not law enforcement, was responsible for bringing the Busch lead to light. Timothy's mother, Marion, died in 2004.

In 2006, former neighbor Patrick Coffey, a licensed polygrapher, called the Kings with information that Larry Wasser, a Southfield polygrapher, had confided to him that Busch had implicated himself in the child killings during a polygraph exam he conducted more than 30 years ago.

Armed with Busch's name, Detective Sgt. Cory Williams of the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and Detective Sgt. Garry Gray of the Michigan State Police examined the State Police records, conducted their own investigation and uncovered the circumstantial evidence tying him and Greene to the killings.

Other findings in the State Police report: A tip was called into the Montmorency Sheriff's Department while Busch was at his family cottage on Ess Lake near Hillman. A woman pleaded with police to go to the cottage, saying she had seen Busch — known to her as a pedophile out on bond — in town with minors. The call came on March 19, 1977, during the time Timothy was missing, which was between March 16 and March 22. There was no indication that law enforcement acted on the tip. Assume call material series with a Greene said the foot away. With killing four kds on the pass." Greene died in prison of a heart attack in 1995. He was 45.

In early 2008, Williams enlisted three independent polygraph examiners to re-examine the original polygraphs of Busch and Greene that led to Busch's

release in the Stebbins investigation. Their findings are blocked out in the documents the King family received.

In April 2008, in an interview with the FBI in New York City, Charles Busch, Christopher Busch's only living sibling, requested that as a condition for supplying his DNA, family members living in Michigan be allowed to enter a "witness protection-type program." He also said that later in his life, his father, H. Lee Busch, who died at age 90 in 2002, shredded all of the family documents, including birth certificates.

Prosecutor refuses to talk

In light of this evidence, King said he feels some vindication in his pursuit of information but failure in his pursuit of justice. He said he wants to meet with Oakland County Prosecutor Jessica Cooper, but she has refused to talk with him.

"The Michigan Constitution says that crime victims have a right to confer with the prosecutor," King said.

"I will feel like justice has been served when the Oakland County prosecutor explains to me why Busch is not guilty. I am sick and tired of a four-time convicted sexual pedophile being treated better than my family and the families of Mark Stebbins, Kristine Mihelich and Jill Robinson."

Cooper responded in an e-mail that she cannot comment because "there is an active, open and ongoing investigation that would be compromised by the release of any information regarding Christopher Busch."

The King family also filed a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit against the Oakland County prosecutor seeking its Busch-related files. Oakland County Circuit Judge Wendy Potts decided against the Kings, saying the prosecutor's information on Busch was "sensitive," and disclosure of the information could interfere with the investigation. However, the judge urged the prosecutor "to communicate as openly and freely as possible with Plaintiffs and other family members of the OCCK victims."

When asked if he felt the documents were worth \$11,000, King replied: "It was Tim's college money."

CSI London? Western students investigate cold cases

University of Western Ontario students who register for the Faculty of Information and Media Studies' course, The Serial Killer in the Media & Popular Culture, will get their chance to crack a case when classes start this fall.

The unusual assignment of solving a murder with basic police investigative techniques and skills is part of Mike Arntfield's class, a two-year-old course offered at the University of Western Ontario. Detective-Constable Arntfield is a full-time cop, a 12-year veteran on the city forces' vice unit, and part-time professor in London.'

The class has become extremely popular with students who want to try their hand at cracking decade-old cases from around North America.

Although the students have yet to crack a case, their work has drawn praise from some local police investigators.

"These students can bring enthusiasm, fresh eyes and imagination to these cases, most of which occurred even before they were born," said Det.-Const. Amtfield.

Students are divided into "squads" of five or six, mirroring police case-management methods. They then sift through archival news clippings to analyze unsolved serial killings, using modern technology such as social networking tools to find people and Google Maps to plot crime scenes.

"It's a matter of scrutinizing what has been done and identifying what else could be done, what's missing and what could be done better," Det.-Const. Amtfield said.

Det-Const. Arntfield admits that for many students who have grown up watching forensic TV dramas like CSI and Bones, the appeal may be "the guilty pleasure" of examining serial killers.

"That's fine. You can sign up for the gory details and macabre experience of it," he said... But the price of admission is that that natural interest is going to be retooled to serve the interest of justice."


The letter to the London Free Press was so well put together!

Unsolved murders remind us of community obligations

It was with great interest that I read Bente Jensen's column London's long unsolved murders need another look (Feb. 11). This was in part because she mentioned me and my investigative society at Western University.

Her brother Frankie's murder in the spring of 1968 occurred well before I was born, yet I, along with most others in my west London neighbourhood, remained well aware of its occurrence. It marked a very dark chapter in what was an otherwise sedate community. It became a fixture in the collective memory of most school children, who heard about it from their parents, and also among those parents who ensured their children never forgot.

I was often disturbed by, aside from it being a horrific tragedy in any location, the fact that it was too close to home. I also remained frustrated by my inability to reconcile the apparent randomness of it all: mid-morning on a weekday, in what was thought to be the sanctuary of middle-class suburbia, in a neighbourhood full of children, and yet no one seems to have seen or heard a thing.

Over the years the details of the case have stuck with me, and I have since considered the circumstances from a number of investigative perspectives, including the fact that it was perhaps not as isolated as Londoners of the day might have thought — or hoped. I'm in agreement with Ms. Jensen that the data points to a disproportionate number of major crimes, particularly given the population of the London area from 1968 to 1975.

Whether one can deem these crimes to be the work of a "serial killer" is unclear, however there appears to be at least two separate sets of apparently random murders with distinctive similarities in terms of the victimology, as well as certain common characteristics with respect to locations last seen and locations where victims' remains were located.

Regardless of whether all or some of these crimes are connected, it is difficult to imagine by today's standards how these killings affected such a comparatively small city, especially since most of the victims were children or teens who appear to have been taken at random from what were considered safe locations. These aggravating circumstances leave people demanding closure decades later.

Ms. Jensen referenced to the Vidocq Society of Philadelphia, the institute that was in part the inspiration for my current catalogue of course offerings, my student-based investigative society and my criminological research. I am not surprised that Canadian police services would be reluctant to send tens of thousands of documents, or endless terabytes of data, to an agency that at times seems to approximate a secret society. Aside from privacy, security, and confidentiality issues, the logistics and costs associated would be daunting. This leaves local — and Canadian for that matter — police agencies with only one external think-tank to whom they can forward cold cases if they choose: mine.

Simply turning over that information, however, I should caution from experience, is not always a swift and decisive move towards closing a file. It is very easy for enthusiastic honours students, emerging information professionals and even world-class scholars, scientists and experts across campus to become mired in the same procedural constraints as those original investigators — investigators who with rare exception were tirelessly dedicated and committed to seeing these cases through to finality.

It is partly for these reasons that my students, as Ms. Jensen correctly pointed out, have focused on American cold cases, though that is about to change. Crime reporting in the United States, in particular homicide and serial homicide reporting, reflects a more competitive news market. While in Canada we tend to pride ourselves on having a more circumspect and restrained culture of news media, the sensationalist, tabloid agenda of much of the American press—including what are often simultaneous investigations conducted by freelancers with no oaths of secrecy or professional codes of conduct—leaves a rich textual legacy from which modern investigators can draw information. The original reporters on these stories are also typically much easier to track down for primary source information and are more willing to turn over their original notes to us, as well as share hunches that couldn't be published.

There are now alternative routes to finding new leads, and while my students, fellow faculty, and I welcome any information that law enforcement wishes to provide on any unsolved cases, we are just as interested in procuring other sources of data.

I can assure Ms. Jensen that her brother's case is one of many local cases that remain a priority for the investigative society and for me personally. It was been 44 years since Frankie's murder, and that asking for Ms. Jensen's continued patience might seem trite, but I ask her to bear in mind that what my students and I are doing is considered revolutionary, and it is important that we proceed carefully and judiciously.

As she subtly indicated in her column, we have our share of skeptics despite our documented successes. I must also stress we are not a private investigators' guild that takes on cases at our sole discretion. In striking a delicate balance between two worlds, it is our mandate to provide assistance, expert analysis and consultation on unsolved files and work with those police who enlist or welcome our assistance, and not to circumvent them.

It is never in a police service's interest to keep unsolved cases, especially major crimes, on the books, and part of the reason the society has for the most part been so treated so graciously by law enforcement across the United States is because they recognize the service we are providing for not only victims of crime and their families, but also the police.

Letters like Ms. Jensen's and the buried memories it has excavated among Londoners who lived the aftermath of these crimes serve a valuable public service. They keep cases like Frankie's alive and keep people talking, asking questions and reflecting back. The more people talk, and the more renewed attention a case gets, the more all citizens feel compelled to help and the faster a cold case begins to thaw out.

Over time, not only are technologies able to close time and space, but some memories become clearer. Secret pacts, alliances and vows of silence once thought unbreakable frequently cave under the weight of guilt and other social pressures.

I urge anyone with information on any cold case to share it, even if anonymously, with either Crime Stoppers or the relevant police service. Any information citizens additionally feel compelled to share with my cold case society at Western can be uploaded through the comments section at michaelarntfield.ca.

Each fall I tell students who enroll in my courses, perhaps because of the provocative nature of the content, that their dark curiosities and are going to be re-tooled to serve the interests of justice and victims of crime. This is a philosophy to live by not only at university but as a consumer of crime media. Being a media literate and responsible citizen isn't just about staying informed as a matter of curiosity, but includes understanding that we all have a role to play in taking ownership of these crimes, closing ranks as community members and recognizing we all have closure and healing as a collective common interest.



Despite <u>Laura Ricciuto</u> and her friends' success at getting into bars, police across the province are nabbing kids with fake ID. But when they do, teens are so desperate to get the ID back that they argue until arrest or even call 911.

Const. Mike Arntfield, a six-year veteran of the force, regularly accepts what are called extra-duty or paid-duty assignments in. London, Ont., providing a police presence for local bars at their expense. He says he has worked at eight major London bars.

He was lurking in the shadows, the orange-colored plastic bag in his hand, as the perky teenager left the grocery store.

It was just after 2 on a crisp fall morning, and the London, Ont., street was deserted. There were no witnesses, and that's the way he wanted it.

Donna Jean Awcock didn't like going out alone at night. For weeks, she was troubled by a feeling something awful would happen to her.

But the 24-hour grocery store was only a block away and she was out of cigarettes.

When Carol Awcock awoke that morning and saw Donna Jean's empty bed, she knew something was wrong.

Her 17-year-old daughter had been out babysitting the night before. She always phoned home if she had to stay overnight.

The call from the police came later in the day. There was a battered body in the morgue. They thought it might be Donna Jean.

Don Awcock started trembling as he stared down at his daughter's body lying on a cold gumey. There were bruises on her body from her neck to her thighs:

Shoved deep down her throat, just barely sticking out of her mouth, was an orange-colored plastic bag, like one used to collect garbage.

Detectives believe the bag was used to silence Donna Jean's screams as she was raped and strangled.

Donna Jean wasn't the only murder victim in the London area to die that way. In three other unsolved slayings, the screams of the victims were also muzzled, wads of tissue shoved deep into their throats.

Investigators won't say if the "tissue slayings" are the work of a serial killer, but the Awcocks are convinced the man who murdered their daughter eight years ago has killed before, and will strike again.

A Star investigation into unsolved female slayings in the province over the last two decades has found there are at least four serial killers who have eluded police.

Police agencies are aware that senal killers have been operating in the province for years, but never made that public.

The Awcocks think they know their daughter's killer, a man they say stalked her and has since disappeared out west.

"I just pray they find this guy dead somewhere so another family doesn't have to go through the same hell," said the teary-eyed mother, staring at a framed portrait of her daughter, a poppy on each corner of the frame.

"I hope they catch this guy in the States, Down there they fry 'em," said the angry father,

The first two tissue slayings were in London in 1968, Jacqueline Dunleavy and Frankie Jensen. About 7 1/2 years later, Irene Gibbons was stain in her Strathroy house. Eight years would pass before Awcock's murder.

Dunleavy, the 16-year-old daughter of a London police officer, was last seen getting into a car on Jan. 9. Her partially clad body was found within hours of her disappearance.

,She had been strangled with her own scarf, a wad of facial tissue shoved down her throat,



The December 27, 1973 article specifically deals with Lynda White and Jackle English, with Det. Alsop saying that the police were working under the theory at that point that they were victims of the same man.

There is a mention of missing footwear, and for what it is worth, I compiled a list of footwear removed from victims who are thought to be connected in someway to possibly the same killer. I wonder if this is a sign that some were taken as a "trophy" which is attributed to serial killers, in order to relive the event or to continue the fantasy. In one case the footwear was removed and left with the body and in another the shoes were found many miles away after a tip was given to LE. Some shoes could have come off in a struggle.

- -Scott Leishman (summer 1968) missing one shoe
- -Jackie Dunleavy (winter 1968) both shoes removed and left beside the body
- -Lynda White (winter 1968) no footwear found with remains

The "tissue slayings" as you mentioned, are grouped by LE who determined that wads of tissue shoved down the victims' throats (in one case a plastic garbage bag) were done in an effort to silence screams. This apparently determined a similarity in MO, not found in the other cases. I have read that this is not an uncommon MO, therefore, I suspect that there may be details from the crime scene that LE withheld from the public, which may have further linked these cases. Just a guess on my part. There is also the possibility that this procedure was unnecessary in some instances, where there was no concern of screams being heard by anyone. I have listed some details of these tissue slayings which show some similarities between the cases. In Irene Gibbon's case, there is very little published information.

Jackie Dunleavy (1968)

- -age 16
- -got into killer's vehicle (willingly or not)
- -long honey blonde hair
- -body found in school driveway at edge of city, not far from home)
- -wad of tissue stuffed down throat
- -beaten about the face
- -strangled (with her own scarf)
- -sex act, but not raped

- -nude from the waist down
- -socks and shoes also removed
- -clothing disarrayed and piled beside the body



Michael Arntfield is a British detective who led another look into the Oakland County Child Killings case. (Heather Travis)

If you haven't already gathered, Arntfield is not your average, erudite, sweater-vested college professor. He's a 14-year veteran homicide detective in London who also holds a Ph.D. in media studies.

Two years ago, Arntfield began a course called The Serial Killer in the Media and Popular Culture. Armed with basic police investigative techniques, students analyzed decades-old cold cases from all around North America.

"The idea was to combine the information-age expertise of Generation Y and X-ers, with their youthful enthusiasm and lack of bias, to look at these cold cases and see what detectives with the same jaded perspective they've held for 20 years might have missed," he says.

Some cases even got close to being solved. In one 40-year-old unsolved murder case in Wisconsin, Arntfield says students used social media to track down a person of interest whom police didn't even know was alive.

Community Policy Privacy Policy Terms of Service The students' final reports, which include analysis and recommendations — are turned over to law enforcement.

The course evolved into The Cold Case Investigative Society, a now extremely popular "club" made up of a dozen handpicked graduate and undergraduate students from a variety of disciplines from mathematics to biology to the visual arts.

"The more different life experiences, demographics and, even left- and rightbrain differences, the more unique and valuable perspectives they bring to the table," Arntfield says.

Last fall, the Society chose the serial child murder case that has been a thorn in the side of Metro Detroit investigators for decades. The students poured over news accounts; they studied several thousand pages of police reports, interviewed the victims' families and visited evidence scenes.

Last week they turned over their 25-page analysis to the Michigan State Police. It was direct, succinct, and did not mince words.

Among their findings:

Prime suspect Christopher Busch, if alive, would be on trial for one or more of these murders and there is compelling evidence that others conspired and colluded with him.

Investigators missed an opportunity to draw a nexus between those involved in child pornography and these murders.

Busch's suicide was most likely staged to implicate him or he was murdered by a co-conspirator looking to place all culpability on him.

The convening of two grand juries is "at best, a redundant practice" and "at worst, is yet another example of state officials seeking to diffuse their responsibility to the victims' families and the respective communities."

Arntfield says the methodology used in the Society was gleaned from a series of recommendations that came out of an inquest into "horrific oversights in an Ontario serial murder case not dissimilar to this case."

"Law enforcement needs to be self-critical sometimes," Arntfield says. "To look at our mistakes and move forward."

Still, he adds: "This is not an exposé on who screwed up. This is lending our analysis and expertise for law enforcement's benefit. It's up to them to listen, right?"



James said that it was as if Greg were saying he was searching for the perfect penis. James said that there was nothing in the letters about hurting or killing any kids, but he (James) remembers that a boy got hurt jumping from Greg's moving car in California trying to get away from Greg. James went on to say that Greg then took the boy to the hospital and that's how he got caught. We told James that what actually happened was that Greg choked the boy to keep him quiet and almost choked him to death and that's when Greg panicked and took the boy to the hospital and got caught. James stated that he never heard that before, stating that his brother Greg was always lying about things and twisting things around in his favor. James said that he believes his brother Robert had the box of belongings they received of Greg's from prison after he died. James stated that he didn't think that Robert still has any of Greg's things. James did not supply any other information that would assist immediately in this investigation. The interview was terminated. *** (See transcripts from this interview for further details) ***

*** The story James relayed about his brother Greg getting into Pedophilia because he was teased about his penis & in search of the perfect penis, matches what Bowman told the police in the 1977 MSP report when he stated that Greg approached him about kidnapping and killing a boy, stating further that he (Greg) would then cut-off the boys penis and put it in a box for Bowman.

4-4-08: Garry & I stopped by Chad Nikle's place of employment today at Coldwater Rd. & Saginaw Rd. in Flint to make sure Chad is all set for the polygraph on 4-7-08. Chad was not real happy to see Detectives. We told him that the State Police from the Flint Post would pick him up at his house on Monday at 11:30am to bring him to the Northville post for his polygraph. Chad stated reluctantly that he would be ready at 11:30am Monday to be picked up.

4-7-08: We heard from Agent Tommy MacDonald, New York FBI today about the lead we sent him on Christopher Busch. MacDonald stated that he made phone contact with Chris's Busch's brother, Charles Nels Busch, who is currently in South Carolina on vacation. MacDonald stated that Charles lives in Conneticut and keeps the apartment in Manhattan for weekend visits. MacDonald stated that Charles Busch appeared cooperative and agreed to call MacDonald at the FBI in New York for an interview when he (Charles) returns home in Late April or early May.

4-7-08: Garry called the Ryan Correctional facility and made arrangements for us to interview Vince Gunnels in the morning on Wednesday 4-9-08. This is the prison we had Gunnels transferred to from Ojibway Correctional in Ironwood, Michigan.

'4-9-08: *** Greg Greene's fingerprint ruled-out after being compared to the partial print from Kristine's parka. *** Garry Gray (MSP) received an e-mail today from Michelle Glasgow, the fingerprint expert at the Michigan State Police Forensics Lab. She stated that the latent print from Kristine Mihelich's parka needs a lot of work and she is going to look into digital enhancement technology to see if there is any, new developments that she might be able to use. Michelle did say that she can rule out Greg Greene based on the fingerprint pattern, stating further that the other two we submitted (Lamborgine & Busch) she can't say either way without more clarity and is working on that.

4-9-08: Garry Gray has been in contact with Reinhard Pope, an expert from the State Police Forensics Lab, who is looking into enhancing the photos from the Busch suicide scene for us. Reinhard is going to be looking at the photos and negatives today for us and we will be sending him a copy of the old lab report on the "wadding" & "pellets" from the shotgun shell and gun that killed Jill Robinson.

4-9-08: *** (We went to Ryan Correctional today and interviewed James "Vince" Gunnels) *** Garry Gray (MSP) & I went to Ryan Correctional today and interviewed Vince Gunnels about why we believe he lied to us about knowing Greg Greene. Vince was upset when we got there about us having him transferred to Ryan Correctional and holding up his parole. We explained why this was done, the importance of the investigation and what it is we wanted from Vince prior to him being paroled. We explained that because he associated with Busch & Greene at the time of the Oakland County Child Killings, we want to make sure he didn't have information about the killings that he was holding back or repressing in his memory. We explained to Vince that Busch & Greene are our main two suspects, that he (Vince) was just a kid at the time and that we, at this point have no intention of charging him with anything, we simply want to clear him of possibly having knowledge of the case from Busch & Greene. Vince indicated that he wanted to talk to his sister in Montana first and also a lawyer. We asked Vince if he would be willing to consent to a saliva swab for DNA, to which he stated that he didn't want to do that either until he made some phone calls. We told Vince to call whoever he wanted to and if there is an attorney that had questions, he (the attorney) could call either myself or Garry and we would explain that we are simply attempting to clear him of having possible involvement or knowledge in the child killings. We also explained to Vince the 4 questions that would be on the polygraph test and asked him how he would do on those questions, to which he stated he would pass, no problem. We terminated the interview at this point and told Vince to let us about taking the polygraph as soon as he can.

4-10-08: I had received several calls from Vince Gunnels sister, Karen Zasple, from Montana in the past few days, in regards to Vince's parole getting delayed because of our investigation. I called her back today and explained the situation to her and that we are simply looking to clear Vince on any possibility that he might have information because of his association to Busch & Greene during the time of our homicides. She said that she understood what we are trying to accomplish, she has concerns about her brother's rights and wanted to talk to a lawyer for him before he decides on taking the polygraph. Vince is supposed to parole to his sisters home in Montana when we are through with him. She took my cell-phone number and stated she was going to talk to Vince and an attorney about all of this and call me back.

1-14-08: Garry Gray (MSP) sent me a copy of an e-mail today that he sent to Mr. Fountain at Michigan Department of Corrections. Fountain is the corrections official in Lansing that had Gunnels

3-13-08: *** (Tape-recorded interview of Chad Nikle, Grea Greene's celimate in prison for 3 years before Greene died). *** Garry Gray (MSP) & I drove to Flint today and interviewed Greene's ex-cellmate. Chad Nikle at his house in Flint. Nikle's house is located at 1130 E. Coldwater Rd. Flint, Michigan. We started the interview by explaining to Nikle what it is that we are investigating, that he is not in any trouble, and that we were there simply looking for his help. I explained to Nikle that we have been investigating this for a long time and that we have interviewed many people surrounding Greg Greene. I also explained to Nikle that some of the questions we are going to ask him, we already know the answers to and we do that to see if he is going to be truthful with us. I went on to say that I know that he was a cellmate of Greg Greene's before he died and that we also know that they were both from Flint & serving time in prison for the same type of offense (CSC on child u/13). I further explained that we know that they had a lot of time to talk in their cell, and that we know from our experience that cellmates in prison share a lot of information with each other Asa. we were explaining this to Nikle, he stated that he and Greg did not talk much, and never said anything to him about killing any kids. Nikle was not very convincing when he made that statement and appeared nervous. While I was talking to Nikle about the seriousness of what we are investigating, how long it has been and how bad the families of these victims need closure, I handed the photograph of our 4-victims to Nikle to look at. Nikle had what appeared to me to be a strange reaction to the picture, when he only looked at it momentarily, then turned the picture over, pushing it back at me, hitting my hand with it as he pushed it back. I almost said to Nikle, "I told you to look at it," but didn't say anything about his reaction to the picture at that time. Nikle said again that Greg never talked about anything-like that and that they didn't talk much. We told Nikle that we did not think he was "being straight" with us and confronted him with the fact that he appeared nervous and that we did not believe him. We noticed that Nikle kept looking at his elderly mother who was sitting in the other room. We asked Nikle if he wanted to go outside to our car and talk and he agreed.

When we got out to the car, we confronted Nikle further about possibly lying to us, at which time he broke down crying heavily and holding his head. We told Nikle that it was just the three of us now and he did not have to worry. Nikle then told us that he and Greg Greene were not only cellmates, but they had a sexual relationship. After explaining this, Nikle appeared to be more truthful after breaking down. We began to ask him questions again about Greg Greene and what Greene said to him about our case. Nikle told us that Greene told him about kids he had molested in the past and gotten away with it. He also told us that Greene told him that he got away with killing 4 kids in the past. Nikle was visibly upset at this point. His eyes were watering and he was breathing neavy. We asked Nikle what else Greene told him about it, to which he stated that he's trying to remember, it was along time ago. We asked Nikle to try to remember when Greene told him this. At this point, Nikle began telling us about how he found Greg Greene dead in their cell and performed CPR on him until the quards could get up there. Nikle told us that he does not remember exactly when Greene told him about this, but remembers that they were watching TV and talking about molesting kids in the past when Greene told him about getting away with killing the kids. I still felt that Nikle was holding back and told him that I get the feeling that he is holding back because he is worried about something coming back on him, to which Nikle agreed, stating that he doesn't want anything happening to him. We re-assured him that he would not get hurt and that he would not be any trouble. We talked with Nikle more about what Greene had told him about killing the kids. Nikle stated that Greene told him that he knew the police were looking for those kids while they were

missing and in his possession. Nikle said that Greene told him that he had molested the kids in a field and killed them. We asked Nikle if Greene told him where he kept the kids, to which he stated ne doesn't remember. Nikle said that Greene told him that he had the kids for a few days. We asked Nikle if he remembers Greene mentioning the Oakland County Child Killings, to which he stated he didn't remember hearing that. We told Nikle we intend on polygraphing him on this information. We asked Nikle if it was the truth that Greene told you he killed 4 kids, to which Nikle stated, "Yes," We asked Nikle how he would do on a polygraph about this, to which he stated he would pass. Nikle was stressed and expressed his concerns about telling us this. We asked him if he can remember anything else right now about what Greene told him, to which he stated no. Once again we asked if it was true that Greene told him this information, Nikle answered, "yes." We told Nikle again, that we would be polygraphing him on this information, to which he stated he would pass. We asked Nikle If he remembers Greene talking about another person with him during these killings? Nikle stated he didn't think so. I ran the name Christopher or Chris Busch by him? Nikle paused for a second, then, said that the name sounds familiar. We told Nikle to start writing down everything he can remember about what Greene had told him about killing the kids, and he stated he would. We told him that we would be in touch with him about taking the polygraph and terminated the interview. *** (See transcripts from interview for details.) ***

3-14-08: Garry Gray (MSP) & I went to the Michigan State Police Long-term evidence storage facility today in Lansing, Michigan. We went there to go through the OCCK evidence, to see exactly which packages of evidence contained the hairs & fibers we will need for future comparisons during the course of this lead. We will be conducting crime scene searches of Busch & Greene's homes & cottage for trace evidence (hairs & Fibers) to collect and compare to known evidence found on the victims. We went through, approximately 10 large bags and/or boxes of evidence such as the victims clothing, victims boots/shoes, and other miscellaneous evidence. We found many slides and containers that held fibers, hairs, blood evidence, & DNA swabs. Some of the hairs and fibers, including animal hairs that were tested and compared during the original investigation, were not in this evidence at this storage facility. Documents located at the storage facility, indicate that these items that were tested, were taken from the long-term storage facility in 1995, to the Northville Lab and not returned. We will be checking with the Northville Lab, due to the fact these particular hairs & fibers will be important for our future comparisons.

3-14-08: I received an e-mail today from Deputy "Bud" Shaw from The Montmorency County Sheriffs Department, who stated that he made contact with officials from Register of Deeds at Presque Isle County Michigan and also Alpena County Michigan. Shaw stated that there is no record of property in the name of Christopher Busch or his father H. Lee Busch in either county. It's possible Vince Gunnels was at Chris Busch's house in Alma and thought it was Alpena, or Busch's house in Alpena was in another persons name or Busch stayed with someone else.

3-15-08: We are making plans to conduct crime scene searches for trace evidence at several of Busch & Greene's homes/cottage in the near future, especially in light of the information from Chad Nikle. We are going to have the State Police Crime Lab conduct these searches, starting with the Busch home on Morningview Terrace in Birmingham and the cottage on Ess Lake, where Busch was seen while King was missing. Recovery of any physical evidence during these searches, especially hairs & fibers, will result in immediate comparisons to our trace evidence currently at the MSP Forensics Lab in Lansing, and also at the FBI Forensics Lab in Quantico, Virginia.

3-16-08: *** (See the Greene "Time-Line," for details of his whereabouts, statements and/or actions during a span of time, beginning when Greene was 15-16 years old living on Baldwin in Flint thru his death in prison in 1995. Reinhard is going to be looking at the photos and negatives today for us and we will be sending him a copy of the old lab report on the "wadding" & "pellets" from the shotgun shell and gun that killed Jill Robinson.

4-9-08: *** (We went to Ryan Correctional today and interviewed James "Vince" Gunnels) *** Garry Gray (MSP) & I went to Ryan Correctional today and interviewed Vince Gunnels about why we believe he lied to us about knowing Greg Greene. Vince was upset when we got there about us having him transferred to Ryan Correctional and holding up his parole. We explained why this was done, the importance of the investigation and what it is we wanted from Vince prior to him being paroled. We explained that because he associated with Busch & Greene at the time of the Oakland County Child Killings, we want to make sure he didn't have information about the killings that he was holding back or repressing in his memory. We explained to Vince that Busch & Greene are our main two suspects, that he (Vince) was just a kid at the time and that we, at this point have no intention of charging him with anything, we simply want to clear him of possibly having knowledge of the case from Busch & Greene. Vince indicated that he wanted to talk to his sister in Montana first and also a lawyer. We asked Vince if he would be willing to consent to a saliva swab for DNA, to which he stated that he didn't want to do that either until he made some phone calls. We told Vince to call whoever he wanted to and if there is an attorney that had questions, he (the attorney) could call either myself or Garry and we would explain that we are simply attempting to clear him of having possible involvement or knowledge in the child killings. We also explained to Vince the 4 questions that would be on the polygraph test and asked him how he would do on those questions, to which he stated he would pass, no problem. We terminated the interview at this point and told Vince to let us about taking the polygraph as soon as he can.

4-10-08: I had received several calls from Vince Gunnels sister, Karen Zasple, from Montana in the past few days, in regards to Vince's parole getting delayed because of our investigation. I called her back today and explained the situation to her and that we are simply looking to clear Vince on any possibility that he might have information because of his association to Busch & Greene during the time of our homicides. She said that she understood what we are trying to accomplish, she has concerns about her brother's rights and wanted to talk to a lawyer for him before he decides on taking the polygraph. Vince is supposed to parole to his sisters home in Montana when we are through with him. She took my cell-phone number and stated she was going to talk to Vince and an attorney about all of this and call me back.

4-14-08: Garry Gray (MSP) sent me a copy of an e-mail today that he sent to Mr. Fountain at Michigan Department of Corrections. Fountain is the corrections official in Lansing that had Gunnels



I helped my brother construct a gigantic timeline/flow chart from 1976 to 1992. From 1992-on, I typed up notes about you contacting the cops, the "investigation" of John, etc., up until the present day. It has some gaps, but under the circumstances it gets the job done.

The flow chart starts at the top with the Busch family and the Hastings family. My brother has included information about a douche bag who ran with Busch back in the day-foregory Green. He was in jail when Tim was abducted, but may have been involved with Busch in some of the other killings. Hastings' deal runs parallel to the Busch deal and demonstrates the physical proximity, similarities between the two men (basically everything except pedophelia and Busch's access to huge quantities of \$\$). I believe the paper wants to photograph the flow chart, just to show the sheer size of it (not the contents, which would not be legible in a photo). Rest assured that Hastings receives top billing and occupies the right-hand side of the chart.

My brother says the reporter totally gets the Hastings thing; that they shut you down; that the cops have never REALLY investigated him or his family. She has a long-retired detective who provided comment on Busch, but of course no one will comment yet on Hastings, If she calls you, I'd say there is a greater chance Hastings will get some mention in this intial article; if not, that will be in round 2. As my brother said, her editors have reigned in her article a lot at this stage. I know she will continue to work on this and that as the rats start running from the sinking ship, Hastings' name and the bulinuts you have gone through over the past almost 2-decades will be made more public. They need something from LE to cover their ass at this point. I believe that is why the article Is going to be written in terms of the Kings versus the MSP.

My Dad is convinced Chris Busch killed Tim. He agrees with me and my brothers that Hastings is either involved, has knowledge or had deep suspicions that should have been investigated much more carefully both in 1977 and 1992. If this entire thing was covered up in order for the MSP to "save face," of course they would have had no interest in truly investigating Hastings, who was dangerously close to Busch. The MSP has yet to inform my Dad on the status of Hastings' polygraph. We are totally in the dark again and I expect that will worsen after Thursday.

Let the games begin. It is our opening punch; it's the best we can do. Exposing the MSP for what they are is the first step. No one in LE can back us up right now, but I am quite sure that will change after this thing goes out on Thursday. Be prepared for Busch to get some heavy press (she has a lot of criminal background on him it sounds like). John is not in the clear, not by a long shot. The goal right now is to turn the MSP upside down and get the public to open their eyes. Our initial goal is a "f-k you" to the MSP and it sounds like that will be accomplished. We won't see the article before it goes out, of course, but I have faith in my brother's take on the reporter.

Our best hope is that the MSP is unable to move on any of this before Thursday.

Volunteers from Detroit Public Schools joined Greening of Detroit to plant 300 trees in four hours for a beautification project on the campus of the new \$22.3 million Munger PreK to 8 School in Southwest Detroit.

Students, parents and community members from the Logan and O.W. Holmes elementary/middle schools' neighborhoods assisted conservation experts from Greening of Detroit to create a small orchard-like environment on the new school's campus. The two schools will merge in the fall at the new Munger school.

MUNGER SCHOOL DETAILS

Demolition began in January 2011 on the former Munger/Chadsey complex to make way for the new \$22.3 million Munger PreK to 8 School. The school is scheduled to open in the fall 2012 in a thriving section of Southwest Detroit. The school will include an elementary and middle school wing connected by a two-story student arcade that will function as a dining count, student center and school square. 

As part of that, the district has launched a new visitors ID badge system, requiring visitors to Detroit Public Schools high schools, career technical schools and the district's new Police Command Center to be put through on-the-spot sex-offender registry checks as part of a new security clearance system aimed at making campuses safer for students and

The system will instantly scan visitors' driver licenses and state ID cards and cross-check the information with sex-offender registries throughout the United States and Canada.

All high school students also have been issued new photo ID badges that are color-coded by school, allowing campus security personnel to instantly identify students who belong on their campus.




