



D/Lt. Patrick T. Sullivan, affiant, being first duly sworn, on oath deposes and says:

(1) That the following property constitutes evidence of criminal conduct: A 1965 Chevrolet Vin # 166375F139442, Bronze in color with a black vynal top, Ropes, animal hairs, animal fecus, human fecus, human urine remains, articles stained with human urine, human hairs, human blood, human spittle, clothing articles, pieces of clothing and finger-prints which are evidence of the kidnapping and murder of one MARK DOUGLAS STEBBINS, age 12.

(2) Affiant further says that the above-mentioned property is located at the following described place: A 1965 Chevrolet, Vin # 166375F139442 bearing 1976 Michigan License plates J1H-848, Bronze in color with a black vynal top and registered to one JOHN COSBIE of 333 Academy, Ferndale currently in custody of the Ferndale Police Department.

(3) Affiant further says that he has probable cause to believe the above-listed property to be searched for and seized is now located upon said described premises, based upon the following facts:

(1) Affiant is a Lieutenant with the Ferndale Police Department and has been so employed for the past 19 years.

(2) On Sunday, February 15, 1976 one, MARK DOUGLAS STEBBINS, disappeared on his way to his home from the American Legion Hall.

(3) Based on your affiants investigation and further information supplied by other officers of this department has knowledge of the following: (a) The above car is at the Ferndale Police Department, located at 310 E. Nine Mile Road, Ferndale, Michigan 48220, having been seized by the Ferndale Police Department to secure said vehicle to prevent the distruction of aforementioned evidence.

(b) That on the day of the disappearance of Marck Douglas Stebbins, (2/15/76) John Cosbie was present at the American Legion Hall, located at 1741 Livernois Ferndale.

(c) That said John Cosbie had made a verbal offer to drive Mark Douglas Stebbins home when he asked his mother's, Ruth Stebbins, permission to leave said American Legion Hall to return to his home located at 429 E. Saratoga, Ferndale.

(d) That said John Cosbie was turned down on his offer to transport MARK DOUGLAS STEBBINS to his home.

(e) That said John Cosbie did leave the American Legion Hall within minutes of the departure of Mark Douglas Stebbins.

(f) That said John Cosbie was a close association with a known sex offender of minor children.

(g) That the remains of Mark Douglas Stebbins having been found in a vacant field located in the City of Southfield near Ten Mile Road and Greenfield, on 2/19/76 in the a.m. hours.

(h) That the remains of Mark Douglas Stebbins bore marks about the wrists, ankles and neck that indicated having been bound with ropes or heavy cord.

(i) That the remains of Mark Douglas Stebbins when found were found to bear the hairs like substance on the exterior of his clothing.

(j) That the remains were found in a crouched, folded position that indicates being confined in a small area, i.e., trunk of a car.

(k) That the remains were found in an area consisting of soil, dirt, and various types of foliage.

(l) That suspect vehicle was staked out by Officer Robert Frank of the Ferndale Police Department and as he was watching the vehicle, after the discovery of the body, the subject owner of the vehicle was observed cleaning the trunk area of above described vehicle. A reddish blonde hair was observed by this officer on a cooler that subject/owner had removed from this suspect vehicle. This officer observed the body of the victim and it appeared that the body was cramped in a position as if he had been in the trunk of a vehicle. Also hairs, silver gray, were observed on the clothing by this officer. The subject/owner of the above described vehicle has a cat that is gray in color. The hairs on the victim appear to be animal hairs.

The below signed officer, at the above time and date was sent to the location of 333 Academy to observe the house for any incoming or outgoing traffic. The officer was given a name of Crosbie, John Thomas W/M DOB \_\_\_\_\_ Possibly driving a 68 Plymouth LDR Gold in color. The officer arrived, and observed no veh matching that description near the 333 address. The officer drove EB on Academy to Paxton and was passed by a 65 Chev Blk Vy/Bronze bearing 76MI/ JTH 848, driven by a WM in his young 20's, short hair. The veh in question was observed driving into the drive of 333 Academy. The subject exited the veh and carried a box, what appeared to be a beer can box, into the house. At this time I advised the station via radio of my observation. I proceeded to the SE corner of Academy and Paxton at the rear of a church building and observed the same subject exiting the house carrying a box from the house to the car. The subject got into the driverside of the chevrolet and appeared to be leaving. The total time of 2-3 minutes elapsed from his arrival to now. The subject then exited the veh again and proceeded to the trunk of the car carrying a large blk or charcoal colored ice chest or cooler ET# 6434. He placed this at the rear of the chev on the sidewalk. I again radioed my observation to the station. At this time Lt Sullivan and Pat'r Wielgat and myself proceeded to the veh with the subject still bending over into the trunk.

Responded to 15660 W. Ten Mile in reference to a found body. The victim was on his back, leaning slightly to his left side, propped up against a brick wall, his legs folded up.

Extensive lividity was present on the left side of the body, rigor mortis beginning to leave. Body temperature was cold, even under clothing. The three aforementioned signs indicating the victim to/dead for quite some time. The body was fully clothed, all clothing intact except for the trouser zipper being down. Around both wrists & ankles were rope or chord impressions. There were also rope impressions around the victim's neck.

Photos were taken of the body & surround area before body was removed. Several red fibers and animal fur were removed from the jacket and jeans of the victim. Red fibers also found on the right boot. A bright blue paint and two different types of soil were also on the right boot. Evidence collected at the scene marked as follows:





DETAILS: At 10:00 a.m. this date the above captioned subject came into the station at the request of this writer to be interviewed concerning this matter. Present at the interview were Sgt. Henderlong, undersigned and Lt. Patrick Sullivan of the Ferndale Police Department. Mr. Sloan was asked to give an account of his activities from Sunday 2-15-76 through Thursday 2-19-76. Mr. Sloan was agreeable and gave the following account.

Sunday 2-15-76 got up at 10:00 a.m., had coffee with his father, and was at home until approximately 3:00 - 3:30 p.m. at which time he left the house and drove to his sisters home at approximately 4:00 p.m. he, his sister, her husband, and children went to the Shrine Circus. At the conclusion of the performance all went back to his sisters house where he stayed until 11:30 p.m. at which time he went right home. Upon his arrival home at approximately 11:45 p.m. he talked with his mother who was watching the late movie. Mr. Sloan did not leave the house until the next day.
