OAKLAND COUNTY CHILD KILLER INVESTIGATION

CASE HISTORY:

During the years of 1976-77, four children, two boys and two girls, were abducted and murdered in the greater Oakland County area. The case remains unsolved, however it is believed by law enforcement personnel, that all of the slayings are related to one another. All of the victims were alone when abducted, held from 3 to 19 days, well fed, meticulously cleaned/groomed, and dressed in their own clothing before being dumped alongside a roadway for easy discovery.

The following subheadings are brief descriptions of each homicide.

Victim #1, MARK STEBBINS, white male, age 12 years:

On February 15, 1976, at about 1:30 pm, MARK STEBBINS left the American Legion Hall in Ferndale, Michigan to head for his home at 429 E. Saratoga St. in Ferndale to watch a movie on television. His mother spoke with him just before he left the hall. She reported him missing at 11:00 pm that evening.

Four days later on February 19th, at 11:45 am, his body was found in the New Orleans Shopping Mall Parking Lot which is located at 15660 W. Ten Mile Rd. in Southfield, Michigan. The place where the body was found is only several miles north of where he was last seen.

The body was fully dressed with clothes he was wearing when last seen. There were discolorations of the wrists and ankles that might be rope marks. The anal orifice was distended with obvious but superficial lacerations. Death was due to asphyxia caused by smothering. No sperm was found in any of the body openings. No trace of any drugs could be found.

Victim #2, JILL ROBINSON, white female, age 12 years:

In the late afternoon of December 22, 1976, JILL ROBINSON had an argument with her mother. JILL packed some clothes in a backpack and left the house, which is located in the city of Royal Oak, Michigan. Her mother assumed she was going to see her father who lived in Birmingham, Michigan a short distance away.

At 11:30 pm, JILL was reported missing. Her father had not seen her that day, nor did any of her friends. Her mother and father were divorced and in the past when she was upset she would go to her fathers' home.

Her body was found of December 26, 1976 at 8:45 am along Highway I-75 just north of Sixteen Mile Road in Troy, Michigan.

Her killer had laid her down on her back on the snowy should of the road and blown the top of her head off with a 12 gauge shotgun.

The body was dressed in the same clothing she was wearing when she left and she was wearing the back-pack. Death was due to the shotgun blast. There were no signs of sexual molestation or penetration.

Victim #3. KRISTINE MIHELICH, white female, age 10 years:

One week after the body of JILL ROBINSON was found, on January 2, 1977, at 3:00 pm, KRISTINE MIHELICH left her home in Berkley, Michigan, to go to the 7-11 Party Store several blocks from her home. She was reported missing by her mother at 6:00 pm, that same day.

On January 21, 1977, at 11:45 am, her body was found in a snow covered ditch along Bruce Lane in the village of Franklin, Michigan. This is a short dead-end residential street. The body was clothed in the same clothing she was wearing when she left home 19 days earlier. Death was caused by asphyxia by smothering. There were no signs of sexual molestation or penetration. The Blood did show a small amount of carbon monoxide.

Victim #4. TIMOTHY KING, white male, age 11 years:

On March 16, 1977, at 7:40 pm, TIMOTHY KING left home to go to the local drug store. The drug store is located in a shopping mall about 4 blocks from his home in Birmingham, Michigan. He was reported missing at 9:00 pm, that same day.

Several witnesses were found that thought they saw the KING boy talking to a male subject in the drug store parking lot. A composite drawing was made of this subject and the car he was standing by at the time he was observed. The parents made several television appearances asking the abductor to release the child, without results.

On March 22, 1977, at 11:15 pm, the body of TIMOTHY KING was found along side of Gill Road in the city of Livonia, Michigan. He was dressed in the same clothing he was wearing at the time he was last seen. Also found at the scene was the skate board he was playing with at the time he went to the drug store. The cause of death was smothering. His wrists had marks that might have been caused by binding. The anal orifice was distended and showed signs of abuse. No sperm or any other substance was found in the body openings.

PATTERNS:

In their analysis of the four Oakland County Murders, the investigating officers found numerous similarities in all four crimes that supported the theory that all four were inter-related:

- #1. All four victims were alone when abducted and were taken from business areas, in or near parking lots.
- #2. Two victims were abducted on a Sunday afternoon, and two on a Wednesday evening.
- #3. Victims were held captive for periods ranging from three to nineteen days.
- #4. Victims appeared to have been well fed while held captive, and were not subjected to weather

or other exposures.

- #5. The victims were well cared for during their period of captivity, including caring for their normal biological needs. All victims were clean.
- #6. All four victims were dressed in their own clothing, (possibly by someone else), just before or after death.
- #7. All four bodies were deposited along roadsides where they could be readily found.
- #8. There was no evidence of sexual molestation of either girl; both boys showed obvious anal dilation.
- #9. Apparently little if any force was used in the abduction: no commotions were reported in this regard.

After the last and final victim, (Timothy King) was discovered, a joint task force was formed to solve the above four murders. As of this day, the case still remains, **"UNSOLVED"**.

During the task force time period, thousands of names and tips came pouring in. There were approximately 250 investigators from many police municipalities from the area who participated in the investigation. Numerous pieces of evidence over the years have been collected and forwarded to the Michigan State Police Crime lab for analysis.

The task force investigated tens of thousands of tips and names which are currently held in 5 metal file cabinets each with 5 drawers. In January 2005, the entire case, (file cabinets) and approximately 15 additional boxes containing many binders and other documentation were transported to the Metro North Post to be housed in Oakland County permanently.

INFORMATION OBTAINED, MSP CRIME LAB:

During recent re-examinations of evidence associated with the Oakland County Child Killer Investigation by Lab Scientist, Lori Bruski of the MSP Northville Crime Lab, additional evidence in the form of Human Hair samples were discovered on fiber slides that were collected back in 1976-77. In particular, one carpet fiber slide taken from victim Mark Stebbins, (victim #1), and one fiber slide belonging to Timothy King, (victim #4) contained additional evidence.

During the examination of both fiber slides, Lori Bruski stated she observed human hair evidence on each of the slides belonging to Stebbins and King. Lori further advised that she was fairly certain that these newly discovered human hairs have never been mitochondrially examined and is in fact newly discovered evidence. Lori stated this was a significant discovery due to the minimal amount of evidence currently on record with the Child Killer Investigation, (Only Q-19 and Q-29 (hairs) to date). Lori stated she will send the newly discovered hair evidence into the FBI Crime Laboratory located in Quantico for evidence processing, and mitochondrial DNA testing. (See attached request for examinations, authored by Lori Bruski)

On January 8, 2010, the aforementioned fiber/hair evidence slides that were sent into Quantico regarding the Mark Stebbins and Timothy King, (human hairs), had been analyzed by the FBI's mitochondrial DNA unit and the results are listed below.

F.B.I. CRIME LAB RESULTS:

The human hair found on the fiber slide, (Q-43), belonging to Mark Stebbins, (Now identified as Q-43.1), and the human hair found on a fiber slide, Q-26), belonging to Timothy King, (Now identified as Q-26.1) had the same mitochondrial DNA sequence. Also, the two hairs that were found on the two independent victim slides had the same mitochondrial sequence regarding previously analyzed mitochondrial evidence on record with the FBI, (Known as evidence Q-19 Debris from the 1965 Pontiac). Mitochondrial evidence Q-19, (Analyzed June 25, 1999), had been collected from Arch Edward Sloan's, 1965 Pontiac, by Southfield Police Department on February 23, 1976. Thus the re-opening of this lead.

09001**INFORMATION INTO THE LEAD OF ARCH EDWARD SLOAN:**

Arch E. Sloan had been previously investigated by Southfield Police Department, beginning February 19, 1976, the day the first slain victim of the Child Killer investigation, (Mark Douglas Stebbins), body was discovered. During the investigation into Arch Edward Sloan, w/m 11-2-1941, numerous pieces of evidence had been collected from Sloan's 1965 Burgundy Pontiac and submitted for evidence processing by Southfield Police. As a result of the evidence evaluations from Sloan's 1965 Pontiac Debris, the FBI evidence Q-19, was developed.

Sloan was subsequently cleared of involvement into Stebbins homicide on March 2, 1976, when he took and passed a State Police Polygraph, however, the evidence collected during the investigation regarding Sloan's vehicle, still remains on record today .

PHONE CONVERSATION WITH DR. FISHER, F.B.I. CRIME LAB-QUANTICO:

On January 7, 2010, the undersigned received a telephone call from Dr. Constance Fisher of the FBI's, mitochondrial lab regarding the analysis of the 5 human hairs that were found on the two slides sent to her by Lori Bruski. Dr. fisher stated although she had to delay the analysis process due to more urgent matters, much of the pretesting had been completed and some interesting findings were emerging. Dr. Fisher stated when the new findings came in, she decided to complete the process and came up with the following conclusions:

1. Of the five hairs that were sent to Quantico by Lori Bruski of the MSP lab which were taken from fiber slides of the 2 victims back in the day, 4 were suitable for mtDNA testing, and came back with a mitochondrial DNA gene sequence. One hair was completely degraded and yielded no sequence.
2. On fiber slide, Q-43, belonging to Mark Stebbins, (the first victim of the OCKK), one human hair, (Q-43.1) taken from this slide was processed, and a mitochondrial DNA sequence was obtained and logged.
3. On fiber slide, Q-26 belonging to Timothy King, (the fourth victim of the OCKK), one human hair, (Q-26.1) taken from this slide was processed and a mitochondrial DNA sequence was obtained and logged.
4. Two additional hairs also from the King slide did yield a mitochondrial sequence, however the sequence matched no known victims, suspects or other evidence associated with the case. The fifth hair is the hair that could not be sequenced.
5. Dr. Fisher advised that the hair taken from the Mark Stebbins fiber slide, and the hair taken from the Timothy King fiber slide, had the same mitochondrial DNA sequence. (see report for exact details)
6. Not only did Dr. Fisher advise that the two hairs taken from the two separate slide have the same mitochondria DNA sequence, they also had the same mitochondrial DNA sequence as the previously analyzed mitochondrial DNA evidence currently on record, hair **(Q-19), Debris from the 1965 Pontiac.**

When questioned about the percentage's and the known data base's used for the analysis, Dr. Fisher stated the numbers associated with the above evidence, (hairs) from the Mark Stebbins slide and the Timothy King slide

having the same DNA sequence as hair Q-19, were much larger than the Q-34.1 hair discovered on Kristine Mihelich's shirt which came back to James Vincent Gunnels and Larry Allen Smith.

Again, Dr. Fisher advised that her analysis indicated the three hairs, from the Stebbins slide, King slide and Q-19, Pontiac Debris slide were of the same mitochondrial DNA sequence, which is very significant.

Dr. Fisher asked the undersigned if there may be the possibility of cross-contamination regarding the hair samples that were sent in for testing. Dr. Fisher was advised the possibility of cross contamination was virtually nil in this case due to the following reasons:

The mitochondrial evidence on record that all suspect evidence has been compared against over the years of the Oakland County Child Killer investigation dating back to 1999, when mitochondrial DNA evidence had been developed, concerned hair evidence (Q-19, from the Pontiac Debris), and (Q-29, debris, hair, from Timothy King). Other items of hair evidence associated with the investigation have been identified as coming from the victims. (IE) Two hairs from the mouth of Kristine Mihelich, (Her hair and a rodent hair).

In the recent evidence re-examination regarding the hairs from the Stebbins and King fiber slides along with the Q-19, hair having been linked mitochondrially, the undersigned began to research the Q-19 connection. Until this recent discovery, evidence (Q-19 hair) had never been linked to any involvement with the child killer investigation.

SLIDE CONTAINING DEBRIS FROM PONTIAC Q-19:

On 2-10-10, while still awaiting the final laboratory report from Dr. Fisher regarding the new discovery connecting the Mark Stebbins, Timothy King hairs and the Q-19 Pontiac Debris, the undersigned contacted Dr. Fisher to re-confirm/affirm the findings. Dr. Fisher advised that she cannot fax, E-mail or send the information concerning this new finding until her report is finalized and reviewed by her supervisors with the DNA II Control Unit.

Upon confirming this information without an actual hard copy of the FBI report, the officers began to investigate Q-19 Debris from the 1965 Pontiac. When Dr. Fisher was advised of the new direction this finding has now taken investigators, she admitted that she thought all along the Q-19 evidence, Debris from the Pontiac, was associated with the Timothy King investigation.

When the undersigned officer was advised by Dr. Fisher of the Q-19 hair evidence from the (1965 Pontiac Debris evidence) had been directly linked with the hair evidence obtained from fiber slides belonging to the Stebbins and King victims, the Southfield investigative report into the homicide of Mark Stebbins was reviewed.

NOTE: Southfield P.D. evidence taken early on during the Stebbins homicide investigation was found to be directly associated with the 1965 Pontiac Debris, and was assigned FBI lab designator # Q-19. (Hair removed from the 1965 Pontiac)

While researching the Q-19 hair evidence on record with the 1965 Pontiac Debris taken during the Stebbins investigation, it was learned that the vehicle belonged to the above mentioned suspect, ARCH EDWARD SLOAN. In Southfield Police Department report # 76-3079 dated 2-19-76, it had been reported that two vehicles had been confiscated for evidence examination into the murder of victim, Mark Douglas Stebbins on the date when Mark Stebbins body had been recovered on 2-19-76.

In the Southfield report authored by D/Lt. Patrick Sullivan, (76-3079), he reported that on 2-19-76, he responded to 15560 W. Ten Mile Rd. in regards to a body being found. Later identified as being Mark Douglas Stebbins. Also contained on the report is the narrative involving the discovery of Stebbins body, along with an extensive list of property items that were eventually collected and processed. Among the list of items confiscated were items of evidence collected from the body and crimes scene where Stebbins was discovered, but there were also items of evidence listed that were taken from, "SUSPECTS" 1965, Chevy, (No suspect name). Many of the items of evidence listed on this document are inter-twined from the crime scene, body of Mark Stebbins, along with numerous items of evidence taken from the 1965 Chevy. (See attached Southfield Police Department report pages 1-4. Also marked in upper right corner as 32 thru pages 35.)

On page 34, on 2-19-76, at approximately 4:45 PM, the suspects 1965 Chevy was processed at the Ferndale Police Department. In this document lists that the vehicle was fingerprinted, swabs were taken off of the seats, fur and Dirt samples collected, red carpet fibers for comparison to fibers taken from the victim, along with hair and swabs that were taken from an ice chest that was removed from the vehicle.

Contained on the same page (34), listed that officers Griffen and Det Bolen of Ferndale PD attended the autopsy of Mark Stebbins and that hair samples and fingerprints were collected from the victim. The victims clothing, hair samples and evidence from the suspect vehicle were turned over to the State Police Crime Lab in Warren, MI for comparison purposes.

On page 35, is the connection between the owner of the 1965 Chevrolet, reportedly belonging to John Thomas Crosbie, (See attached Search Warrant) on Crosbie's vehicle). Numerous items of evidence collected. This particular document was hand written by Sullivan.

FERNDALE P.D. SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT ON JOHN T. CROSBIE-surveillance:

On Wednesday, February 19, 1976 at 12:40 PM, Ferndale Police Department, patrolman R. Frank badge #5 was dispatched to the location of 333 Academy St. Ferndale, MI to conduct surveillance on the home belonging to John Thomas Crosbie, w/m DOB Ferndale report # (See Attached), read that officer Frank observed the suspect Crosbie driving a 1965 Blk Vy/Bronze Chevrolet bearing 76/MI plate #JTH-848 pull into the driveway of 333 Academy, Ferndale. The subject driver was observed to exit the vehicle and carried what appeared to be a beer can box into the home. A short time later, the same suspect was observed the same subject exit the house carrying a box from the house to the car. The subject got back into his car. He then exited his vehicle again and proceeded to the trunk of the car carrying a large blk or charcoal colored ice chest or cooler. Back up arrived and officers Wielgat, Frank and Lt. Sullivan made contact with the subject later identified as John Thomas Crosbie while he was still bending over into his trunk.

The subject Crosbie was advised to put the cooler back into his trunk and officer Frank drove said vehicle back to the Ferndale police station. The vehicle was place into evidence Tag#6433, and the cooler was tagged item #6434. Officer found what appeared to be strands of lt. brown or blonde hair caught on the rear hinge of the cooler.

John Thomas Crosbie came on the radar of the Ferndale police department approximately 1 hour after the discovery of Mark Douglas Stebbins body in the city of Southfield. As of this writing, there has been no official explanation or report found as to how, or why he was investigated so early on in the investigation.

ARCH EDWARD SLOAN'S VEHICLE:

In the same documents authored by Southfield Police department, on page 35, is listed a 1965, (later found to be a 1966), Pontiac, Black/Burgundy being 75/MI license plate #DPT-718 belonging to "SUSPECT" Sloan. Later identified as Arch Edward Sloan. Sloan's vehicle was searched on 2-23-76 at 12 noon at the Southfield police department. (See attached consent to search form signed by suspect, Arch Edward Sloan dated, February 23, 1976, at 10:53 AM. Also numerous items of evidence were confiscated from Sloan's vehicle, including fingerprints, dirt, fur, and hairs. Sloan had been tipped out two additional times. On July 13, 1977, Sloan was tipped out by informant, Auxiliary Police officer Fox of the Farmington Police Department. Officers investigating the tip lead were Doan and Piche', Southfield Police Department. (See Tip # 4770 TK) for details. In the closing of Tip #4770, it was cited as follows:

Included in the tip investigative report is Farmington Hills report # 77-1345, dated March 25, 1977' Lein information on Sloan and his registered vehicles, and C.C.H
Prior incident reports/arrest in Michigan. 74-2148-78 and 12-11345-78. C.S.C arrests involving boys.

The suspect Sloan was tipped out yet a second time on November 10, 1983, investigated by then D/Sgt. John Slenk of the Michigan State Police Second District Headquarters. In this tip investigation, it also mentions that **Southfield P.D. also had a file on Sloan.** This tip also listed that Sloan was on the Mark Stebbins case by Lab/sp Kelly from the Lansing Post and found to be truthful.

While looking into the life or Arch Edward Sloan, it was also reported that he had a juvenile record for various CSC cases and his earliest arrest as an adult dates back to 1959 out of the City of Detroit for a sex crime. In the DPD investigation, Sloan lured a young boy into his basement, forced oral sex, sodomized the youth and put a pencil flashlight up the boy's rectum.

Sloan also has an extensive record for sodomy with young boys out of the State or Pennsylvania.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING SLOAN AND CROSBIE:

As the undersigned officer retrieved documentations from the Southfield Police Department report, 76-3079, connections appeared to be somewhat significant involving Arch Edward Sloan and an individual by the name of John Thomas Crosbie, w/m. As of this writing, there has been no firm confirmation nor connection between Sloan and Crosbie, other than references that connect them in police reports supplied by the Southfield and Ferndale police departments.

John Thomas Crosbie was under investigation less than one hour after the body of Mark Stebbins had been discovered. Mark Stebbins was found deceased on Sunday, February 19, 1976, at 11:45 AM, and at 12:40 PM, this same date, officer R. Frank #3 of the Ferndale Police Department, was dispatched to sit surveillance at Ferndale, to observe the house for any incoming or outgoing traffic. This is the home of John Thomas Crosbie, w/m

Officer Frank observed the subject Crosbie driving a 1965 Chevrolet Blk vinyl/Bronze bearing 76/MI JTH-848 and pull into the residence driveway of 333 Academy St. Officer Frank radioed his observations to his dispatch center when he observed Crosbie carrying items to and from the home to the car. Lt. Sullivan, Patrolmen Wielgat and Frank made contact with Crosbie who was observed taking an ice chest from the trunk of the vehicle and place same on the ground. Crosbie was told to place the ice chest back into the trunk. Officers could visually see light brown/ blonde hairs on the hinge of the cooler, which were consistent with the hair type of victim Mark Stebbins. The vehicle was driven back to Ferndale Police Department by officer Frank and held as evidence pending a search warrant. (See attached Ferndale report) (See attached Ferndale Search Warrant)

FBI report results of examination reads as follows:

Mitochondria DNA (mtDNA) sequences were obtained from the Q-19 hair from the Pontiac Debris, the Q-29 hair from the debris from the body of Timothy King, the K-11 blood sample from Larry Allen Smith, the K-23 blood sample from Marion King, the identified mother of Timothy King, and the K-24 blood sample from Ruth Stebbins, the identified mother of Mark Stebbins. After being shown the attached tip information he supplied to Ferndale back in the day, (Larned recognized his his own hand writing about the tip), and said he did somewhat recall the name of Sloan, but really didn't remember anything else at all about him, or why he sent the information in. Paul said he most likely sent it to Ferndale after reading about the homicide of a young boy in the Ferndale area, and he was a parole officer for a convicted sex offender of young boys. Paul said he just couldn't remember anything independent about Arch Sloan. He said it was a long time ago, 30 plus years but he just didn't remember.

The undersigned then showed Mr. Larned the photograph that he attached to the tip he sent Ferndale. Larned studied the photograph, said it did look familiar, but still couldn't connect anything of an independent memory of him.

The interview ended when Mr. Larned advised that he will attempt to contact several old associates he used to work with when he was a parole officer and see if they may be able to recall any information about Sloan.

The undersigned and Detective Robertson made contact with the above sister of John Crosbie, (Donna Holland), at her place of employment, Chatham County Sheriffs Department, located in Chatham County, North Carolina. The interview took place in the investigative section of the Sheriff's office on June 9th at approximately 1:00 PM. Present for the interview was Donna Holland, Detective Robertson and the undersigned, Detective Gray.

SYNOPSIS OF INTERVIEW:

At the beginning of the interview, Donna was very curious as to why investigators from the Michigan State Police needed to speak with her. She was advised of the pending investigation into the Oakland County Child Killer investigation, to which she said she was very familiar with, because she lived in the area during that time period. After being advised of the investigation, the officers told her information that just recently came to light and the information may in fact concern her deceased brother, John Crosbie. Donna said she will try to assist in what every she could.

Prior to going into any great detail regarding the information that will be discussed, the undersigned asked Donna if she would be willing to provide the officers with a sample of her DNA, (Cheek Buccal Swab), for comparison purposes. Donna was advised the purpose of taking her DNA, to which she said John and her had the same biological mother, would be most likely for elimination purposes. The officers told Donna that we were looking at a separate suspect, but it was believed that this person, (Arch Sloan), may have been an

associate of her brother John. Donna stated that it would be fine with her for the officers to swab her cheek for her DNA.

NOTE: Detective Sgt. Robertson gloved up and proceeded to take two buccal swabs of Donna Holland's two cheeks for submission to the FBI crime laboratory for analysis. After taking the two samples, Detective Robertson packaged same and the interview continued.

Donna said that although those murders happened many years ago she did remember the case very well. She said she believed that one of the victims only lived several blocks away from their house on Academy Street. When advised of the name Mark Stebbins, Donna said yes that was his name.

Ms. Holland was advised the investigation after all these years is pointing in the direction of a man who is currently in prison and has been there for almost 30 years. She was again told that this person, Arch Sloan was a friend of her brother John. Donna said she wasn't familiar at all with the name of Arch Sloan, however she really didn't pay a great deal of attention, if any at all, regarding the people her brother John hung around with.

Donna went on to say that he brother John was mildly retarded due to an accident during child birth. She said that during John's birth, the umbilical cord was wrapped around John's neck that deprived him of oxygen, thus causing his diminished mental capabilities. Donna said John and her basically stayed to themselves and really didn't get along all that well while growing up. They went their separate ways while growing up in the same household. She said that John "NEVER" brought any of his friends over to their house for any reason.

Donna stated she remembered he mother telling her that John was investigated regarding the murder of Mark, but she wasn't told of any of the details. Donna didn't know about the search of Johns 1965 Chevrolet, the polygraph he was given or the previous arrest he had for sexual assaulting a young girl. She said she always liked John's car, but was never allowed to drive it.

Donna said her parents were very protective of John and that they watched over him very closely. She said he usually had a curfew which she thought was around 11 PM. He would always be home prior to his curfew. When shown various photographs of Arch Sloan, Donna said they didn't look familiar with her, except for the photo of Sloan when he had a beard. but to put a name with the face, she said she couldn't do.

Donna stated she thought that her brother John may have known the Stebbins mother, and that John used to always hang out at the American Legion Hall located in Ferndale on 9 Mile Rd. She said she thought that Mrs. Stebbins worked at the Hall. Donna then said she thought she remembered her mother tell her that John may have offered Mark a ride home, or something to that effect.

The officers advised Donna that there were a number of items of evidence taken from her brother John's car during the serving of the search warrant that are still on evidence with the State Police, a black ice chest, brick, rope and fibers, all to which Donna said she didn't know anything about.

Donna stated that their father took great care of John and would punish him by taking his car away from him for not obeying his rules, and when their father died, mom took over. After their mother died in 1998, John

remained in their home on Academy Street in Ferndale and her older sister who was even married in the 70's and had grown children, was the overseer of John and took care of him. She said her sister currently lives in the Brighton area and believes she is in her mid 60's maybe 70. John died in 2003 from hardening of the lungs disease.

Donna added that although she didn't know the name of Arch Sloan, this didn't mean that her brother didn't know or be a possible associate of his. She said it's possible that John may have known Sloan, but due to their limited family socialization with each other she wouldn't be able to say for sure. She said in 1976-77 she was in highschool and didn't know the comings and going's of John. Donna however did say that her now husband, Ron Holland and she were dating during this particular time period and he might have information that she was privy to, because Ron and John did talk to each other when he was at the house. Donna was then asked if Ron may be available for an interview with the officers prior to our flying out the next day, she said she could give him a call on her cell phone right now is it was alright with the officers. Donna was advised to please call her husband to see if he would be able to meet with us.

CELL PHONE CALL TO RON HOLLAND:

Donna contacted her husband Ron, on her cell phone during our interview and advised him that she was being interviewed regarding her late brother, John and the investigators were looking at John as possibly knowing a subject by the name of Arch Sloan. Donna then asked Ron if he recalled John ever talking about Arch Sloan. Both officers could hear Ron on the other end of Donna's call say, "yeah I remember the name, "Arch" and that John talked about him. Ron was heard saying the name of Arch Sloan and that John knew him. Donna asked Ron if he would be willing to meet with the officers this evening after getting off of work, and he said he'd have no problem in meeting with the investigators. Ron asked where the officers were staying the night and at which hotel. When she advised the the officers were staying at the Holiday Inn Express located in Apex, Ron said that he would stop by after getting off of work and would speak with the officers. A meeting time of 6:30 PM was set at the hotel in Apex.

Donna stated she will call the officers if she remembers anything further that may be of assistance and she would also send a photograph of her brother to the officers because the one we have on record is of very poor quality.

Ron basically reiterated the same information as his wife Donna did in regards to John being somewhat of a recluse and under close scrutiny by his father and mother. Ron, however did say that he did talk with John from time to time and does recall John telling him about a guy by the name of Arch. Ron then said the name of Arch Sloan. Ron said he wasn't sure about the last name being said in the same breath as Arch but he did recall the name of Arch and Sloan.

Ron said he thought he remembered John saying he met this Arch person when John used to work at the New Way bar located on the east side of Woodward, just north of the Studio North theatre. Ron said he thought it may have been in the early 1980's but wasn't sure of the exact time that he allegedly met this Arch person. In regards to ever meeting Arch, Ron said that John never brought anyone around the house and he has never laid eyes on him. When asked how he now remembers this person, Ron said the reason he remembers the name Arch, was because he's never heard of anyone before with the name of Arch. There's Archie, Archibald or nicknames, but he's never heard of the name Arch. He said he didn't know why, but he remember that particular name. He said he wasn't 100% positive with the full name, (Arch Sloan), but does remember the name of Sloan also.

When asked if John is a person who may be easily influenced, he said absolutely. John was a very trusting individual and if you ask him or tell him what to do, he'll do it. It was mostly from his mental handicap. Ron did add that he didn't think that John could possibly be involved in the child killer investigation, but you never know.

Elizabeth, (Betty), was interviewed at the Brighton Post of the Michigan State Police in one of their interview rooms. Present was the undersigned, Detective Robertson and Betty. The interview was digitally recorded.

Betty basically described her brother John Crosbie in the same manner as did Donna Holland when she was interviewed in North Carolina. Betty stated she was quite a bit older than John and Donna and she was born to the same mother, but a different father than John and Donna.

Betty stated she has since been in touch with her sister Donna, after she was interviewed in North Carolina by the undersigned officers. She stated that she's tried to recall the name of Arch Sloan, however she said she cannot recall the name, nor does she think she's ever heard of the name or person. Betty was questioned in great extent, trying to jog her memory, but to no avail. She said she has never heard the name of Arch Sloan, other than when she talked with Donna after our interview.

Betty said she was out of the house and married by the late 1960's and had children. She said she did keep in fairly close contact with her family at 333 Academy St. in Ferndale. She said she visited often, and had a close relationship with her brother John. Betty said that John was.....Retarded and said that was the term which was used back then, but mildly retarded. She said John was a very protected son of her mother and father and that his father watched over him tightly. In regards to the possibility of John being involved with the Child Killer investigation, Betty stated it was highly doubtful. She did say that John was a person who could be easily influenced or taken advantage of. She said she's never heard of John ever hurting anyone.

Again to the prospect of John being involved with our investigation, Betty said she really didn't think he could be involved.

Betty recalled many of the details of the Child Killer investigation, especially in regards to Mark Stebbins due to the close proximity the Mark lived very close to them. She said she thought it was only a street or two away from their street. Betty stated she did recall that John was investigated by the police, because Mark's mother Ruth Stebbins knew John and worked at the American Legion on 9 Mile in Ferndale. Betty said she didn't think Mark was ever at their house or in John's car because John "NEVER" had anyone to their house, and he was very protective of his car. She said John did drink beer very often, but was always home when his father told him to be.

Betty remembered the police searching John's car and even recalled the ice chest he kept in the trunk. She said he used it when he would go fishing. She was asked if John did any ice-fishing, she said she didn't think so. She said he had a red and a black ice cooler/chest.

Once again, Betty said she didn't know any of the people John hung around with back during that time period. At the end of the interview, the undersigned asked Betty if she should remember anything at all that may be of assistance to us with the investigation, or if she may be with-holding important information, would she please call the officers. Betty stated the information she relayed to the officers this date was true and the best of her memory. She did say if she should come across anything in John's personal belongings that she has stored at her house in Brighton, or if she remembers anything else, she will definitely call the officers.

A possible reason and or source of hairs Q-19 (Hair from Arch Sloans 1965 Pontiac), Q-26.1 (hair from the body of King) and Q-43.1 (hair from the body of Mark Stebbins), would be that of Arch's father which whom he resided with in 1976 and 1977, and had access to the 1965 Pontiac.

CONTACT DR. FISHER, FBI CRIME LAB, QUANTICO, VA:

On 7-29-10, the undersigned contacted Dr. Fisher via TX and asked her if the siblings will have the same mtDNA sequence if they all had the same mother and father. Dr. Fisher advised that they will all have the same mtDNA sequence if they have the same mother. In regards to the fathers mtDNA, Archibald Edward Sloan will have a completely different DNA sequence.

Dr. Fisher advised to make attempts to get a sample of Archibald's DNA either through him if he's still living, his mother, or any living siblings. On Monday, August 23, 2010, the undersigned received the FBI Crime Laboratory report concerning the evidence sent in on suspect Arch Edward Sloan and Donna Holland, (sister of suspect), John Thomas Crosbie as well as buccal swabs from Deborah Jarvis, (Mother of Kristine Mihelich), and Karol Self, (Mother of Jill Robinson).

RESULTS:

Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA)) sequences were obtained from the K-44 buccal sample from Arch Sloan, the K-45 Buccal sample from Deborah Jarvis, the mother of Kristine Mihelich, the K-46 buccal sample from Karol Self, the mother of Jill Robinson, and the K-47 buccal sample from Donna Lynn Holland, the sister of John Thomas Crosbie.

The known evidence on record, mtDNA sequences from Q-19, (hair from 1965 Pontiac), Q-26.1, (hair from Jockey Shorts Tim King), Q-27.1, (hair clothing at scene Tim King) Q-29, (hair from debris Tim King body), Q-33.1, (hair from autopsy Tim King, Q-34.1 and Q-34.2, (hair fragments from shirt of Kristine Mihelich), and Q-43.1, hair from clothing of Mark Stebbins, are different from the mtDNA sequences from K-44, (Sloan), K-46, (Karol Self), and K-47, (Donna Holland, sister of Crosbie). Therefore, Arch Sloan, Jill Robinson and John Crosbie can be excluded as the source of the Q-19, Q-26.1, Q-27.1, Q-29, Q-33.1, Q-34.1, Q-34.2 and Q-43.1 hairs. Kristine Mihelich can also be excluded as the source of these hairs with the exception of Q-34.1

The mtDNA sequences from Q-34.1, (hair fragment taken from Kristines Mihelich's shirt) and K-45, (buccal swab from Deborah Jarvis, mother of Kristine Mihelich), ar the same over the common range of nucleotide positions, 16288-16355. Therefore, Kristine Mihelich cannot be excluded as the source of the Q-34.1 hair.

Note: Of the newly discovered two hair fragments that were taken off the green shirt belonging to Kristine Mihelich by Dr. Howenstine in 2007, one hair, Q-34.1 had a similar mtDNA sequence to suspects, Larry Allen Smith and Vince Gunnels. The second hair, Q-34.2, is now believed to be a hair from Kristine.
