Mrs. Robinson states they have checked with all of the friends, relatives and even neighbors at their previous addresss, 19986 Renfrew, Detroit, Mi. This home is located south of 8 Mile Rd., between Woodward and Livernois, Detroit. Mrs. Robinson states they had moved to Royal Oak in August of this year and her daughter has made few friends in this area, and is somewhat of a loner. Mrs. Robinson states that most of her daughter's friends have been contacted and that she has also contacted the Gesu Parish School in Detroit where her daughter attended school last year.

Mrs. Robinson states that after the argument over household chores she told her daughter to get out. Jill went into her bedroom and packed a green and blue blanket (plaid) and her backpack, blue levi-type, with orange straps. Jill walked out of the house carrying two books and wearing a blue knit cap, with yellow design on the cap's edge; a bright orange down-filled jacket with no collar, blue jeans, dark colored snow boots.

Father lives at Birmingham, Tx Mrs. Robinson

states that her husband, Thomas Robinson, has been contacted and will call her with any information.

Received a call from the Detroit News, Barbara Doer, Tx requesting information on the above report. Paper was contacted by the mother and requested that our Department release the information to the news media. Barbara Doer was given the above information, and requested that she be contacted if the girl returns prior to the story being released. If after 5:00 PM, contact the City Desk, -Tx

Received a call from channel 7, Mr. Pat Dennis and John Petrovich, requesting information also, Tx They state they would not put this information out at this time, unless we suspect foul play.

12-26-76 - 0905

Received a call from the front desk regarding a body being found on I-75 just north of 16 Mile Road, city of Troy. Officer Cusick picked up Lt. Ringer at his home and they drove directly to the scene.

0915 -- Contacted Sgt. Reed of the Troy PD and after checking the body all of the clothing matched and it appeared to be Jill Robinson.

1000 -- Medical Examiner arrived at scene and after body was moved the back pack was checked and contained a blue and green plaid blanket as described as being taken by Jill Robinson when she left her home.

1030 -- Lt. Ringer went to the Robinson home and notified the mother that a body was found and it is believed to be her daughter and that the Troy PD will contact her ~~XXXX~~ for positive identification.

1100 -- Contacted Det. Meitzner and Stinson for assistance for followup work.

1530 -- Received a call from Sgt. Reed and Halsey. They report the post showed she died of ~~xxxx~~ shotgun wound to the head and will need dental records and fingerprints for positive identification. Sgt. Reed states they have received very few calls at this time with any information regarding Jill Robinson.

1:15 PM; Det. Meitzner & Stinson stopped out to _____ & talked to Mr. Forester, his daughter, Libby, was not at home. He was informed of what had happened & stated that he would talk to Libby as soon as she came home.

1:45 PM; Det. Meitzner & Stinson stopped out to the Marathon Gas Station on Woodward North of 14 Mile Road in Birmingham. Det. Meitzner talked to the manager, Mr. Jim Shomo, over the phone (- home & -station) as he was not at work. He stated that he would talk to all of his employees on 12-27-76 when he comes to work.

1:50 PM; Det. Meitzner & Stinson stopped out to the area at 15 Mile & Addams in Birmingham; Mobil Gas Station, Ian Shaw & Marty Airries did not notice anyone or anything on 12-24-76. Standard Gas Station, Dan Rowley does not remember any girl or anything either, but he states that he will talk to his friend who also worked on 12-24-76 as he states that he & his friend don't miss many girls that go by.

2:10 PM: Det. Meitzner & Stinson checked by 932 Purdy, Birmingham where Libby Forester used to live as the house is vacant. There was no sign of anyone having been there. Talked to Dr. Kamm, _____ & Mrs. Irene Bernhard both of whom state that they have not seen any girl or anyone else strange around 932 Purdy.

2:30 PM: Det. Meitzner & Stinson drove by scene of murder on I-75 North 16 Mile Road. Could not determine the exact scene as it has been snowing heavily for some time.

She states that she saw the Maroon Chevrolet, license # SCH 252 pick up a girl on 12-23-76. She does not remember what color jacket the girl was wearing, but does remember that the girl was wearing blue jeans. She does not think that the girl was Jill Robinson, who she has seen in the newspapers. Mrs. Podnar does not know who owns the car she saw & does not know the Northman family.

5:06 PM, Det. Stinson contacted Mr. Bill Forester, _____ who stated that his daughter, LIBBY, was quite upset at this time. His wife and he had talked to LIBBY, but she could not recall anything significant to add to the report. Mr. FORESTER, questioned regarding the "MacDonalds" gift certificate, with names "~~LIBBY~~ ALICIA, DENISE, and BETSY" which were obtained from Troy Cpl. C. Green. Mr. FORESTER stated that the certificate probably was a gift received at a birthday party held for complainant, on Saturday, approx, 12-4-76. ALICIA was the name of the younger FORESTER daughter, who attended the party. BETSY is probably BETSY GAULK, address unknown, also a guest, and the name DENISE recalled no memory.

Contacted Mr. Hein. He stated he was hitchhiking on I-75 in the downriver area on 12-26-76 at approximately 12:30 AM and was picked up by a white male approximately 45-50 years old, 250-300 lbs., blue eyes, lt. brown hair, about 5'8 to 5'9, wearing a brown courderoy coat. He states that after entering the car, an old model Maverik, color blue, he noticed a young girl in the rear seat wearing a red coat. The girl had dark hair and the girl appeared to be frightened. He states that there was very little conversation, but the driver asked the girl if she was warm enough and her comment was yes, I'm just fine. Mr. Hein states the driver was broke and low on gas and he gave him \$1.30 or \$1.40 in change. Mr. Hein was dropped at the Pontiac exit and the car
