Still going back and forth with phone messages with Investigator Duncan of the Georgia State Patrol, regarding setting <sup>7</sup> s up for a polygraph.

### INFORMATION:

On September 21, 2009, the undersigned made telephonic contact with Investigator Duncan from the Georgia State Patrol located in Atlanta GA, reference the polygraph on i Duncan advised that he would be more than happy to accommodate the Michigan State Police with the request, however he advised that he would first need a summary of the investigation involving i and a request from the MSP for said examination to be conducted by GSP.

On September 23, 2009, the undersigned sent via certified mail through the U.S. Post Office the following documents:

1. MSP generated report, (21-1854-09), supplemental report #41, i s investigation. The supplemental report consisted of the DNA sample assistance provided by Georgia Bureau of Investigation.
2. MSP generated report, (21-1787-08), supplemental report #15, Interview of I s which took place on August 10th 2009 in Atlanta Georgia.
3. Copy of transcribed interview of i by Detectives Gray and Williams LPD, along with the actual CD to listen to as well.
4. Departmental Correspondence requesting said actions to conduct the polygraph examination and followup procedures.
5. List of suggested polygraph examination questions used in the past by prior examiners regarding the Oakland County Child Killer investigation.

The undersigned made telephonic contact with Investigator Duncan prior to sending the above material. Duncan advised that he will review said materials and call the undersigned regarding his plan of action in examining i Duncan further advised that he believes there will be no problems from his department to conduct the exam, however he will have to officially get approval prior to.

Duncan further advised that he would have to adhere to Georgia's policies and procedures for polygraph examinations and some changes will most likely be made to the list of tentative questions that were supplied by the undersigned officer.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

On September 22, 2009, at approximately 3:15 PM, the undersigned made telephonic contact with [redacted] was advised when he was interviewed on August 6, 2009, at the Newaygo post, he stated he would be willing to back up the statements he made to the detectives, regarding Christopher Busch physically taking him in his car to a location where one of the victims was abducted from, by taking a polygraph examination. When asked how he would do, [redacted] stated that he would pass the test. When asked why, [redacted] said he would pass, because it was the truth.

[redacted] was asked again if was still willing to take a polygraph examination to back up what he told officers August 6th. [redacted] was further advised that by taking and passing the polygraph test where he said Christopher Busch did as he said he did, (by physically pointing to where one of the victims was taken from in a parking lot), would only bolster the fact that "IT DID HAPPEN AS HE SAID IT DID". [redacted] said, "Sure I'll take the test if that's all it's about".

Dear Investigator Duncan

I would first like to thank you for offering your assistance regarding a cold case homicide that we've been investigating for many years, known in Michigan as: "The Oakland County Child Killer Investigation" dating back to the mid 1970's. Enclosed with this correspondence, is a brief overview regarding the children's murders along with our subject of interest.

I, along with another investigator on the task force, flew to Atlanta Ga. to re-interview this subject, on August 10, 2009. Although [redacted] has denied any culpability whatsoever, we would like to further confirm/deny this with a polygraph examination. Our initial interview with [redacted] had to do with whether or not he knew a person, (who is currently our main suspect, Christopher Busch, "deceased"). [redacted] had been investigated back in 1991 and a thorough investigation had been conducted in which he was cleared, however, he was never questioned about his possible relationship with Busch.

I believe the best course of action concerning a polygraph examination, would be to ask him specific question regarding the murders of the 4 children. I've consulted with Michigan State Police, (MSP) polygrapher, Lt. Robert Dykstra and a short list of questions that have been asked of many prior examinees, would be appropriate.

If [redacted] happens to fails said examination, you have permission from the MSP to fully interrogate him regarding his possible involvement. Also, per our conversation regarding expenses and costs that may be associated with this investigation, and the slight possibility that you may be needed for any legal proceedings, rest assured that all costs associated with same would be paid for by the State of Michigan.

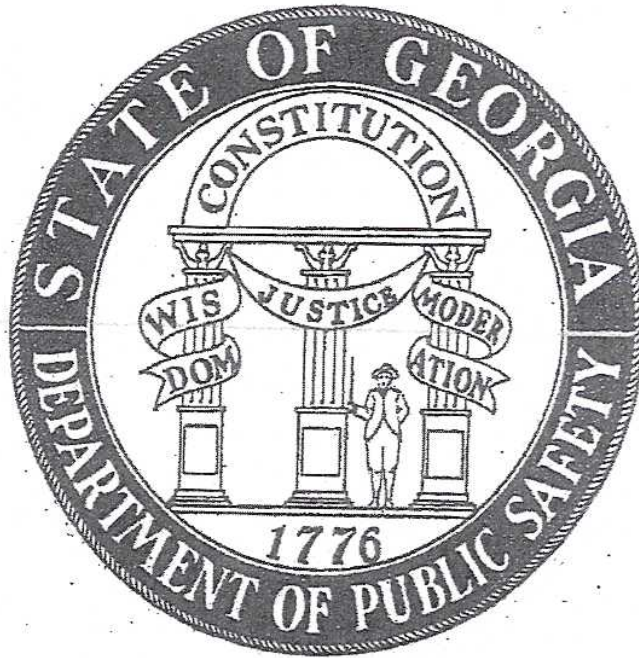

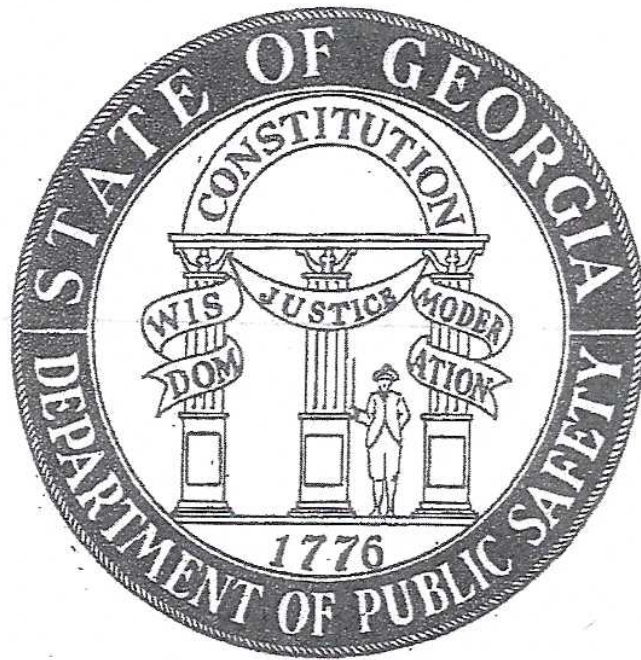

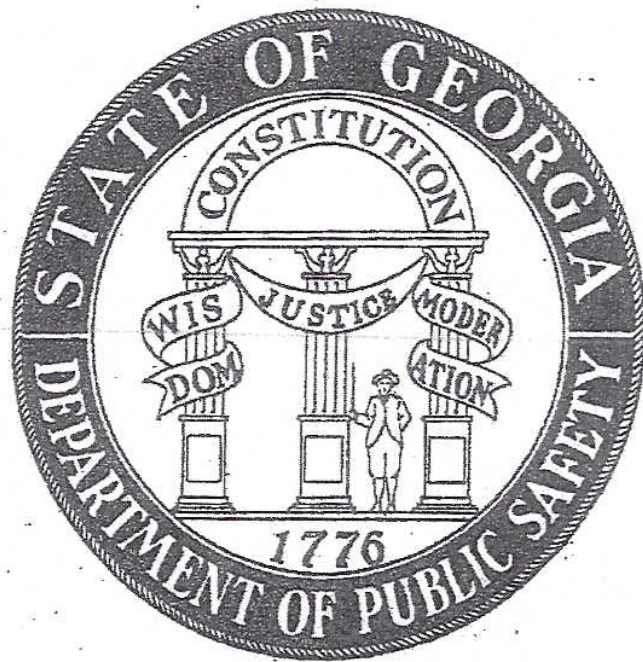

On 10/15/2009 at approximately 8:30 AM, Duncan established phone contact with \_\_\_\_\_. \_\_\_\_\_ advised he had been thinking about one of the questions from the Polygraph Examination he wanted to discuss, but he was driving at the time and would call back.

Duncan contacted Detective Sergeant Garry Gray with the Michigan State Police and advised him of the contact.

\_\_\_\_\_ called back at approximately 11:30 AM, but Duncan was not able to establish contact until approximately 1:05PM.

Duncan told \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ stated it had been 20 years since he had read the book (Duncan assumed he meant the book about the murders) and he said "I really can't say anything". \_\_\_\_\_ further stated: "I'm pretty sure ...ah... positive I answered the way I feel". \_\_\_\_\_ indicated that was all he wanted to talk about. Duncan reiterated the offer to talk with \_\_\_\_\_ if he wanted to call back.

Duncan contacted Gray regarding the contact. Gray requested the information be documented for the Case file.

GEORGIA HIGHWAY PATROL/POLYGRAPH:

On Tuesday, October 6, 2009, the undersigned received a voicemail message from Investigator Steve Duncan of the Georgia Highway Patrol, (Polygraph Unit), regarding Monday's October 5th polygraph examination of the above subject.

Duncan advised that J

Duncan further advised he didn't polygraph on the King child due to a previous polygraph already given on this victim in 1992.

NOTE:

Duncan received the packet of information previously supplied by the undersigned regarding [redacted] and his possible connections with the Oakland County Child Killing Investigation. The undersigned along with (Now retired D/Sgt.) Cory Williams of the Livonia Police Department, traveled to Atlanta Ga. to interview [redacted]. During this interview, [redacted] advised that he would be willing to take a polygraph examination to once and for all clear himself in all of the child killings. (Note) [redacted] was given a polygraph at the request of Investigator Donald Studt of the Birmingham Police Department, April 9, 1992. The sole test issue regarding this particular examination only dealt with the kidnap/murder of victim # 4 of the Child Murders, Timothy King.

TELEPHONIC CONTACT WITH INVESTIGATOR DUNCAN:

On 10-6-2009, at approximately 9:00 AM, the undersigned and Detective Robertson conducted a conference call with investigator Duncan. Steve Duncan advised the following information:

Duncan advised that he initially wanted to meet with [redacted] in the early morning hours to conduct the interview and examination, however [redacted] advised him that he works during this time and a much later appointment would work with his schedule much easier.

A meeting was then scheduled for 3 PM this date. Duncan advised that when [redacted] did in fact show up for the 3 PM interview/examination, he was upset and advised that he had to leave by 6 pm and he appeared to be very agitated. Duncan advised that while speaking with [redacted] during the pre-test interview, [redacted] was very concerned and made a big deal out of the only four polygraph questions and that they, (Gray and Williams) lied to him. Duncan advised that he told [redacted] that this examination had to do with him, and the test was needed to clear him. [redacted] was then read his Miranda rights from Duncan and had no problems with this.

Duncan stated that in Georgia, Polygraphs are done somewhat different than in Michigan. He advised he tested [redacted] on the three other victims of the killings, Stebbins, Robinson and Mihelich, and did so in this exact order. Duncan said he did the one pretest and Miranda for all exams, (3) which were each done individually. Duncan advised he DVD recorded all examinations and interview with [redacted] and will do separate reports for each also.

Duncan advised that

[redacted]. On the third test involving Mihelich, Duncan stated that [redacted] appeared to be exhausted and couldn't continue. During the Mihelich exam,

Duncan said after the tests were given, he took a break to score all of the charts and went back in the room to confront him with the results. At first, [redacted] never denied anything but just sat there and listened to him he believed that [redacted] almost resigned himself to the fact that he was involved, but recouped and then started the denial of the exams.

Duncan stated [redacted] made some very strange statements to him and said more than once, "I can't tell you", and then he would catch himself and what he was saying, and then followup by saying, "Because that's not the truth".

Duncan advised the undersigned that he and his supervisor who also witnessed the entire examination process, were so convinced that [redacted] had involvement with these murders, that if he were to confess to him, his involvement, they already had a plan in place where they would hold him for the officers in Michigan to obtain a warrant. He said they were that convinced.

Duncan advised that there was no question in his mind, whatsoever, that [redacted] has some involvement with the murders of these children. He stated he didn't know to what degree of involvement he may have, whether knowledge, did the murder or assisted, but he firmly believes he was involved. Duncan stated that in polygraph, you can't just pull out one part, and hang your hat on it. Duncan did however state again, that there is no question in his mind that he is involved with these murders.

In regards to the first two polygraphs with Stebbins and Robinson,

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During the post test interview, Duncan said it lasted about twenty minutes and that \_\_\_\_\_ knew that he had to do this as part of taking the examination. Duncan said that he didn't think \_\_\_\_\_ would speak with him again, however he did try to end the examination process on a positive note. In regards to how receptive \_\_\_\_\_ would be for another interview, possibly by the undersigned officers, Duncans feels that \_\_\_\_\_ may be receptive. \_\_\_\_\_ did advise he may consult with an attorney.

At the end of this conversation with Investigator Duncan, the undersigned asked him is \_\_\_\_\_ I knew our current two main suspects, Christopher Busch and Gregory Greens. Duncan said that Busch did bring up the guy who committed suicide (Busch), and when asked if he thought that \_\_\_\_\_ knew Busch, he stated absolutely.

Investigator Duncan advised that he will be generating three separate reports as well as all of the pre and post interview information concerning his dealings with \_\_\_\_\_ Duncan also advised that he will be forwarding copies of all DVD's involved as well as the reports that have to do with \_\_\_\_\_ and the polygraph process.
